I've been told that a Disciplinary Report known as a DR. Cost some where in the range of \$800.00 to \$1500.00 From the time it's written, processed, investigated, had the hearing and then appealed. Whether the low end of 800 or the high end of 1500 is true, I don't know, either way you get staff in here writing bogus ass retaliatory DR's just to make an inmate's life harder, and place the inmate on Disciplinary Confinement known as DC. These personalized Audio and video devices would not

only cut down on this, stopping staff who write frivolous DRS out of retaliation, but it would cut down on appealing DRS through the grievance system, as well as through the court system. It would make staff comply to the rules of professional conduct under 33-205:002 Fla. Admin. Codes making them be truthful, and holding them to a higher standard of honor and integrity. Which is something that's clearly been missing from the FDOC, for "along time."

The time for change is now. We have the technology to improve the prison systems, giving legislature branches a bird's eye view of what really takes place in these prisons, the inmate and staff relationships can be captured on audio and video. The legislature needs to seriously look into these personalized audio and video devices as a means to save money in the long run, and in hence security by leaps and bounds.
