When an individual comes to a saving knowledge of the LORD

Jesus Christ we refer to that one as being "In Christ". This

refers to the believers position and is expanded upon in numerous

Theological terms. In the following pages we will be taking

a look at what it means to be "Risen With Christ".

I find the imagery in baptism to be especially helpful in visualizing the meaning of this term. Baptism is the outward manifestation, or demonstration, of the inward reality a person experiences upon placing their trust and faith in christ.

Before one can be "Risen With Christ" it is first necessary to die with Him, to lay aside the old self. We find this principle at work most clearly in Galatians were Pual Declares the following.

"I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life that I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself up for me" (Gal. 2:20)

So then, having reckoned oneself dead to this world and the sin therein, we as believers, have been "Raised with Him" are are thereby positionaly "In Christ", meaning in His resurrection to new life.
