post reaches the eyes of anyone who has any say so in this effort your support would be appreciated.

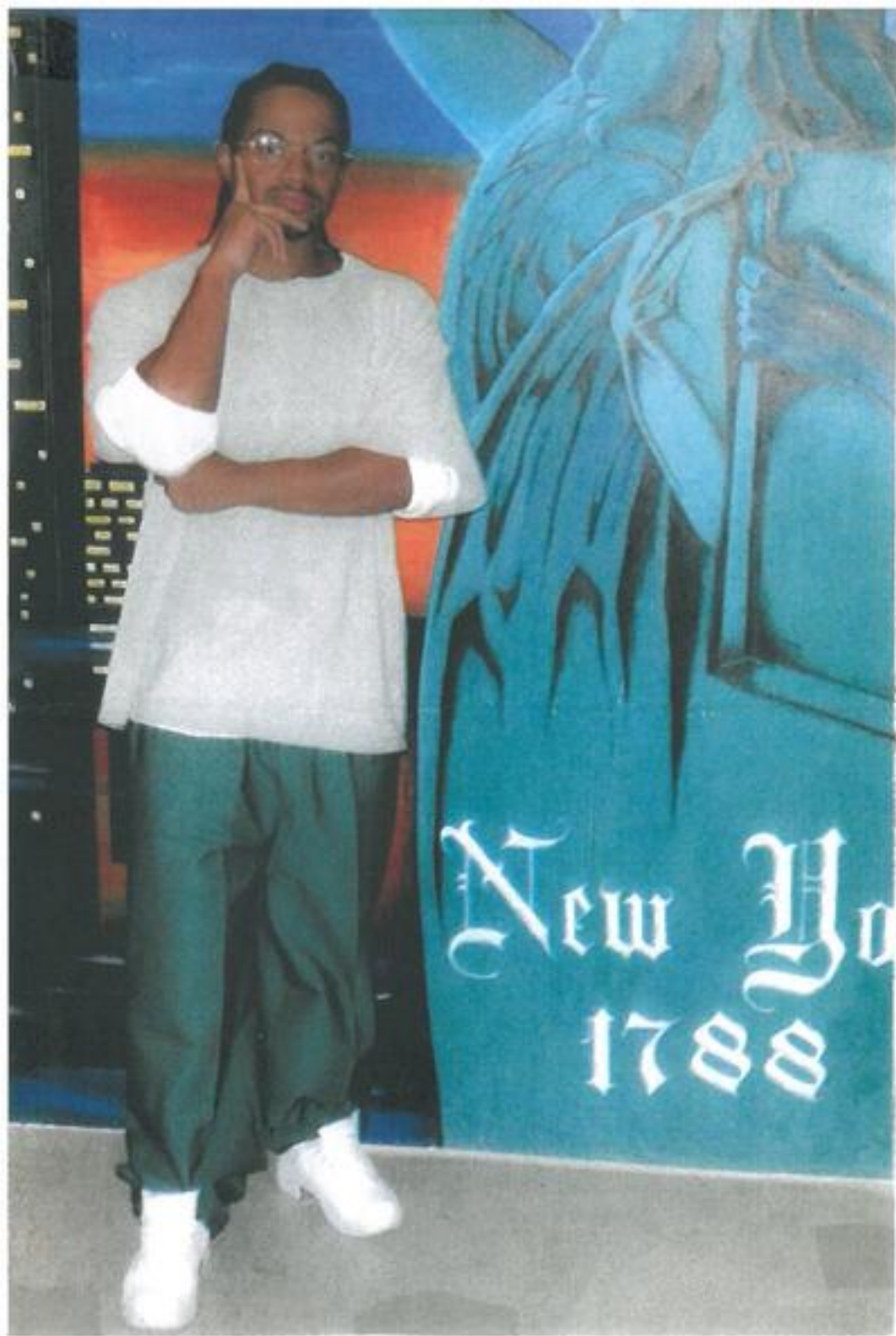
