WHEN I BEGAN THIS JOURNEY
THROUGH "THE BELLY OF THE BEAST" - THE
FL. DEPT. OF CORRECTIONS - I CHOSE NOT
TO FOCUS ON THE PERSPECTIVE INVOKED
BY DANTE'S SIGN, RATHER I WOULD TRY
TO VIEW THIS EXPERIENCE THROUGH THE
LENS OF GOD'S WORD. "LIFT YOUR

they are white already to harvest." By doing so, RATHER than developing the "hardened heart" Paul is far too prevalent among inmates - I was able to cultivate a heart of compassion. Paul's "PERSPECTIVE" has made all the difference.

As I made my way around the compound, I saw the eyes of inmates for whom "Hope" was a candle that blew out long ago. As I continued to find strength and guidance within the word of God, I began looking for ways that I could share what I had found... for those who thirst, a fountain of living water.

However, what I soon learned was that if I approached an inmate in the "Roc Yard": Bible in hand, saying "Brother, let me tell you about Jesus." - I would have to find a way through the layers of pain and rejection, in order to reach a heart that resembled a clenched fist. - If I was to become a "fisher of men", it would not be by casually dropping a line off the side of a pick... This would be Deep Sea Fishing.

My "Spoken Word Ministry" was born here at Century C. E. when I began trying to express a Biblical Principle, or Doctrine, through a poem. For example, the Poem "Christening" contains over 20 References to Scripture within its 11 Stanzas. In the Poem "The Promise"; I tried to deliver a complete "Sermon" on "SAVATION BY GRACE" including in it the call! Instead of trying to "Preach" to my Brothers in Blue - I could simply say "Hey, check out this Poem." & I could then try to "PLANT THE SEED"; pray the Holy Spirit might water, and then let God give the INCREASE. (REF. 1 COR 3:6)

The word "Penitentary" is based, of course, upon the word Penitent. (WEBSTER: feeling sorrow for sins or offenses - REPENTANT.) However there is a tremendous difference between worldly sorrow, (regret over getting caught) and Godly sorrow (which worths Repentance.) It's that worldly sorrow which gives root to that "BITTERNESS" by which many are defeated - It's that Bitterness that chokes the Spirit and takes hope from the hearts of men.
