


Part 1: NASA PROBES BIG HOLE IN SEARCH OF MOISTURE



Curiosity, NASA's six-wheeled, "sedan-size" Mars rover now traverses the Red Planet's gaping 96-mile Gale Crater.

Kudos for NASA and their success.

I wondered at first why Curiosity was sent to Gale Crater, but now I know about the evidence suggesting water was once there (e.g., channels carved out by water long gone, or, at least, no longer on the surface.). The rover is equipped with spectrometers that can finally tell us more of Mars's chemical composition.
