The Hand of Hope - Joyce Meyer Ministries donated to each inmate an uplifting book, a bottle of shampoo, a bar of soap, and a letter reminding us that we have not been forgotten, and the ministry is praying for us. Awesome! The book I received was titled Reduce Me to Love. I will gobble it up. I will thank God. I will pray that whoever in the Department of Corrections saw the goodness in allowing the donation, that he or she will be abundantly blessed.

Listening to the many comments by Christians and non-Christians, all had the same sentiment - "Wow! Someone cares."

That someone is God and I will always try to do His will even if my body is covered in boot marks.
