

"In Kwame K. Kwame's: The table has turned. A street guide to guerilla warfare, former special agent Dr. Tyrone Powers explains. During the time I was in the FBI working intelligent issues, a report came across my desk. And it was in regards to going out and talking to African Americans, interviewing them about intelligent issues, or crimes, and things of that sort and a document came out of the Behaviour Science unit at Quantico, Virginia and it said that African Americans or Blacks in America, were an emotional people but not an intelligent people. And theres nothing wrong being emotional. We should be emotional. But what they were saying is this. That an issue will come up. They may get angry about it, they may protest, they might hold vigils, they may hold marches, but then they will go away without their being any logical conclusion to it. But based on this analysis, you have to understand that this report that comes out goes to almost all intelligent agencies to the police intelligent agencies.
