If you'll provide an address—write it to me in a letter, or to Mamaw; don't go posting it on the net—I will arrange for the kids to get magazine subscriptions (titles of your approval, obviously). I'll continually renew them as long as they're receiving them/and want them. I'm thinking, "Poets & Writers" for Ellie; maybe "Super Street" or "Modified" for Connor; and possibly "Discover" or "Artists Magazine" for Michaila; and one to you of your choice. Go to:
