

"OPEN SEASON" DECLARED ON AMERIKA'S BLACK COMMUNITIES:

FROM GEORGE ZIMMERMAN TO
MICHAEL DUNN AND BEYOND

Michael Dunn's public execution, in Jacksonville, Florida, of one of our young African children, once again brings home the harsh reality that AMERIKA'S Black working class communities are under a vicious attack from all fronts. E.g. RACIST, ARMED vigilantes, the police, and the court and prison systems. A particular character of this attack is its focus on young African males whom the majority of people in today's society view as being some sort of menace to society.

The refusal by the jury in State of Florida vs. Michael Dunn, to return a guilty verdict on the most serious charge of murder, is a resounding testament of the "so-called" advances that have been made by the Black community since the height of the civil rights movement.

in the 1960's. The jury's refusal also leaves no room for doubt in the debate, that Black life in America has no respect or recognized value outside of its exploitation under the capitalist system. Historically, this has been the daily reality of Black life since the arrival of the first African slaves in Jamestown, Virginia, nearly 500 years ago.

The cold-blooded executions by George Zimmerman and Michael Dunn, and countless others, are nothing short of terrorism that has its origins in the birth and rise of the Ku Klux Klan. These terrorist activities have been made easier by a government, media, and complicit politicians who have collectively helped to criminalize and undermine the entire Black community by depicting its inhabitants in the most slanderous, vile and dehumanizing manner. In fact, you seldom to never hear of (or see) anyone in a position of authority doing the right thing, without sensing a potential of that Black community's demand for justice taking on the character of the Black Revolution of the sixties.

Enough Is Enough!! The historical devaluation of Black life, coupled with the criminalization and dehumanization of America's Black communities, have created such a volatile situation; until a walk to your corner store for a soda pop and candy, or playing "your music" inside "your vehicle" could result in your being executed. This isn't a situation isolated to Florida, it is nationwide.

Our youth are our greatest natural resources, and we must acknowledge this in a serious way, and begin to organize to protect our youth and communities against this obvious, yet undeclared war of terror being waged. Anything less is unacceptable. Let today mark the start of a demand for justice and the self-defense of the Black community that once again can be witnessed in action and heard around the world as in the 60's.
