Yes! I am considered a mentally ill inmate. I have what is called a Bipolar disorder. I was diagnosed when I was a small boy. It is said that it is inherited, but I don't know of anyone outside of me infected. Growing up was really a challenge - I couldn't remember simple things like a person's name or math problems. I was also in E.H. Classes. Even in special classes my learning ability was hampered and it didn't help when other students called me names like retard or a weirdo. Being Bipolar is just now being understood - how to correct it is another thing. Being around inmates that are not Bipolar is unhealthy, because they don't understand some of my behavior is contributed to a mental disorder - so they act violent toward us. And we the victims are placed in ~~Ad-seg~~ Ad-seg - A segregation unit, which is where I've been for the last "2" years. But I NOT complaining because for now I'm out of harms way.
