Sgt Bergdahl to return to active military duty - reports

Sgt Bowe Bergdahl is set to return to active military duty as early as Monday, US media report.

The soldier has finished therapy at a Texas military base following five years as a captive of Taliban forces in Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Sgt Bergdahl was released in May during a swap for five Taliban commanders, a move some US politicians decried.

The Army is investigating the circumstances of his capture, including whether he intended to desert.

US defence officials said Sgt Bergdahl's return to active duty was "party of his reintegration into Army life".

Two soldiers will reportedly be assigned to assist Sgt Bergdahl, and he will live in military barracks.

The New York Times, which along with CNN reported Sgt Bergdahl's return to active duty, said he would take a job at an Army headquarters at Fort Sam Houston in Texas, where he has been staying since his return to the US.

The US Army declined to comment on the reports.

Sgt Bergdahl has yet to speak publicly regarding his ordeal since his release on 31 May.

The move to release five Taliban leaders from Guantanamo Bay after Sgt Bergdahl was transferred to US special forces sparked a heated political row in the US.

The US opened an investigation into his disappearance in 2009 but said investigators would not interview Sgt Bergdahl until he finished the reintegration process.

The US military has concluded he walked away from his base without authorisation before his capture but has stopped short of accusing him of desertion.

Artist creates 'empowering' wearable sculptures

Linda Stein wants people to armor themselves in her art.

She creates full-length wearable sculptures embedded with all manner of found objects, including driftwood, engraving plates, steel wire, zippers, pebbles and comic book imagery of superheroes.

Her idea grew out of her sense of vulnerability after the Sept. 11 attacks, with the aim of giving wearers a sense of empowerment and protection. Her targets are any form of institutionalized oppression, such as sexism, racism and homophobia.

She also designs "bullyproof vests," made from a patchwork of fabrics featuring such female symbols as the Japanese anime character Princess Mononoke and the comic book hero Wonder Woman, along with words "I will ... not let cultural impediments and sexual stereotypes hold me down."

At a recent "body swapping" at her Tribeca studio, she invited a group of professional women to try on what she calls sculptural avatars, which can each weigh from seven to 20 pounds. Stein asked the wearers to imagine they are trying on another skin "to get in touch with how their bodies feel."

"It's like putting on a whole new persona," said Rinku Sen, who struck a "Rocky" pose in front of a mirror in a "Wonder Woman" torso made of acrylicized paper.

Another participant, Dana Sparling, donned a heavier metal creation she said felt like a "shield between me and the world."

Stein explained that she features Wonder Woman prominently in the works because "she never killed."

"She protected the weak and downtrodden wearing her bracelets and her black lasso. It's very hard to find a female superhero that's not violent and isn't a total sex object," Stein said.

The representation of gender and sexual identity is a longstanding tradition in activist art that dates back to the feminist movement, said Muhlenberg College art history professor Margo Hobbs. She said Stein's work is particularly powerful because "it works on the viewer's body to bring about a really visceral rather than an intellectual experience."

Reminiscent of classical torsos, a group of her sculptures is making the rounds at 24 universities, galleries and museums across the country in what is a seven-year traveling exhibition, "The Fluidity of Gender," that runs through 2017. The exhibition is accompanied by a lecture and "body-swapping" performance in which participants explore gender roles and stereotypes.

Most Republicans approve of Supreme Court, poll finds

More than half of Republicans favor the country's highest court, according to a new survey conducted in the days following some controversial landmark decisions in June.

The GOP's approval for the U.S. Supreme Court reached 51% in a new Gallup poll, an increase from 30% last year. Democrats' favorable opinion of the institution, however, fell from 58% in September to 44% this month.

The overall American sentiment toward the Supreme Court was similar to last year's ratings, with 47% approving and 46% disapproving of the judicial establishment.

One of the Supreme Court's most recent polarizing rulings, *Burwell v. Hobby Lobby*, gave for-profit businesses religious exemptions to insurance coverage for contraception under the Affordable Care Act. Five judges, all Catholic men, cemented the 5-4 decision.

The poll was conducted among 1,013 adults between July 7 and 10.

A separate Gallup poll conducted in June found that Americans' confidence in the Supreme Court fell to record lows this year, as the public's confidence in all three branches of government remains weak.

The highest point of approval for the Supreme Court came in 2009, with 61% favorability among Americans.

Scores of Pennsylvania homes evacuated over mystery gas

(CNN) -- A strong odor from an unidentified gas led firefighters to evacuate 150 homes in a Philadelphia-area community, a fire department said.

Firefighters began evacuating homes from part of Skippack Township after a resident complained of an odor early Sunday evening, the township's fire department said.

With the help of meters, firefighters learned a gaseous volatile organic compound was coming from the basement sump pumps in several homes, the department said.

They didn't immediately know what the gas was.

Volatile organic compounds cover a wide range of gases that can come from thousands of products, such as paints and lacquers, paint strippers, cleaning supplies, pesticides and permanent markers, according to the Environmental Protection Agency.

Many residents waited outside their homes as firefighters checked the buildings Sunday night, according to CNN affiliate WPVI, but the evacuations still were in effect Monday morning.

The Red Cross opened a shelter at an elementary school for evacuated residents who needed a place to stay, the fire department said.

Skippack Township is about 25 miles northwest of Philadelphia.

US Geological Survey says 7 small earthquakes strike Oklahoma over weekend

GUTHRIE, Okla. -- The U.S. Geological Survey has recorded seven small earthquakes shaking central Oklahoma in a span of about 14 hours.

The temblors are part of an increase in earthquakes across Oklahoma, Texas and Kansas that some scientists say could be connected to the oil and gas drilling method
