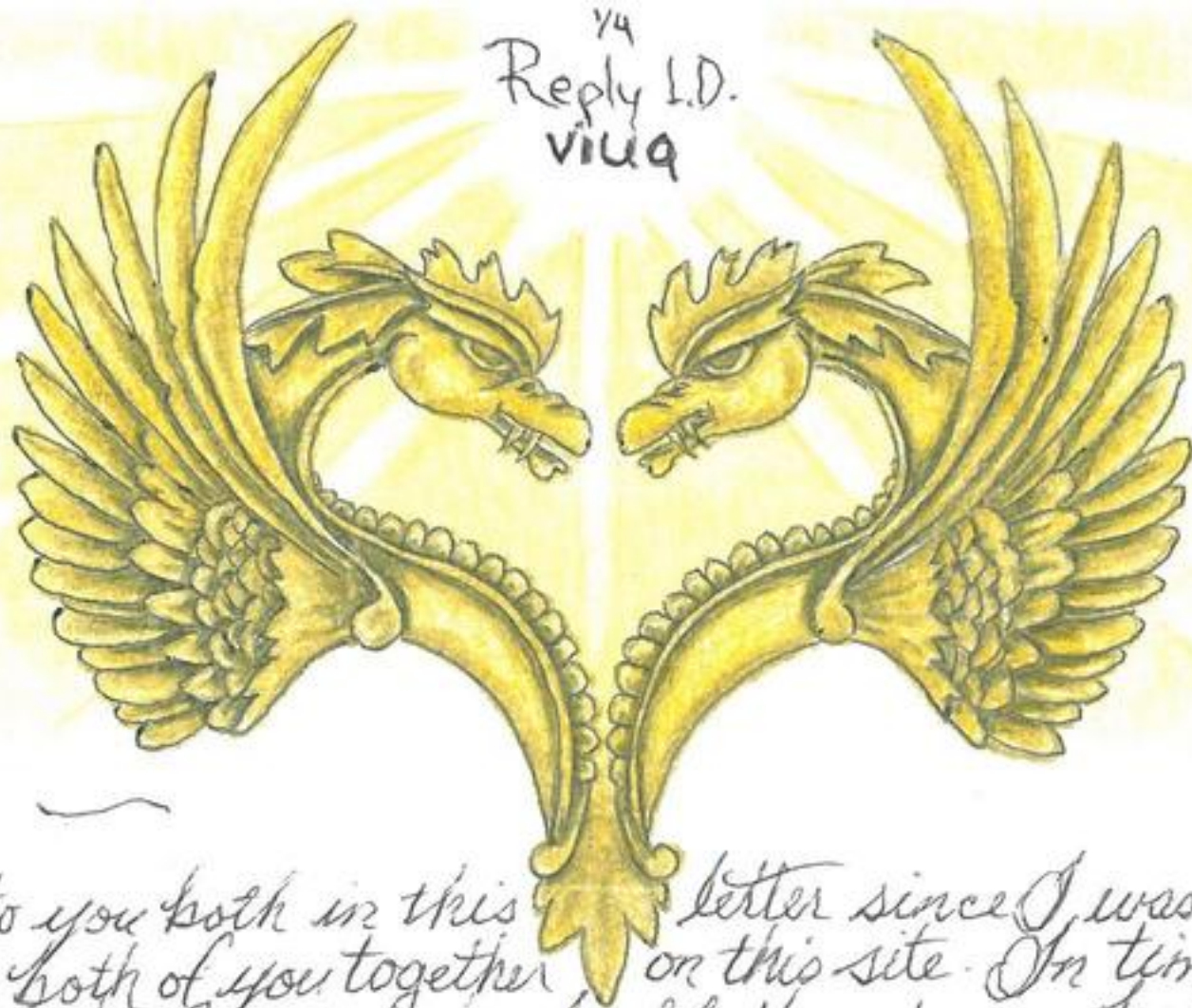

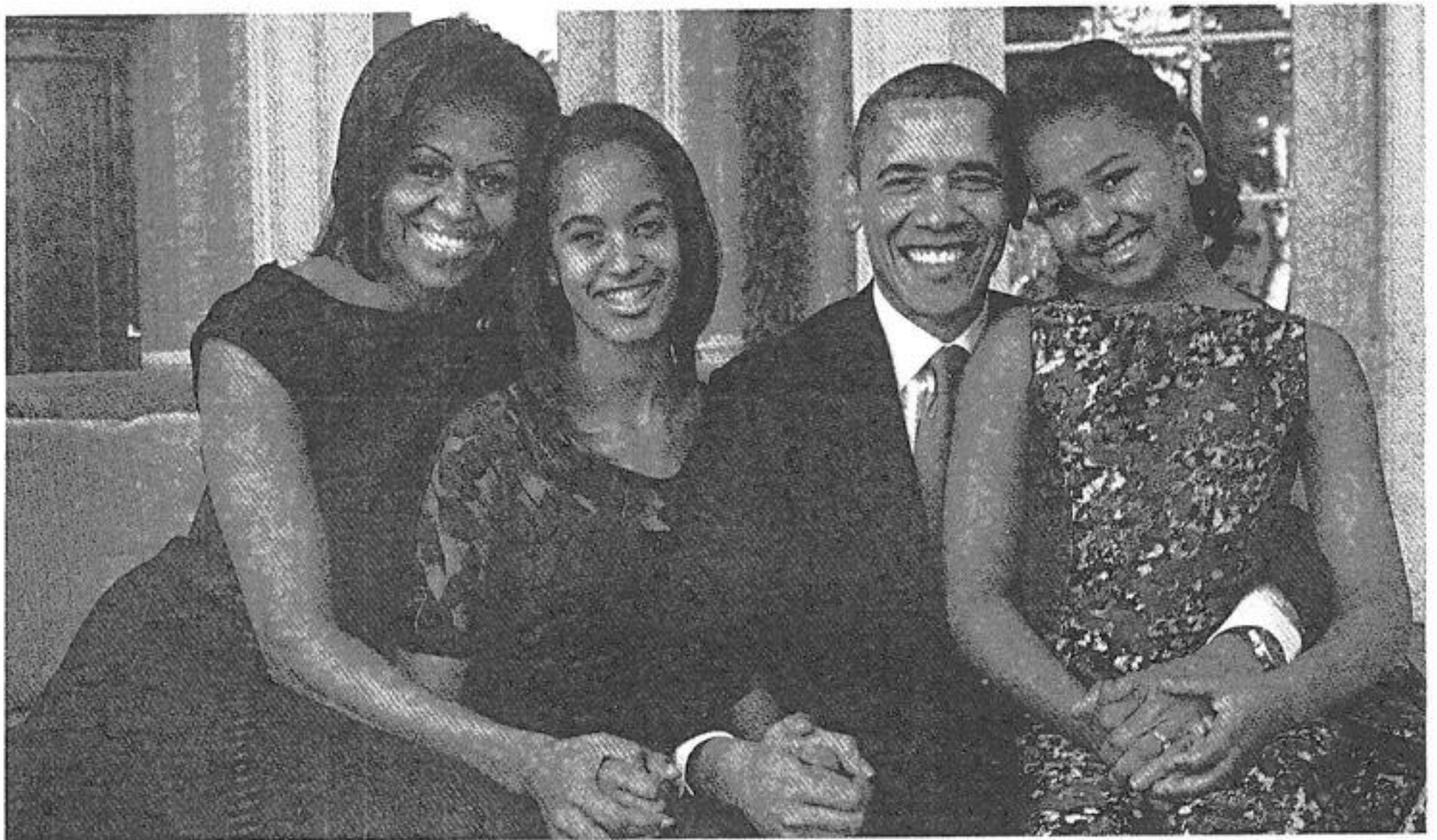

# Freemen

## Drives 900 miles to show support

FBI agents locked in a standoff with anti-government Freemen expected throngs of protesters on Friday, but only faced a peaceful demonstration by a lone Marysville man, who crusaded 900 miles to Montana on his motorcycle.

"The FBI and the ATF shouldn't be terrorizing citizens — the folks at the compound, the folks at Ruby Ridge, the folks at Waco and the folks at Oklahoma City," said Bill Goehler, a 33-year-old Marysville resident who displayed an American flag upside down in a traditional signal of distress.

Aside from Goehler's lone voice, the anniversaries of the Oklahoma City bombing and the Waco disaster passed quietly in the small town of Jordan near where the FBI has been waiting for 26 days for the Freemen to give up.

There was concern among townsfolk that outside supporters of the Freemen would show up Friday. Sheriff Charles Phipps said. Law officers from at least four counties bolstered the FBI force outside the 960-acre compound.

But, aside from the beefed-up law enforcement presence, it seemed to be business as usual in the town, about 30 miles from where about 18 Freemen were holed up.

Extra patrol cars also appeared around the schools in the town of 444. Some residents said the Freemen last summer had threatened to blow up a school where some local officials they regard as enemies send their children.

The only overt sign of protest came from Goehler, who stationed himself on his motorcycle about a half-mile from an FBI checkpoint near the compound.

"He's a man that stands alone," said Goehler's wife, Debbie, who stayed in Marysville and watched their six children. "He stands for truth and justice."

"He takes a lot of this stuff to heart, real personal," Debbie Goehler said Saturday. "He was bothered by it and nobody wants

# backer charged

## Custody dispute ends up in court

Freemen sympathizer William Goehler planned to return again to Montana last week, but this time with his two children in tow.

Now, the 33-year-old Olivehurst man faces a Dec. 13 court date on child concealment charges.

Investigators allege he took the two children from their mother, Debra Goehler against her wishes and threatened to take them to Montana.

Goehler was arrested Nov. 29 in Marysville on the charges when Yuba County investigators discovered he reportedly booked a Nov. 30 flight from Sacramento to Montana for himself and the children, according to court documents.

But numerous questions remain, including Goehler's custody rights and whether Goehler's wife will pursue charges, said Yuba County District Attorney Chuck O'Rourke.

Prosecutors hope to determine where the case is headed at the Dec. 13 hearing, O'Rourke said.

"The whole thing seems foggy," O'Rourke said of the case.

The two children are safe, but O'Rourke did not comment on where they were staying.

Goehler first gained attention locally when he climbed aboard his motorcycle last spring and rode to Montana to show solidarity with the militant Montana group.

The Freemen were involved in a three-month standoff at their Jordan, Mont., compound with the FBI before surrendering peacefully in June.

Goehler ran into trouble with Montana authorities when he flew an inverted American flag as a sign of protest against the government during the standoff.

Goehler was arrested for trespassing days after the April incident when he again flew the inverted flag in Miles City, Mont., some 90 miles from the Freemen's Jordan compound.

Goehler is free on his own recognizance, pending the Yuba County Municipal Court



# **FREEMEN: Marysville man lends support**

Debbie said her husband left for the Freeman's compound two weeks ago after watching the standoff on the news.

"The media isn't all truthful," Debbie Goehler said. "The media made people believe there was a bunch of wackos at Waco. We didn't know who those people were. He's there to see for himself who these people are."

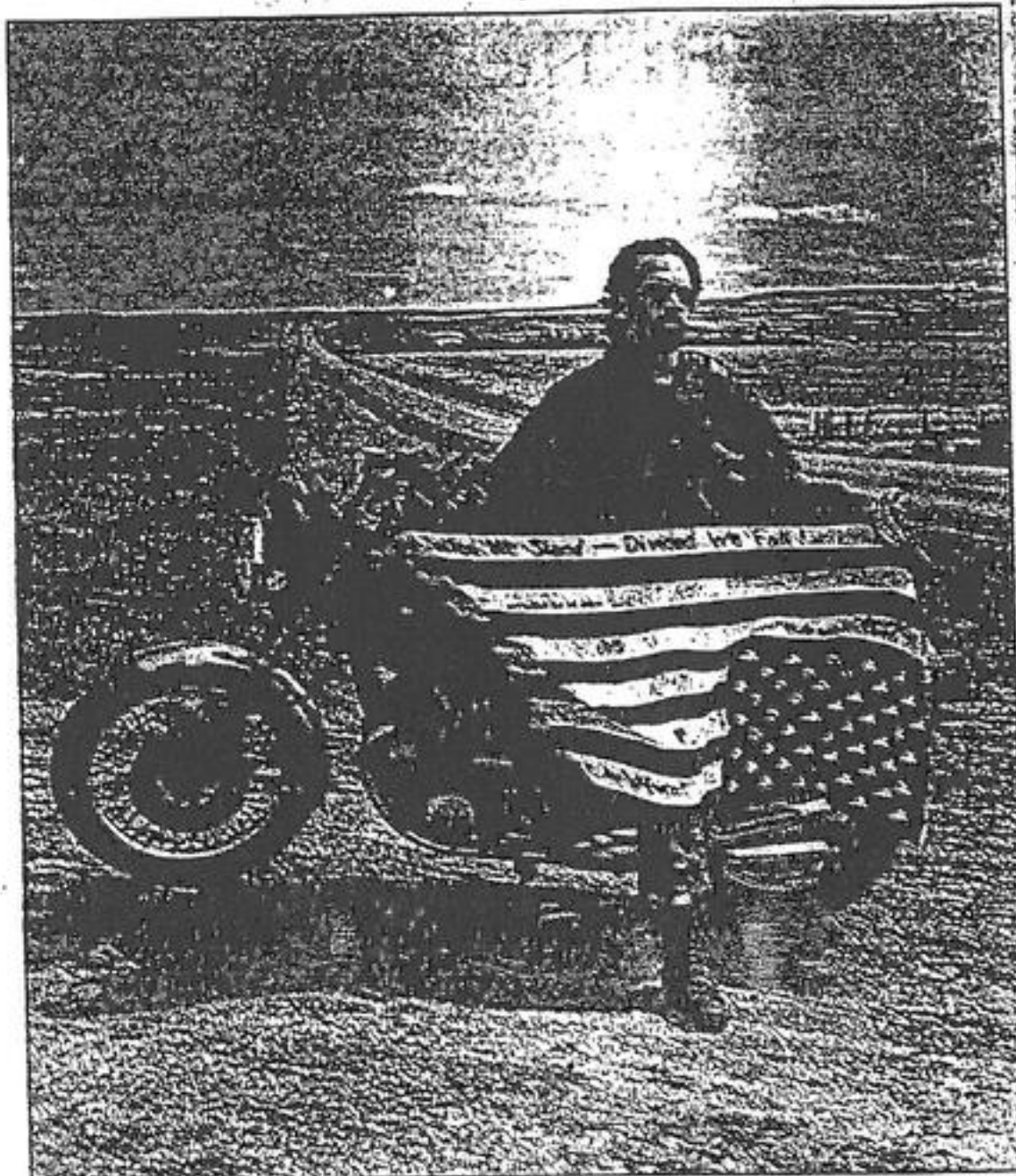
On April 19, 1993, 81 members of the Branch Davidian cult died in the fiery ruins of their compound near Waco, Texas, after federal agents moved to end a 51-day siege. On the same date last year, 168 people died in the bombing of the Oklahoma City federal building.

Goehler's political activism is nothing new. Last October, he walked in the Million Man March in Washington D.C. carrying the same inverted flag with the same message, "United We Stand — Divided We Fall," printed on the last white stripe of the upside down banner.

Goehler wrote a article about his experience at the march that appeared on the front page of the October 26, 1995, issue of the Olivehurst Gospel Assembly's publication, "OF the People, BY the People & FOR the People."

"Divide and conquer is a military and government strategy as old as the hills," Goehler wrote in his first-person account. "... these events when considered collectively; the media promoting suspicion of the whites and militias, while in the same time period promoting/acknowledging a Million Man March in Washington, are worth thinking about."

Debbie Goehler said her husband is not a member or affiliated with the OGA, which last April printed a story in its newsletter that blamed the Oklahoma City bombing on a cabal of federal government agencies includ-

ing the CIA.

"He's causing some trouble," said Bill's brother-in-law, Donald Skiver, who is visiting the Goehler's Marysville home. "He's really into it. Boy, there's no stopping him."

"He's got this big speech he's going to give up there," Skiver said. "I just got off the phone with him. He doesn't sound too happy (about the situation there)."

The Freeman's compound has been surrounded by the FBI since March 25, when agents ar-

rested two leaders of the group. Since then three other Freeman have surrendered.

About 10 others in the compound are wanted on state and federal charges ranging from writing bad checks and impersonating public officials to threatening to kidnap and murder a federal judge.

"He'll be there until its over," Goehler's wife said. "When it's all over, he'll come home. We miss him on these ventures."
