Torture and physiological punishment are human rights violation, unbearable cold cell doors, suffocating chains waiting for my death.




#### Lock Up, U.S.A.

merica may be the land of freedom, but we also lock up more of our citizens than any other nation. That was not always the case. During the Great Depression and the four decades that followed, the incoreerstion rate hovered around 100 prisoners. per 100,000 U.S. residents, dipping a hit during wars, when young men were drafted. Since 1985, hospever, the incurcerution rate has risen five-fold, and the number of inmates has tripled. The increase is due primarily to tougher mandatory sentencing laws at both the federal and state levels and a quantum leap in the number of jailed drug offenders, who now account for onequarter of the total prison population. Between 1974 and 2000, the number of state prisons rose from 592 to 1,923.
