

U.S. Supreme Court blocks Wis. Voter ID law

The United States Supreme Court has barred Wisconsin from enforcing a voter ID law.

The decision was handed down Thursday [October 9, 2014] night, banning the state from requiring voters to show photo identification before voting.

According to the Scotus blog, the court majority's order gave no reason for the decision. However, the news comes very close to the upcoming November election, which the blog states may have been a key factor.

three justices dissented from the decision: Justice Samuel A. Alito; Justice Antonin Scalia and Justice Clarence Thomas.

This summer the Wisconsin Supreme court voted to uphold the state's VOTERS ID LAW.

Later the U.S. Supreme court voted to ALLOW Texas similar ID LAW to be ENFORCED.

Nonetheless, the whole seventh Circuit Court of Appeals, located in Chicago, met to vote on whether to Reconsider the three Judges Panel previously upholding Wisconsin state ID LAW as constitutional.
