Dear senator EVER,

I've been watching the senate and House hearings on prison abuse. I've been sending out the enclosed letter trying to bring about change. SB 7020 is a beautiful bill, but, there's no way to identify and weed out those who are breaking the rules. Which is why we need a Bill that requires staff to take annual polygraph test to ensure they are abiding by Rules of Conduct 33-208.002 and its governing laws. We need a Bill For Body Cameras and better training.

In 2012 May, I was assaulted by COs twice. Once the Lt. led the assault. This happened because I was writing about then warden Barry V. Reddish and the abuse that was taking place in here. So he was having his officers destroy my property, place me in strip cells, write fraudulent DRS to keep me in lock up and for 3 months they threw away my mail. They went beyond anything I imagined. I under estimate their unprofessionalism. 33-208.002 beautiful rules of conduct, just no way to enforce them.

When the May 2012 assaults were investigated the inspector was Hall, who a year earlier was the property room Sgt. here in P-Dorm. He swept it under the rug. The men who assaulted me was his friends. We need that IGR office 944.31 to be come an independent agency that is not

associated with the FDOC. 944.31 beautiful law. The I.G. is suppose to be our watch dog, but that dog is asleep at the foot of the Administrators

Look at the millions of dollars that Fla tax payers are wasting on the ACA (American Correctional Association) They are suppose to be our watch dog. to make sure Constitutional standards are upheld. But all they really care about is their ACA accreditation Fees that they get from the state every year. That money would be better used giving staff polygraph test and putting Body Cameras on these Officers.

I'm praying that you will look into this, I don't care about my privacy. I'd rather be protected to ensure what happened in 2012, doesn't happen again.
