"The elderly like it, because they don't have to get out of their cars; people who are single don't like to go into a restaurant by themselves," Hanneman said.

Dick Heiser, 75, of Wisconsin Rapids, remembers several drive-ins with car hop service, including Sowatzke's near Witter Field.

"That was a big one," he said. "It's just a fun way to have a meal."

Heiser would like to see that restaurant option return.

"That and drive-in theaters," he said.

And while businesses offer a variety of food, the traditional, frosty-mug root beer floats are a draw — Lake Dexter uses Cedar Crest ice cream and 1919 root beer; Kemps ice cream and Point Root Beer make up the frothy treat at Kathy's.

"The malts and floats just explode in the summer time," Hanneman said.

When customers are done with their meals, they still go old school to let their car hops know they are finished and ready for tray pick-up — by tooting the horn, flashing their lights or just waving.

"It's a big deal in Pittsville," Wolfe said. "A lot of people have been coming here their whole life."

Pope Francis to promote climate action as moral imperative

As the world celebrates Earth Day on Wednesday, Pope Francis is planning to use one of the highest forms of papal expression — an encyclical — to promote climate action to save the planet as a moral and religious imperative.

In recent weeks, Vatican officials have outlined what the document will say and are choreographing its release — perhaps as early as June — for maximum global impact beyond the Roman Catholic Church's 1.2 billion members.

Archbishop Thomas Wenski of Miami, who chairs a panel dealing with environmental issues for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, said the encyclical has "gone to the translators, so it's at the end of its birthing process."

First on the promotional agenda is an April 28 Vatican conference where United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki Moon will be a keynote speaker. The goal is to advance the morality argument that is a theme of the encyclical.

Then on successive days beginning Sept. 23, the pope will visit the White House, address a joint session of Congress — the first pontiff to do so — and address the U.N. General Assembly at the beginning of a summit on sustainable development.

"The timing of the encyclical is significant," Cardinal Peter Turkson told a university audience in Ireland last month. "2015 is a critical year for humanity. ... The coming 10 months are crucial."

The Ghanaian cardinal, who heads the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and who helped draft the encyclical, said all

events lead to Paris in December, when nations will gather to debate how to slow or reduce global warming. He described the core message of the encyclical as "human ecology," arguing that global economic inequality — a theme Francis has frequently raised — is inextricably linked to climate change.

The encyclical will urge that saving the environment is saving humanity, particularly the poorest, who are disproportionately impacted by global warming, Turkson said. Francis hopes the document will "shape the discussion in Paris," Wenski said.

Climate change activists are ecstatic. "He, along with the Dalai Lama and a few rock stars, are the most popular people on the planet right now," said Mary Evelyn Tucker, director of the Forum on Religion and Ecology at Yale University. "He has moral authority and efficacy."

Skeptics are apprehensive. Pope Francis has fallen into "apocalyptic alarmism," Maureen Mullarkey wrote in the conservative Catholic publication *First Things* in January. He is, she said, "bending theology to premature (and) intemperate policy endorsements."

Climate scientists frustrated that their warnings are not stirring appropriate public concern about dangers to the planet see the encyclical, which will be passed down through Catholic university teaching and parish ministries, as achieving greater penetration than ever in raising awareness. "I think it has the potential to be seismic," said Thomas Lovejoy, professor in the environmental science and policy department at George Mason University.

The document will land as a record number of Catholics declare or consider presidential runs for 2016: Jeb Bush, Marco Rubio, Bobby Jindal, Chris Christie and Rick Santorum, all whom either disagree with Francis' views in part or entirely.

The White House, which supports steps to combat global warming, praised the pope's stance. White House spokesman Frank Benenati said last week that "we welcome the pope's attention and immeasurable influence to this global issue."

Francis will "be a voice on this issue, which will ... take into account the science," said Wenski. "But he'll be a voice of a pastor, a voice that will talk about the poor having first claim on our conscience in matters pertaining to the common good and (how) policies made about climate change will affect the common good."

100,000 in Gaza still homeless after war with Israel

GAZA CITY — Liala Kloob, her unemployed husband and their six children sleep on cots in the Abu Assi School in a Gaza Strip refugee camp.

A year ago, her husband worked as a tailor and they owned a house. But Israeli airstrikes destroyed their home and her husband's storefront during the 51-day war last summer with Hamas, the Palestinian militant group that rules Gaza.

"You cannot imagine life in a school with about a 100 other families," said Kloob, who depends on United Nations aid to survive. "The only available solution for my family is staying at the school. We have to stand in a line and wait our turn to get food, water or even to go to the bathroom."

Eight months after the war's end, Kloob is among 100,000 Palestinians in the Gaza Strip who are still homeless, the Association of International Development Agencies (AIDA) said in a report this month.

Their plight reflects a painfully slow post-war reconstruction effort hampered by ongoing economic embargoes of the territory by Israel and Egypt, promised aid from donor nations failing to arrive and political conflicts among the Palestinians.

"No one pays any attention to us," said Alaa Abu-Lahyah, who lost his home and seven relatives, including four young children, in the summer war. "We just keep hearing repeatedly about reconstruction funds, but we don't notice any practical and realistic steps toward reconstruction."

The war erupted after three Israeli teenagers were kidnapped and killed in June by two men with links to Hamas. That prompted an Israeli crackdown in Gaza, from where Hamas fired rockets at Israel. Israel responded with airstrikes and then a ground offensive to destroy the rockets and tunnels Hamas used to smuggle in arms and send fighters into Israel.

The United States and Israel label Hamas as a terrorist organization.

During the seven-week conflict, nearly 2,200 Palestinians died, roughly 70% of them civilians, according to the United Nations; 71 Israelis died, five of them civilians.

The U.N. estimates that 178,000 homes were damaged or destroyed in Gaza's tiny and teeming enclave of 1.8 million people.

The war wrecked hundreds of factories and businesses. Unemployment in Gaza now stands at almost 45%, according to Euro-Mid Observer for Human Rights, a Switzerland-based organization.

Political disagreements between Hamas and the Palestinian Authority that controls the West Bank have hampered reconstruction despite last year's agreement by the groups to share power in the West Bank and Gaza, the AIDA report says.

Hamas is trying to rebuild Gaza, and homelessness is at the top of its agenda, Hamas spokesman Ismail Radwan said. "From the first day of the war until now, Hamas has tried to support the homeless by offering relief and financial aid," he said. "Hamas offers tents, barracks and compensation for victims who lost their houses. But some of them still live in schools."

Rawdan said Hamas is spending around \$10 million on rebuilding Gaza. Turkey, Qatar and other countries have also sent aid. Still, of \$3.5 billion pledged by donors, only about a quarter has been released, AIDA's report said.

"I don't think anybody is doing anything about the roads."

Bad roads hurt manufacturing, farming and transportation, three industries that are vital to Wisconsin's economy, according to the Local Government Institute study entitled *Filling Potholes: A New Look at Funding Local Transportation in Wisconsin*. The group is a coalition of members of the Wisconsin Counties Association, League of Wisconsin Municipalities, Wisconsin Towns Association and Urban Alliance.

The study found that if the state's roads aren't brought back into good condition, it could harm Wisconsin's struggling economy, which is rebounding from the Great Recession more slowly than other states in the Midwest. Companies that are considering moving to Wisconsin could choose to relocate in states with better infrastructure that doesn't cost them as much in annual repairs.

The Local Government Institute took up the issue of Wisconsin's transportation system because it's a big issue at all levels of government, said Wausau Mayor Jim Tipple, a member of the institute's board of directors. The Local Government Institute was created to improve local governments and the services — such as road construction and maintenance — that they provide, Tipple said.

The study found several steps that can be taken to fix the roads without endorsing any one of them, Tipple said.

In the end, it's probably going to be a combination of things that solves the problem, Wood County Board Chairman Lance Pliml said. Pliml, another member of the institute's board of directors, said the biggest issue is state cuts to road repair. It's not likely the problem is going to get any better with the state's next biennial budget, Pliml said.

"The early estimates are that transportation will have a \$650 million shortfall," Pliml said.

Wisconsin spends about \$15,500 on repair and maintenance per road mile, according to the study. The average in the United States is \$17,800 per road mile. Illinois spends \$24,200 per road mile, but Iowa, Michigan and Minnesota all spend less than Wisconsin. Iowa is 43rd in the country at \$8,900 per road mile.

The study isn't a surprise, said Peg Schmitt, Wisconsin Department of Transportation spokeswoman. DOT officials have been doing a lot of outreach over the past few years letting legislators know about the problem of the aging infrastructure. State highways and local roads need investment, she said.

Currently, the state is budgeting 27 percent of the transportation funds it receives for local governments' roads, Schmitt said. The number includes a 4 percent increase state officials made to local road aids in the last budget, Schmitt said.

In 1993, the state dedicated 36.2 percent of road revenue for local governments, Pliml said.

State Sen. Jerry Petrowski, R-Marathon, is chairman of the Committee on Transportation and he thinks Wisconsin's roads still are in better condition than those of its neighbors. Petrowski does agree with the report on one count: As cars and trucks have become more efficient over the past 20 years, drivers are buying less and less fuel. That means the state takes in less and less revenue from gasoline taxes.

Petrowski said he and his colleagues need to consider one option the study proposed: returning to an indexed gas tax that automatically goes up or down with the price of fuel, to ensure that revenues remain relatively constant.

The state also could make vehicles subject to property tax, as Mississippi now does, according to the study. Under that proposal residents who receive property tax bills for homes and other property would have their vehicles included in the assessment amount, generating more tax money for roads.

The study also suggests forming regional transportation groups that could work together on fixing roads and funding public transportation to benefit from economies of scale. The state could encourage the cooperative groups by giving them additional funding, according to the study.

One partial fix on the horizon is the recently adopted constitutional amendment that requires all funding collected for transportation to be used for transportation, Petrowski said. That should pump at least some money back into infrastructure.

Meanwhile, Tipple said that local officials and others who believe roads are a problem should contact their state legislators and tell them the problem needs to be a priority in the state budget now being negotiated.

Lawmaker aims to increase state minimum wage to \$15 an hour

MADISON, Wis. (AP) -- A Wisconsin lawmaker says she wants to double the state's minimum wage, calling the matter a civil rights issue.

At a Tuesday press conference at the Capitol, Rep. Melissa Sargent, a Madison Democrat, introduced a bill that would increase the minimum wage to \$15 an hour. The current minimum wage is \$7.25 an hour.

Sargent said the state's minimum wage is "unlivable" and forces employees to sacrifice health care and other needs to survive. Supporters held signs that said "fight for 15" and cheered.

The bill faces long odds. Republicans control Assembly and Senate chambers.

Spokeswomen for Assembly Speaker Robin Vos and Senate Majority Leader Scott Fitzgerald didn't immediately respond to a request for comment Tuesday.

Old-school car hop service lives on in central Wis.

WISCONSIN RAPIDS – There's something about getting a root beer float, ice cream cone

or burger and fries, served on rubber-matted tray that hangs onto the window lowered to just the right spot. And don't forget the red-and-white checked paper liner.

Car hops at Kathy's Drive In on Baker Drive and Lake Dexter Drive-In near Pittsville are out and ready to take your orders — a sign of warm weather with a touch of nostalgia.

Go back five decades — maybe even longer — and drive-through burger joints weren't the norm; McDonald's opened its first drive-up option in 1975, according to the company website.

Car-hop service was how most fast-food diners got their grub, often when they parked at a burger joint and a teenage girl on roller skates came to the car to take an order.

Today, car hops are becoming a rare option, said Kathy Hanneman, owner of Kathy's Drive In in Wisconsin Rapids.

The Wisconsin Rapids restaurant — next door to the long-vacant Herschleb's, which also offered car hop service and closed in 2007 — is reminiscent of old-style root beer stands, complete with overhead awnings and menu boards visible to those who pull in. It's exactly the atmosphere Hanneman wanted to maintain at the former A&W. She'd like to get car hops on roller skates, but the associated liability insurance — \$1,500 for three months — is prohibitive.

"I used to be a car hop here back when I was 18, so that was 37 years ago," Hanneman said. "I wanted to keep the restaurant as a car hop, as a drive-in; didn't want to change anything — just wanted to keep it back to the way it used to be."

Keeping the drive-in restaurant intact might have been part of the intent of Everett and Irene Rasmussen, who bought the former Frosty's, which once was on Eighth Street South before moving to the Dexterville location in 1969, according to Jodi Wolfe of Pittsville.

Wolfe also worked as a car hop at the Lake Dexter drive-in while she was in junior high school, and bought the business 10 years ago. While the Rapids business is open year-round, the Dexterville spot opens the end of March and stays open through the Warrens Cranberry festival in September.

"I can even remember people from when I worked (as a teen) that will come here," said Wolfe, 33, of Pittsville.

Seeing car hops these days often is a surprise to customers, Wolfe said.

"It is a lost thing," she said. And because Pittsville — about 5 miles from the Lake Dexter Drive-In — has no drive-through restaurant options, it's the fastest way to get a burger in town, she said.

Wolfe sees customers she served when she was a car hop — and even second generations who stop in for a treat.

Sometimes people will comment, "We haven't seen one of these forever," Wolfe said.

The service draws a variety of customers — and can bring back memories, the owners said.

Some Gulf nations say their promised donations have been hampered by falling oil prices. The U.S. and other Western powers refuse to deliver aid to Hamas unless it renounces violence.

Rawdan also said that Gazans can't rebuild because of Israeli restrictions on bringing construction materials into the territory. Israeli Foreign Ministry spokesman Emmanuel Nahshon said Egypt's blockade of Gaza is serving its purpose. "The reconstruction of Gaza is jeopardized by Hamas," Nahshon said. "Building materials are diverted from their original purpose to the reconstruction of tunnels and bunkers." Hamas doesn't really care about the civilians in Gaza, he added: "Hamas uses the civilian population cynically, just as it has done for many years."

In the meantime, Gazans say living conditions are unbearable.

"We don't receive any financial or material help from anyone," said Alaa Abu-Lahyah of Gaza City. She said the lack of "everything" — housing, electricity, water — has left life a continuing struggle. "We cannot enjoy anything, or even smile in these miserable living conditions, especially the kids. They cannot play or learn in all of this."

EU doubles emergency aid to nations dealing with migrants

BRUSSELS (AP) — The European Union has doubled the emergency aid to frontline member states Italy, Greece and Malta which have to deal with the massive influx of migrants coming across the Mediterranean to 50 million euros (\$54 million) a year. EU Commission spokeswoman Natasha Berthaud said "the entire emergency fund is doubling" following an agreement at Thursday's EU summit where leaders also pledged ships, aircraft and equipment to save lives in the Mediterranean after the deaths at sea of more than 1,300 migrants over the past three weeks.

The funds can be used for reception centers of migrants, medical aid or additional staff dealing with the influx. It is part of an overall EU fund for migration and asylum issues.

At Thursday's summit, the leaders also agreed to triple funding to 9 million euros (\$9.7 million) a month for the EU's border operation patrolling the Mediterranean.

At the same time Berthaud said the EU border agency Frontex is to send its ships further into the Mediterranean Sea in response to the deadly exodus from Libya.

EU leaders on Thursday pledged to double the size of Frontex's Triton mission and triple its budget but refused to allow it to do active search and rescue work.

Actress Angelina Jolie, a special envoy for the U.N. on refugee issues, told the U.N. Security Council on Friday that "it is sickening to see thousands of refugees drowning on the doorstep of the world's wealthiest continent."

"No one risks the lives of their children in this way except out of utter desperation," Jolie said.

Critics say Triton is ineffective in dealing with the migrant influx because its mandate restricts its border control tasks to 30 nautical miles from land and does not allow it to approach the Libyan coast.

Berthaud said a new operational plan for Triton will be agreed with Italian authorities and that this "will be ready in the coming days."

Amnesty International said any failure to extend Triton's area of operations would undermine the fresh EU pledges of ships, aircraft and other resources.

The UN refugee agency said "it's crucial that everyone's focus is on saving lives, including in the Libyan search and rescue area, which is where most of the distress calls tend to come from."

Some aid groups complained that the leaders failed to find other ways for people to reach Europe safely.

"Without these alternatives, declaring war on smugglers is declaring war on the very same people the member states say their priority is to save," said Aurelie Ponthieu, adviser on migration at Doctors Without Borders.

Death toll in Nepal hits 4,000 amid hunt for survivors

Rescuers in Nepal desperately searched Monday for survivors who may be buried amid the rubble in the capital of Katmandu or trapped in remote mountain villages, as the death toll soared past 4,300 from Saturday's massive earthquake.

The tally could rise further after officials assess the damage to communities nestled in the mountains. Efforts to reach those remote villages have so far been hampered by landslides that have blocked many mountain trails.

Three Americans are among those killed on Mount Everest after the quake triggered an avalanche.

Udav Prashad Timalina, the top official for the Gorkha district, where the magnitude-7.8 quake was centered, said he was in desperate need of help. "There are people who are not getting food and shelter. I've had reports of villages where 70% of the houses have been destroyed," he said, according to the Associated Press.

Timalina said 223 people had been confirmed dead in the Gorkha district, but he presumed "the number would go up because there are thousands who are injured."

He said his district had not received enough help from the central government, but army spokesman Jagdish Pokhrel said nearly the entire 100,000-soldier army was involved in rescue operations.

"We have 90% of the army out there working on search and rescue," he told the AP. "We are focusing our efforts on that, on saving lives."

Matt Darvas, of the aid group World Vision, said many remote villages will be accessible only by helicopter.

"Villages like this are routinely affected by landslides, and it's not uncommon for entire villages of 200, 300, up to 1,000 people to be

completely buried by rock falls," Darvas told the AP.

Among those killed are 18 people who died on Mount Everest after the quake triggered an avalanche that buried part of the base camp, plus 61 people who died in India and 25 reported dead in Tibet.

A U.S. Air Force C-17 carrying search experts and 45 tons of cargo was scheduled to land in Nepal on Monday, with a second flight due on Tuesday, the Pentagon said. Two Army Special Forces teams that were in Nepal when the earthquake struck are aiding in rescue efforts.

More than a dozen countries and many charities are sending aid, but Nepal needs more, said Lila Mani Poudyal, the government's chief secretary and the rescue coordinator.

He said the recovery was also being slowed because many workers — water tanker drivers, electricity company employees and laborers needed to clear debris — "are all gone to their families and staying with them, refusing to work."

"We are appealing for tents, dry goods, blankets, mattresses, and 80 different medicines that the health department is seeking that we desperately need now," Poudyal told reporters. "We don't have the helicopters that we need or the expertise to rescue the people trapped."

The arrival of relief flights has caused major backups at Katmandu's small airport.

Four Indian air force aircraft carrying aid supplies and rescue personnel were forced to return to New Delhi on Monday because of airport congestion, Indian defense ministry spokesman Sitanshu Kar said. India planned to resend the planes later Monday night when the situation was expected to have eased. Climbers from around the globe travel to scale Mount Everest, the world's highest peak. Among the 18 people killed in the avalanche were Tom Taplin, 61, a Denver-born filmmaker and Google engineer who was shooting a documentary about the Mount Everest base camp. He was living in Santa Monica, Calif.

Also killed were Google executive Daniel Fredinburg, who was part of a team from the firm attempting to create a Google street map of the trek to Everest Base Camp, and Marisa Eve Girawong, an emergency room physician assistant serving as a base camp doctor for the Seattle-based Madison Mountaineering expedition company.

Climber Carsten Pederson, who survived the avalanche that hit the base camp, told CNN that he witnessed people trying to flee the rush of ice and snow.

"They were trying to outrun the avalanche and you cannot," CNN quoted Pederson as saying. "So many people were hit from behind, blown off the mountain, blown into rocks, hit by debris, tents were flying off." More than 100 aftershocks have rocked Katmandu since Saturday, including one that was magnitude 6.7, impeding the rescue work. Thousands of people have been driven

to sleep out in the open having either lost their homes or fearing an already damaged structure might collapse on top of them. Hundreds are trying to flee the terror of the city, jamming the roads out of town. "We are escaping," Krishna Mukhari, a small grocery-store owner told Reuters. "How can you live here? I have got children, they can't be rushing out of the house all night." The hospitals are overwhelmed by those who were injured and are running low on supplies, as well as space for the tragic number of corpses. Many areas of the city are without power or water, and food supplies are running low.

Nepal prime minister: Death toll could reach 10,000

Nepal's prime minister said Tuesday the death toll from the devastating earthquake that rocked the country Saturday could reach 10,000, and the United Nations estimated 8 million people have been affected. Prime Minister Sushil Koirala made the statement to Reuters as he appealed for tents and medicine and ordered rescue efforts to be stepped up. International aid has started arriving in the country.

The death toll from the magnitude-7.8 quake has soared past 4,700. Hundreds of thousands of people are sleeping outdoors and living in the open because they are homeless or out of fear of being inside amid aftershocks. It rained heavily Tuesday in the capital of Kathmandu, forcing people to find shelter wherever they could.

Gautam Rimal, an official in rural Nepal, said 250 people are believed missing following a mudslide and avalanche in the isolated village of Ghodatabela, not far from the epicenter of the quake, the Associated Press reported.

Among those killed are 18 people, including four Americans, who died on Mount Everest after the quake triggered an avalanche that buried part of the base camp at the world's highest mountain. At least 61 people died in India, and 25 were reported dead in Tibet as tremors from the quake rippled across the region.

"The government is doing all it can for rescue and relief on a war footing," Koirala told Reuters. "It is a challenge and a very difficult hour for Nepal."

The death toll and the number of injured — which the United Nations puts at nearly 7,000 — is expected to rise as search-and-rescue teams reach remote areas in the Himalayan country.

American doctor Rebecca McAteer, who is working in the quake zone, told the AP that most rural people were working in the fields when the earthquake hit around noon, meaning they escaped injury when buildings collapsed.

"In some villages, about 90% of the houses have collapsed. They're just flattened," she said. "The immediate need is getting support to where it's needed, but there will be a lot of work rebuilding."

Thomas Meyer, an engineer with the International Nepal Fellowship, added: "This is a long-term emergency," AP reported.

"This will need major attention for the next five years. People have nothing left." A U.N. situation report said 1.4 million people are in need of food, according to early indications.

"Of these, 750,000 people live near the epicenter in poor quality housing," the report said. "Impact on agriculture-based livelihoods and food security is expected to be extremely high."

Jamie McGoldrick, the U.N. resident coordinator in Kathmandu, told reporters that 8 million people had been affected by the quake, the AP reported.

The United Nations Population Fund warned that hospitals in the Kathmandu Valley are overcrowded, while the injured are being treated in the streets. Women and girls are especially vulnerable, the fund said.

"The Fund is particularly concerned about the fate of pregnant women who have been affected by this tragedy, including those who might face potentially life-threatening complications," said Babatunde Osotimehin, UNFPA's executive director.

Emergency workers were being deployed and dignity and reproductive health kits were on the way to the country, the organization said.

Putin accuses U.S. of supporting separatists in Russia

MOSCOW (AP) — Intercepted calls showed that United States helped separatists in Russia's North Caucasus in the 2000s, Russian President Vladimir Putin claimed in a new documentary in which he underscored his suspicions of the West.

The two hour-long documentary, to be aired on the state-owned Rossiya-1 TV channel later on Sunday, is dedicated to Putin's 15 years in office. It focused on Putin's achievements as well as challenges to his rule — which the producers and Putin blame on Western interference.

Putin was elected Russian president on March 26, 2000, after spending three months as acting president, and was sworn in on May 7, 2000.

The documentary showed Putin interviewed at the Kremlin in the dimly-lit St. Alexander's Hall. In excerpts released shortly before the film's broadcast, Putin said Russian intelligence agencies had intercepted calls between the separatists and the U.S. intelligence based in Azerbaijan during the early 2000s, proving that Washington was helping the insurgents.

He did not specify when the calls took place. Following a disastrous war in the 1990s, Russia fought Islamic insurgents in Chechnya and neighboring regions in the volatile North Caucasus.

"They were actually helping them, even with transportation," Putin said.

Putin said he raised the issue with then-U.S. President George W. Bush, who promised Putin to "kick the ass" of the intelligence officers in question. But in the end, Putin said

the Russian intelligence agency FSB received a letter from their "American counterparts" who asserted their right to "support all opposition forces in Russia," including the Islamic separatists in the Caucasus.

Putin also expressed his fears that the West wishes Russia harm as he recalled how some world leaders told him they would not mind Russia's possible disintegration.

"My counterparts, a lot of presidents and prime minister told me later on that they had decided for themselves by then that Russia would cease to exist in its current form," he said, referring to the time period around the second conflict in the Caucasus. "The only question was when it happens and what consequences would be."

The latest poll by the independent Levada agency showed that the approval rating for Putin, whose third term in office ends in 2018, was a whopping 86 percent in April.

Thailand seizes 3 tons of Kenya elephant tusks

BANGKOK (AP) — Thailand seized 3 tons of ivory hidden in tea leaf sacks from Kenya in the second-biggest bust in the country's history, one week after the biggest seizure, customs officials said Monday.

The 511 elephant tusks worth \$6 million, bound for Laos, were seized upon arrival Saturday at a major port in Chonburi province in eastern Thailand. The bust came after customs officials received a tip-off in Laos and Thailand and tracked the containers from Kenya, Customs Department Director-General Somchai Sujjapongse told reporters. The ivory, hidden among tea leaves, was shipped out of Kenya on March 24 and went through ports in Sri Lanka, Malaysia and Singapore before coming to Thailand, he said.

The bust came one week after Thai customs officials seized 4 tons of tusks that were smuggled from Congo and also destined for Laos in what they said was the nation's biggest seizure.

Somchai said that the tusks seized Saturday were "more beautiful and complete than the previous lot," and that they would likely have been distributed to buyers in China, Vietnam and Thailand had the shipment reached Laos. Thailand is one of the top destinations for African ivory smuggling in Asia and could face international sanctions soon if it doesn't show progress in combatting the problem.

"After these two consecutive big busts ... the transnational crime networks must realize it is getting increasingly difficult to send their shipment past Thailand, but I think they will try to come up with the more complicated means, so we will have already prepared the measures to (tackle the issue)," Somchai said. Poachers have killed tens of thousands of African elephants for their tusks in recent years to meet demand for ivory in Asia. China has imposed a one-year ban on ivory imports amid criticism that its citizens' huge appetite for ivory threatens the existence of Africa's elephants.

I learned a lot from my prison experience. Without the loving support of friends and family, life is meaningless. My prison sentence hurt my family and friends even more than it hurt me.

My three-year sentence was enough time to think about my mistake, but that's not enough punishment for me. I never want to serve another minute in prison, but I do want to spend my life serving my community.

It's not what we do occasionally that makes us who we are, it's what we do consistently. Good people sometimes do bad things. I'm no longer the same person I was in 1994. I made a mistake, but I'm not a mistake.
