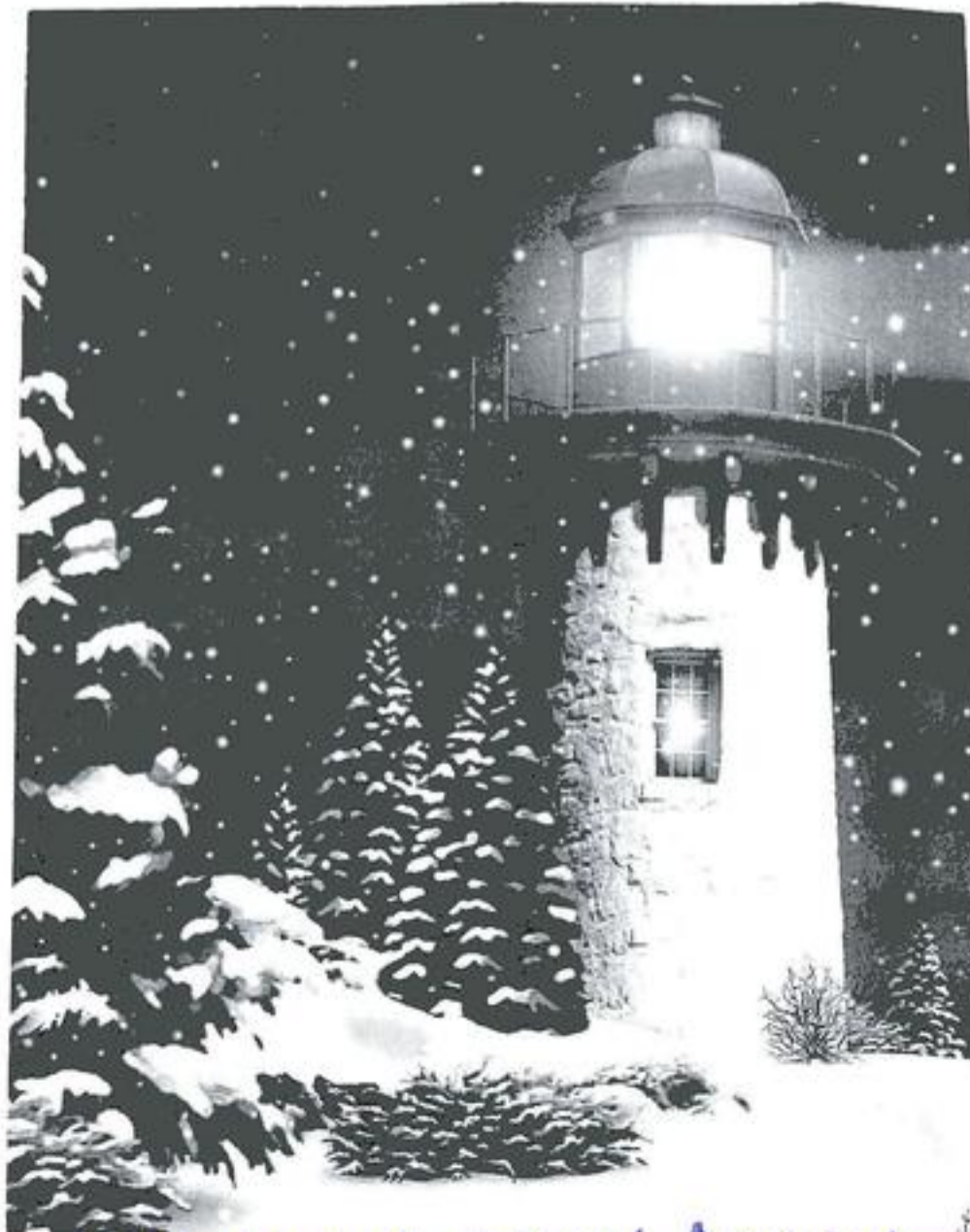

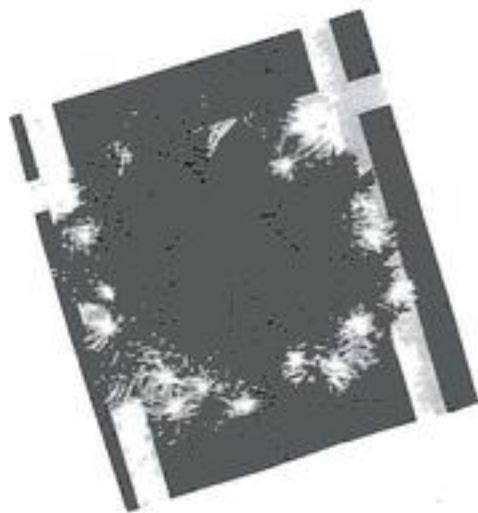

China lifts one-child policy amid worries over graying population

BEIJING — China said Thursday that it will abandon its controversial "one-child policy" and allow all couples to have two children, effectively ending the biggest population control experiment in history amid growing pressure from a rapidly aging population. The move, which came after a meeting of the Communist Party leadership, reflected concerns about potential labor shortages and rising numbers of elderly people that would greatly strain the economy in the years ahead. The communiqué from a plenary session of the party's Central Committee did not say when the policy change will be implemented, only that the party had decided to "fully adopt the policy that one couple is allowed two children [and] actively take action on aging population."

China's unpopular one-child rule was introduced in 1980, and was brutally enforced through huge fines, forced sterilizations and abortions, experts say. It empowered and enriched a huge swath of officials, with bribes often paid to skirt the rules.

It also skewed China's sex ratio as a result of the selective abortion of girls, who are much less favored in traditional Chinese culture. Calls to abandon the policy had reached a crescendo in the past decade, but the Communist Party moved slowly, partly relaxing the rule in 2013 before Thursday's announcement.

Experts on Chinese affairs, including Wang Feng at the University of California at Irvine, have long warned that the country was heading toward a "demographic precipice" that could even challenge the legitimacy of Communist Party rule.

Wang called the policy's abandonment "great news" even if the effects will take a generation or longer to filter through. "This really marks a historic point to end one of the most controversial and costly policies in human history," he said. "But China for decades to come will have to live with the aftermath of this costly policy."

The nation's fertility rate — 1.4 children per woman — is far below that of the United States and many other nations in the developed world, leading to a rapidly graying

society and increasing demands on the state such as social programs and health care for the elderly.

It also means a substantial decline in the supply of young labor to power the world's No. 2 economy as it seeks to dethrone the United States.

China's working-age population fell for a third straight year in 2014, declining by 3.7 million to 916 million, according to government data, in a trend that is expected to accelerate in years ahead.

Meanwhile, the number of people 60 and older will approach 400 million, or a quarter of the population, in the early 2030s, according to United Nations forecasts. The 60-plus age group represents about a seventh of China's population.

"The reform will slightly slow down China's aging society but it won't reverse it," said Peng Xizhe, a population professor at Fudan University. "It will ease the labor shortage in the long term, but in the short term it may increase the shortage because more women might stop work to give birth."

The policy was introduced in delayed reaction to booming birth rates as China recovered from Mao Zedong's disastrous Great Leap Forward and the famine of 1958-62.

But by 1980, it was no longer needed, many experts argue. Birth rates in China already had declined sharply during the 1970s. The California-based scholar Wang said the one-child policy was "a textbook example of bad science combined with bad politics" that was morally questionable and priming a demographic time bomb by driving down fertility rates further.

Despite the demographic pressure, the communique said China was "sticking to the basic policy of state family planning" and "population growth strategy." In other words, it is not taking its hands off the rudder entirely: Under the new policy, couples will still be limited to two children.

"That's mostly political face-saving," said Wang, asserting that rulers throughout Chinese history were unwilling to admit "we made a mistake."

The policy was eased in 2013 to allow couples to have a second child if either parent was an only child. Rural couples already could have a second child if their first child was a girl. Members of some ethnic minorities, including Tibetans, were exempt from the restrictions.

The policy shift two years ago, however, did not appear to lead to a big boost in birth rates, with economic pressures and the cultural norms around having one child meaning that many families decided to stay as they were.

"The change won't cause a baby wave, as the last policy change proved," Peng said.

"Couples chose not to have a second child because of economic pressure and insufficient social welfare."

Another population expert, who was involved in policy formation and spoke on the

condition of anonymity, said the change will not have significant economic effects. "Its political meaning is much greater than its demographic meaning," the expert said. "Academics have continuously lobbied the government to abandon birth control for around 10 years. The good thing is the government is correcting the direction [of policy]."

Future population growth may depend partly on whether the government introduces policies to encourage childbirth such as longer maternity and paternity leave, said Fudan University's Peng.

Already there are signs that of changes are under consideration.

Li Bin, the head of China's National Health and Family Planning Commission, told state television that the authorities should improve the supply of public services including reproductive health care for women and children, and the availability of kindergartens and nurseries.

Reaction on social media was enthusiastic. "I can't even believe this is real," one user posted on the weibo microblogging service. Another posted: "At least people have an option. Good."

There was also humor, and some bitterness. "Finally, don't have to go to the U.S. to have a second child," one user posted.

"Can we have the fines back? And can we get rid of that certain department?" another wrote.

"I don't even want this one," another user joked, while another observed: "But I fear I won't be able to raise them," in a reference to the cost of bringing up two children.

The communiqué from the Fifth Plenum also reflected China's growing concern about climate change, saying the country will "actively participate in global climate change negotiations."

Investors took notice. Shares of companies with infant products — including baby formula makers Mead Johnson, Nestle and Danone — saw share prices jump in anticipation of potentially greater sales in China.

Egypt to scan pyramids, seeking new discoveries

CAIRO (AP) — Scientists will scan four of Egypt's ancient pyramids starting next month using waves, particles and thermal imaging in order to see what lies beneath their surface. Antiquities Minister Mamdouh Eldamaty says the project will begin south of Cairo with the scanning of the so-called Bent Pyramid at Dashour, followed by the nearby Red Pyramid. Later, the two largest pyramids on the Giza plateau, those of Cheops and Chephren, will also be scanned. The structures are over 4,500 years old.

At a news conference, scientist Matthieu Klein of Canada's Laval University says his team will use infrared technology to scan several meters (yards) beneath the surface without touching the structures.

storage, both of which Vermont Yankee did in the years before its owner, Entergy Corp., closed the plant at the end of last year because it was becoming less competitive against electricity generated with cheap natural gas.

The spent fuel bottleneck leaves closed and soon-to-close nuclear plants with the prospect that for the indefinite future, they will look like the site of the former Maine Yankee plant. That plant was permanently shut down in 1997, nearly two decades ago. Today, the reactor is gone, but the site in the coastal town of Wiscasset still features 60 steel canisters encased in concrete that contain the 550 metric tons of spent fuel the plant generated in its 25-year life. The site is guarded 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Vermont Yankee's decommissioning fund already is short enough — it contains about half the estimated \$1.24 billion cost of dismantling the reactor, removing the waste and restoring the site — that the plant plans to follow an NRC-allowed procedure called "SAFSTOR," in which the closed reactor is mothballed for up to 60 years in hopes the fund will grow enough to cover the cost. Vermont Yankee spokesman Martin Cohn said Entergy had taken out a \$145 million line of credit to cover capital costs of building its on-site waste storage. But he said the company is planning for \$225 million in security and other operating expenses after the spent fuel is in storage.

Gundersen said Vermont is alone among states in that it is trying to limit raids on the decommissioning fund. This month, Vermont won a ruling from an NRC board that Entergy would have to keep it informed of withdrawals from the fund for specific expenses.

Cohn argued that anyone concerned about the costs of on-site waste storage and how they're being paid should not focus their ire on the industry, NRC or even the Department of Energy. Rather, it is the Congress that has failed to fulfill its decades-old promise that the federal government will take highly radioactive spent fuel off the hands of nuclear plant operators.

Gunshots help deflate runaway military blimp in Pennsylvania

PENNSYLVANIA -- Pennsylvania law enforcement on Thursday used small arms fire to deflate the unmanned runaway Army blimp that broke loose from its ground tether at a military base in Maryland on Wednesday, a Pentagon spokesperson said. It was deflated because there were fears it could be grabbed by the winds and take off again, the spokesperson said. The blimp is now fully deflated.

The blimp drifted over central Pennsylvania as two Air Force fighter jets tracked it. It was grounded in central Pennsylvania.

A North American Aerospace Defense Command spokesman confirmed to CBS News that the blimp landed in Montour County, Pennsylvania, on Wednesday afternoon. NORAD said the blimp detached

from its station at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, at about 12:20 p.m., and initially traveled north at an altitude of about 16,000 feet.

CBS News national security correspondent David Martin reported on Wednesday that National Guard helicopters were scrambled along the blimp's projected route to secure the crash site and all of the technology on board the blimp when it finally came down. A Pentagon spokesperson told Martin on Thursday the blimp is a fire control blimp, not the surveillance blimp that was originally reported.

Martin reports that an Army recovery team has arrived to where the blimp is located. The Danville National Guard Armory is being used as the collection point for the pieces. An Army safety investigation will be conducted, but there is no indication of foul play.

Spokesman Capt. Jeff Davis repeated statements from Wednesday, that there was never any serious consideration given to shooting it down, although he did not have any answers to questions about what they would have done if the blimp hadn't come down on its own. Davis said the blimp's auto-deflate mechanism is designed to operate if the tether breaks, but Davis did not know if it was the auto deflate mechanism that caused the blimp to descend.

The blimp's long tether snapped thousands of power lines, causing outages. The local electric utility, PPL, reported about 20,000 customers without power in the area on Wednesday afternoon, although it was unclear how many could be attributed to the blimp. Bloomsburg University canceled classes, citing a "widespread power outage." Martin reports that there is a process by which people who have suffered damages from the blimp can file a claim with the Army. The Pentagon has no estimate on amount of damage caused at this time. Some who live in Aberdeen, like Tom Neuberger, have long worried that the blimp would get loose and crash into their neighborhood.

"Fly it into a hurricane, but don't fly it over our heads. We have children, retirees, a college, a community," he said to CBS News' Chip Reid. "We want to be safe from this kind of military mismanagement."

There are only two of these blimps in existence -- the fire control one which went down and the surveillance one that is now grounded, apart of a \$2.6 billion, 10 year long program.

The blimp is the kind used extensively in the Iraq and Afghanistan wars to provide ground surveillance around U.S. bases and other sensitive sites.

"My understanding is, from having seen these break loose in Afghanistan on a number of occasions, we could get it to descend and then we'll recover it and put it back up," Defense Secretary Ash Carter said in a brief exchange with reporters at the Pentagon on Wednesday. "This happens in bad weather."

At the time it broke away it was operating within permitted weather minimums. The F-16s tracking the blimp were launched from the Atlantic City Air National Guard Base in New Jersey, according to the NORAD statement. FAA officials were working with the military to ensure air traffic safety in the area.

As Reid reported in February, the type of unmanned blimp is nearly as long as a football field.

It is being tested for permanent duty scanning the sky for incoming cruise missiles, Reid reported.

The state-of-the-art radar housed in the bubble underneath the unmanned dirigible has a range of 340 miles -- from Boston to North Carolina.

Wisconsin representatives consider toll roads

Major road projects in Wisconsin continue to face delays as the state scrambles to find funding. The DOT says a number of projects would face delays of at least two years, including the highway 10 - 441 interchange in the valley. Governor walker has called on lawmakers approve hundreds of millions of dollars in borrowing this year, but some say that proposal is unsustainable.

The impasse is forcing lawmakers to look at other methods of fundraising, and now drivers could soon see tolls on Wisconsin roads.

"I think they are a wonderful way of raising revenue," said Ken VonKluck.

Ken lives in Eagle River, but used to live in Illinois. He is familiar with the toll system there and thinks Wisconsin should jump on board, to help pay for road maintenance and construction.

"Toll roads are charging the people who are actually using the roads. Spreading that cost across everyone probably is a little unfair because there may be people who never drive anywhere near Green Bay, Milwaukee, or Madison, and they'd end up paying for the roads," he added.

Right now, federal law says states do not have the authority to create toll roads, but Congressman Reid Ribble says that could soon change.

"I think states will have the authority to toll on their own roads. The federal government isn't going to come in and mandate tolls, but their likely to give the states the authority to toll the interstate system if they choose," said Representative Ribble.

But not everyone wants tolls coming to Wisconsin.

"Timing issues, the traffic, car accidents, they have a pull over spot just for car accidents right by the toll booths. Our roads aren't the

Metal acts mourn passing of Motörhead drummer Phil Taylor

Phil Taylor, who served as the second drummer for the influential British heavy metal trio Motörhead, died Wednesday at age 61.

His friend and former bandmate, Fast Eddie Clarke, revealed Taylor's death in a Facebook posting on Thursday.

"My dear friend and brother passed away last night," he wrote. "He had been ill for sometime but that does not make it any easier when the time finally comes. I have known Phil since he was 21 and he was one hell of a character. Fortunately we made some fantastic music together and I have many many fond memories of our time together. Rest in Peace, Phil!"

Sadly, this time, Taylor's death, which has been prematurely reported often enough that the band joked about it, was real.

Motörhead injected punk into metal and are revered as founding fathers of the speed metal genre, inspiring acts like Metallica, Guns 'n' Roses and the Foo Fighters. The British music magazine called them as the "best worst band in the world."

In 1975, Motörhead dropped their unreliable original drummer in the middle of recording their first album. In a pinch, the group's frontman, Ian "Lemmy" Kilmister called on Taylor. Neither he nor Clarke, who joined the following year, was long for the band, which was still struggling to get their first album out. They quit — or at least tried to — in 1977 but were convinced to hang around long enough to do a farewell concert. A recording session followed, which yielded

their first single, Motorhead, and an eponymous debut album.

In 1980, Taylor accessorized his heavy-metal drummer look with a neck brace, which he played in after being dropped on his head while goofing off with friends. And when a broken hand sustained in a fist fight threatened to derail the band's touring plans, Taylor taped his drum stick to his injured hand and kept playing.

He left the band again in 1984 but was back three years later. He stayed with the band until his perpetually messy personal life prompted the band to dismiss him for good. Sad sad news about losing Phil "Philthy Animal" Taylor. One of the best drummers in Rock n Roll. RIP Phil, you will be missed. A lot.

Motorhead's official Facebook page paid tribute to Taylor, whose nickname was Philthy Animal, "he who fueled many a young boy's punk/metal hairstyles ... He who played the drums with fury and intent... He who liked to call people 'wazzocks' once in a while ... Friend, Roman, Derbyshireman. Rest in peace ... With much love ..."

So why did Lou Diamond Phillips check into 'The Biggest Loser' resort?

Lou Diamond Phillips found out the hard way, you gotta work it to play a miner in *The 33*.

So when Phillips earned the part of shift foreman Luis Urzua, one of the 33 miners trapped underground (often with minimal food) for 69 days in the 2010 Chilean mine collapse, he got right to making himself look the part.

Director Patricia Riggen sent him and two other actors directly to Malibu and "The Biggest Loser Resort."

Phillips, 53, found it very challenging. "I thought I was in pretty good shape. But they almost killed me. I thought they would show us a few things, give us a few pointers, give us a menu for a diet. No, no, no. They literally put us through a gauntlet of exercises to see what our physical capabilities were for eight hours. They measured our fat content, then they put me on a 1,200 calorie-a-day diet. I went and shaved that to 1,000 a day. They wanted us to do 2 to 4 hours of constant cardio a day." Phillips is a now big believer in the resort, as he dropped 15 pounds in three weeks to a super-lean 157 pounds for the part.

"It's 100% the real deal, I gotta say. I know what they put us through. I cannot imagine someone who is carrying an extra 150 pounds doing what we did. It was torture. I am surprised there are not more casualties." The worst part of the story? Phillips had to put the weight back after one of *The 33* mine sets had an accident, changing the shooting schedule.

"I get a panic call from Patricia Riggen in Colombia. She said one of the sets burned down. I need you to put the weight back on.

We're changing the schedule. It was absolute craziness. I just had to put it back on."

ABC cancels 'Wicked City' after three episodes

Serial-killer drama *Wicked City's* latest casualty is itself.

ABC Friday decided to pull the series from its Tuesday time slot, less than three weeks after its premiere. It is the first new show to be yanked from the primetime lineup this fall, although others will follow.

Shark Tank reruns will take its place starting Tuesday (10 p.m. ET/PT) and production of the low-rated drama will conclude after the Episode 8, which is shooting now.

Networks have been exercising more patience before pulling new shows this fall, waiting to see if they add significantly to their audience numbers in an age where delayed viewing is on the rise. *Wicked City's* tiny same-day numbers (1.7 million viewers on Tuesday) may have made it harder to wait.

Although other new shows haven't yet been taken off the primetime schedule, they are headed in that direction. ABC's *Blood & Oil*, Fox's *Minority Report* and NBC's *Truth Be Told* have had their 13-episode orders cut to 10 and NBC's *The Player* has been reduced from 13 episodes to 9.

Schwarzenegger stars in campaign to save African elephants

JOHANNESBURG (AP) — The Terminator is campaigning to save African elephants from poachers.

Arnold Schwarzenegger is featured in a new video in which he brandishes a tusk and appeals for an end to the slaughter of elephants. The video, which was released Friday, then shows the tusk being wired with explosives and blown up.

"Let's get rid of the demand once and for all," says the action star of the "Terminator" series, who sports sunglasses and is seen standing in front of a military vehicle. The video was made on behalf of the Wildlife Conservation Society, a group based at New York's Bronx Zoo.

The Los Angeles Zoo donated the tusk that was blown up in the video, according to the conservation group. It said eight countries, including China, the United States and several African countries, have publicly destroyed more than 42 tons of illegal ivory this year.

Poachers have annually killed tens of thousands of elephants in recent years to meet rising demand for ivory, particularly in China. In September, the United States and China agreed to work toward nearly complete bans on the ivory trade.

Charlie Sheen's diagnosis offers 'teachable moment'

The days of "tiger blood" and "winning" are over.

Charlie Sheen's revelation that he's HIV-positive begins a new chapter of his career. In an interview with Matt Lauer on the *Today* show Tuesday morning, the former *Two and a Half Men* star and Hollywood bad

boy divulged details about being diagnosed with the human immunodeficiency virus four years ago and how people in his inner circle extorted millions out of him to keep it under wraps.

Sheen is the most high-profile celebrity to share his HIV-positive status since Earvin "Magic" Johnson retired in 1991 from the Los Angeles Lakers. Entertainers such as actor Rock Hudson, N.W.A. co-founder Eazy-E and Queen singer Freddie Mercury disclosed their diagnoses when they were near death. Pianist Liberace kept his condition secret to the grave — an autopsy after the musician's death in 1987 revealed he had an AIDS-related illness.

The response in Hollywood to Sheen's diagnosis is going to be overwhelmingly supportive publicly, says NaughtyGossip.com editor in chief Rob Shuter. "But in the shadows and in private chatter, people are going to be saying what regular people are saying around the dinner table," he says. "There's a lot of judgment in Hollywood, there are a lot of people saying 'I told you so.'

"If George Clooney had gone and said he was HIV-positive, it'd be a very, very different response. In the same way there are so many judgments still about HIV and a lot of blame on the victim, that's happening in Hollywood now," he says. "(If Sheen) had a blood transfusion and got the virus, it would be different."

HIV/AIDS really hasn't been in the public conversation in a serious way since Johnson's announcement, says Peter Staley, a long-time activist seen in the Oscar-nominated documentary *How to Survive a Plague*, who says there were concerns in the HIV/AIDS community prior to the announcement.

But in Sheen's interview, Staley saw a man who "has gone through four years of hell with his HIV status being used against him by others who were seeking to get rich off his wealth. I could feel the burden lifting from him."

Sheen's *Today* revelation reinforces the message that HIV is still a major issue in this country, says Carlos del Rio, professor of global health and medicine at Emory University and co-director of the Emory Center for AIDS Research.

"This is a stark reminder that everybody can get HIV," del Rio says. "You can be white, you can be rich, you can be famous and you can still get HIV."

Though Sheen went public mostly because of outside pressures, it still took courage for him to reveal his diagnosis, says veteran publicist and strategic media consultant Howard Bragman, founder of Fifteen Minutes PR, who calls it a "teachable moment."

People in Hollywood have known about Sheen's secret "for a long time," says Shuter, who thinks it's more Sheen's outbursts and manic nature in recent years, rather than his diagnosis, that have

kept him from working. "This might help explain that erratic behavior, but it doesn't erase the behavior itself."

boy divulged details about being diagnosed with the human immunodeficiency virus four years ago and how people in his inner circle extorted millions out of him to keep it under wraps.

Sheen is the most high-profile celebrity to share his HIV-positive status since Earvin "Magic" Johnson retired in 1991 from the Los Angeles Lakers. Entertainers such as actor Rock Hudson, N.W.A. co-founder Eazy-E and Queen singer Freddie Mercury disclosed their diagnoses when they were near death. Pianist Liberace kept his condition secret to the grave — an autopsy after the musician's death in 1987 revealed he had an AIDS-related illness.

The response in Hollywood to Sheen's diagnosis is going to be overwhelmingly supportive publicly, says NaughtyGossip.com editor in chief Rob Shuter. "But in the shadows and in private chatter, people are going to be saying what regular people are saying around the dinner table," he says. "There's a lot of judgment in Hollywood, there are a lot of people saying 'I told you so.'

"If George Clooney had gone and said he was HIV-positive, it'd be a very, very different response. In the same way there are so many judgments still about HIV and a lot of blame on the victim, that's happening in Hollywood now," he says. "(If Sheen) had a blood transfusion and got the virus, it would be different."

HIV/AIDS really hasn't been in the public conversation in a serious way since Johnson's announcement, says Peter Staley, a long-time activist seen in the Oscar-nominated documentary *How to Survive a Plague*, who says there were concerns in the HIV/AIDS community prior to the announcement.

But in Sheen's interview, Staley saw a man who "has gone through four years of hell with his HIV status being used against him by others who were seeking to get rich off his wealth. I could feel the burden lifting from him."

Sheen's *Today* revelation reinforces the message that HIV is still a major issue in this country, says Carlos del Rio, professor of global health and medicine at Emory University and co-director of the Emory Center for AIDS Research.

"This is a stark reminder that everybody can get HIV," del Rio says. "You can be white, you can be rich, you can be famous and you can still get HIV."

Though Sheen went public mostly because of outside pressures, it still took courage for him to reveal his diagnosis, says veteran publicist and strategic media consultant Howard Bragman, founder of Fifteen Minutes PR, who calls it a "teachable moment."

People in Hollywood have known about Sheen's secret "for a long time," says Shuter, who thinks it's more

during the five-day trip that lasts through Sunday. By Friday, they had so far made several attempts that were hampered by the conditions and technical challenges, but they planned to keep trying over the weekend.

They are using the National Science Foundation's research vessel Endeavor as a base and working 24 hours a day to get access. In addition to streaming online, the scientists are broadcasting three times a day on the local PBS station.

"It's really a big experiment," Dwight Coleman, director of the Inner Space Center, said from the boat Thursday. "We're trying out a lot of things. There's some technical challenges, which is expected when you're doing ocean research."

The scientists first tried to get to Black Point, which is closer to shore and in shallower water than U-853, which sits 130 feet below the surface.

"It was very challenging. We thought it was going to be an easier dive," Coleman said. "It wasn't."

He said they were constantly fighting winds and currents to stay in the same place because the ship doesn't have dynamic positioning.

At U-853, they had technical problems with the submersible, then a change in the wind speed and direction made exploring the site unworkable Friday.

Instead, they decided on Friday to try diving a different wreck: the schooner barge Montana, which was carrying coal when it sank just off Block Island in 1907.

Coleman said while most ocean research cruises last several weeks, this one is only five days as part of a state-funded effort to provide local researchers and teachers access to Endeavor.

Scuba divers have been visiting the U-Boat and Black Point for decades. The U-boat is considered a war grave and is the property of Germany.

The team notified the German embassy of the expedition and assured it it wouldn't actually touch the boat, according to Michael Brennan, an archaeological oceanographer at the Ocean Exploration Trust.

There are also hazards nearby, an unexploded depth charge among them.

Coleman said they were inspired by undersea explorer Bob Ballard, a URI scientist who founded the Ocean Exploration Trust and who recently investigated a U-166 off the coast of Mexico with National Geographic and the PBS program NOVA.

For Clinton, an apology at last for email controversy

WASHINGTON (AP) — It took three interviews and five days for Hillary Rodham Clinton to say "I'm sorry."

After resisting apologizing for using a personal email account run on a private server to conduct government business as secretary of state, Clinton shifted course Tuesday.

"That was a mistake," she said of her email practice. "I'm sorry about that. I take responsibility," the front-runner for the Democratic presidential nomination said in an interview with ABC News. She reiterated the apology in a late-night note to voters on Facebook.

Clinton's late-arriving mea culpa came just 24 hours after she insisted in an interview with The Associated Press she didn't need to apologize because "what I did was allowed." That comment came after a sit-down with NBC News on Friday, in which Clinton said only that she was sorry if her actions had caused voters any confusion.

The apology evolution is the latest chapter for an issue that has dogged Clinton's presidential campaign for months. Despite a big fundraising advantage and a slew of endorsements from party leaders, Clinton's standing with voters has slipped — multiple polls show a majority of Americans don't find her honest and trustworthy.

After the shaky summer, Clinton's advisers say she'll more fully address the email saga as the campaign presses into the fall. Top campaign officials have started emailing memos to anxious supporters and convening late-night conference calls with prominent Democrats.

Clinton's string of national interviews around the Labor Day weekend was supposed to be part of that process — a signal that the candidate herself was on board with the idea of being more forthcoming. Or, as Clinton told AP, to take responsibility and "be as transparent as possible."

Yet in that same interview, while offering a more contrite tone when pressed about her decision to work outside the State Department's email system, Clinton also rejected the idea that an apology was necessary.

"What I did was allowed," she said. "It was allowed by the State Department. The State Department has confirmed that."

While Clinton's campaign offered no immediate explanation for why she changed her mind on an apology, the fact that she did suggests an acceptance that it was untenable to continue avoiding saying the words "I'm sorry."

Clinton isn't the first politician take their time reaching that conclusion.

It took 2012 GOP presidential nominee Mitt Romney weeks to disavow his comments suggesting 47 percent of Americans believed they were victims and entitled to government services. President Barack Obama at first

resisted apologizing to Americans who lost their existing health insurance after adoption of the Affordable Care Act despite his promises they would not. He, too, ultimately said he was sorry.

While Clinton's apology may ease the anxiety among some Democrats, it's unlikely to end the political fallout.

Republican National Committee spokeswoman Allison Moore suggested Tuesday that Clinton was only apologizing because "she got caught and is dropping in the polls."

Republican presidential candidates see the issue as a way to discredit Clinton for the general election. And GOP lawmakers on Capitol Hill are using questions about whether Clinton withheld pertinent emails to bolster a congressional investigation into the deadly 2012 terror attacks in Benghazi, Libya.

At the State Department's request, Clinton did turn over 55,000 pages of work-related emails last year. The FBI has also taken possession of the server, which Clinton resisted giving up until last month.

For months, Clinton's advisers insisted the email saga was little more than a Washington obsession, meaningless to voters. After a testy news conference last month, Clinton told reporters, "Nobody talks to me about it other than you guys."

Clinton's defense has largely centered on the argument that she wasn't violating any rules by exclusively using a private email account run via a server located at her New York area home. And, in fact, it wasn't until after she left the State Department that Obama signed changes to the Federal Records Act asserting that government officials could use personal email only if copies were also sent to their official accounts.

Still, the White House and agencies including the State Department had previously issued guidelines to employees making clear that government email should be used for official business.

Clinton's campaign now says it's clear their strategy of arguing technicalities hasn't worked. Early polling shows her losing ground in key early states to Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders, an independent running for the Democratic nomination. The opening has also sparked speculation that Vice President Joe Biden could be a late entry into the Democratic contest.

But it's the surveys showing voters have questions about Clinton's integrity that are the most troubling for her campaign.

In a recent Quinnipiac University poll, 61 percent of voters said they did not consider Clinton honest and trustworthy compared to 34 percent who did ascribe those qualities to her. Similarly, an Associated Press-GfK poll

Clinton's strong debate is general election warning for GOP

WASHINGTON (AP) — Hillary Rodham Clinton's polished performance in the first Democratic debate did more than send a message to her primary rivals. It was a warning to the chaotic Republican field about her likely strength in a general election. Clinton solidified her shift toward more liberal positions on trade, gun control and immigration, but still stayed largely in step with the battleground state voters she'll need in November 2016. She also positioned herself as heir to the coalition of women, Hispanics and black voters that propelled Barack Obama to the White House, and she potentially held off a late challenge from Vice President Joe Biden.

"I'm a progressive," she declared before a television audience of more than 15 million people. "But I'm a progressive who likes to get things done."

The Republicans' raucous first two debates, meanwhile, exposed the party's deep divisions and the pressure on GOP candidates to appease conservative primary voters. That could again leave the eventual nominee scrambling to recalibrate on issues including immigration and women's health in order to win over a national electorate that is more racially and ideologically diverse than primary voters.

It's a familiar conundrum for the party, yet one potentially deepened by the rise of Donald Trump and Ben Carson, candidates whose inflammatory comments seem to only boost their standing in the primary.

Candidates who are favored by more traditional Republicans, like Jeb Bush and Marco Rubio, risk being associated with the rhetoric of their rivals — or never find a way to overtake them.

The GOP contenders scrambled Wednesday to blunt the notion that Clinton has positioned herself as a general election force. Rubio said Clinton was locked in "a race to the left to see who could be the most radically liberal, the most big-government." And Bush cast Clinton as the beneficiary of a Democratic field that sidestepped confrontations over her private email use, a controversy that has dogged her campaign for months.

"In a partisan crowd you could see how that would work out, but I don't think Mrs. Clinton's been forthcoming and I think she has created a problem for herself by not being forthcoming," Bush said Wednesday night while campaigning in New Hampshire. "It is a big deal, and there needs to be some clarity on it."

Added Trump, "I think the Democrats, frankly, I think they are protecting her." Clinton aides insist the former secretary of state isn't taking the Democratic nomination for granted. While her strong debate performance may have hardened her standing as the party's front-runner, she still faces tough competition from Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders, an independent and self-proclaimed democratic socialist.

Yet Clinton left no doubt that she's setting her sights on the GOP field.

"I can take the fight to the Republicans, because we cannot afford a Republican to succeed Barack Obama as president of the United States," she said. She referenced Republicans a dozen times during the two-hour debate, even putting the party alongside the Iranians and National Rifle Association on a list of enemies she was proud to have made.

David Plouffe, an architect of Obama's two campaigns, wrote on Twitter that Clinton looked like a candidate who could win the general election.

"That is a test for GOP," he added, questioning who in the party can attract voters in Ohio, Colorado, Virginia and other general election battlegrounds.

To be sure, Clinton remains a flawed candidate. Her evolving policy positions leave her open to charges that she shifts with the political winds. She's a Washington insider in an election cycle where voters have shown more interest in outsiders. And she continues to grapple with questions about her email practices at the State Department.

Yet Clinton has been handed two gifts on the email issue from her political opponents. She often brings up Republican House Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy's boast about the political damage to her campaign caused by the congressional panel that uncovered her email practices, citing it as evidence of partisanship. And the frustration Sanders expressed in the debate with the amount of attention focused on the emails blunted the prospect that she'll be challenged on the issue from within her own party.

Republicans argue that Clinton still has vulnerabilities that would hurt her in the general election, including shifts to the left on major issues — a version of the problem the GOP contenders could face after focusing on the right for their primary.

"She is now firmly outside the mainstream of the American electorate as part of her calculating efforts to satisfy the liberal base of her party," said Kevin Madden, who advised 2012 GOP nominee Mitt Romney's campaign.

Democratic strategists, however, argue that what were once viewed as liberal policies are increasingly becoming mainstream. Public polling supports that assertion on some issues.

On immigration, a CBS News/New York Times poll last month showed 58 percent of Americans said people living in the U.S. illegally should be allowed to stay and apply for citizenship, a position Clinton supports.

On the contentious issue of gun control, Americans overwhelmingly support expanding background checks for ownership, a proposal Clinton touted in the debate. A Pew Research Center poll from July showed 85 percent — including 87 percent of respondents in gun-owning households — support broader background checks.

Majorities of Americans also support government efforts to combat climate change, and they approve of gay marriage, positions backed by Clinton and other Democratic presidential candidates.

Obama to award Medal of Honor

An Army captain who saved his commander and others while nearly losing his leg during an attack in Afghanistan will receive the Medal of Honor next month from President Obama, the White House said Wednesday. Capt. Florent A. "Flo" Groberg, a naturalized U.S. citizen born in France and a former college-level runner who joined the military in 2008, is the 10th living recipient of the Medal of Honor for actions in Afghanistan. "The Medal of Honor is awarded to members of the armed forces who distinguish themselves conspicuously by gallantry above and beyond the call of duty," the White House said in a statement.

Born May 8, 1983, in Poissy, France, Groberg became a U.S. citizen in 2001, the same year he graduated from Walter Johnson High School in Bethesda, Md. He was a track and cross-country athlete at the University of Maryland.

On Aug. 8, 2012, Groberg led a security team of six troops assigned to protect Col. James Mingus, a brigade commander in Afghanistan.

A suicide bomber set off an explosives-laden vest, knocking Groberg back 5 to 10 feet, breaking his leg and nearly burning the flesh off his foot. Groberg nearly had to have his leg amputated and spent years in rehab.

"Injured during combat, he spent his recovery at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center from August 2012 through May 2015 and was medically retired ... on July 23, 2015," the White House said in announcing the Medal of Honor.

The Medal of Honor ceremony will be held at the White House on Nov. 12.

President Obama to keep troops in Afghanistan beyond 2016

Senior administration officials say President Barack Obama will keep 5,500 U.S. troops in Afghanistan when he leaves office in 2017. Obama's decision casts aside his promise to end the war on his watch and instead ensures he hands the conflict off to his successor. Obama had originally planned to pull out all but a small, embassy-based U.S. military presence by the end of next year, a timeline coinciding with the final weeks of his presidency. But military leaders argued for months that the Afghans needed additional assistance and support from the U.S. in order to beat back a resurgent Taliban and hold onto gains made over the last 14 years. Right now, there are about 9,800 troops in Afghanistan. They will stay through much of 2016. Then the number will drop to about 5,500 and those troops will stay into 2017. The president will leave office in January of 2017.

Rivers crest, I-95 opens as South Carolina turns to recovery

CHAPIN, S.C. (AP) — As the worst of the floodwaters that roared through South Carolina washed out to sea, Gov. Nikki Haley and other officials said Monday it is time to start recovering instead of reacting to the ongoing emergency.

Workers reopened the entire stretch of Interstate 95 southbound Monday, making it the first time in eight days that traffic on the major highway link from Florida to the Northeast didn't take a two-hour detour. Crews hope the northbound lanes would soon follow.

Again on Monday, Haley refused to speculate how much damage in dollars the massive floods that started Oct. 2 have caused and how the state might pay to fix it. But she promised to rebuild.

"This is not going to take us years to get out of this," the governor said.

Haley also thanked volunteers, law enforcement and other workers for their times. Those helping included people like Bob Kuenzli, who usually works as a police officer at a school in Chapin, but while school was cancelled last week, put on a South Carolina State Guard uniform and was assigned to help at a Columbia food bank. Kuenzli, 68, was directing traffic Friday when a food bank volunteer, 72-year-old Charles Kauffman, became irritated that Kuenzli was letting truck traffic move and stopping other cars.

"Out of the corner of my eye, I saw him coming my way," Kuenzli told reporters Monday. "He sped up and threw me. ... I got thrown to the ground."

An angry Richland County Sheriff Leon Lott made sure Kauffman was charged with attempted murder.

Kauffman's lawyer said at his bond appearance Sunday that he has apologized to Kuenzli and is taking medication after suffering two recent strokes. Kauffman's bond was set at \$75,000 and he was put under house arrest after being released from jail. There was no answer Monday at a phone number listed for him, and his attorney did not immediately return a message.

Kuenzli broke a bone in his wrist. But the Air Force veteran from the Vietnam War was ready to go back and volunteer as soon as he could.

"I was just doing my job," he said, his left arm in a sling. "That's all I was doing."

Thousands of other people in South Carolina have also been working long hours, including crews continuing to fix a breach in the canal that supplies Columbia drinking water. Reserve tanks had been refilled and the city hopes to get all 375,000 of its customers off a boil water advisory soon. The South Carolina State Fair in Columbia was on schedule to start Wednesday in Columbia, and Lott said his deputies could handle traffic and security

for the University of South Carolina's football game scheduled for Saturday.

Contractors were also busy putting rock and concrete to shore up the foundations under more than a dozen small bridges over rivers and swampland on a 13-mile stretch of Interstate 95 that had been closed since Oct. 3. The southbound lanes were reopened Monday morning, ending a 168-mile detour through Columbia for people trying to drive the 75-mile stretch between Interstate 20 and Interstate 26.

The repairs were permanent and the bridges shouldn't have to close again, South Carolina Department of Transportation Secretary Christy Hall said.

Officials hoped to reopen the northbound lanes of I-95 by Tuesday morning.

And as officials announced every rain-swollen river in the state had finally reached their crests and were falling, the governor promised to send teams of insurance adjusters, mental health professionals and unemployment specialists to every hard-hit community so those people wouldn't have to drive out of town to get help.

"We are going from a massive response situation to a massive recovery," Haley said.

Hundreds march for Mississippi flag change

JACKSON, Miss. — Sharon Brown, who proposed the initiative that seeks to remove the Confederate battle emblem from the state flag, said she's doing it for her mother.

"Mother is the reason why this is taking place; she indicated that, 'you and your sister better stand up,' so we're standing up for a change," Brown said as supporters gathered for Sunday's One Flag for All rally near the Jackson State University campus. But more than striking the Confederate emblem, Brown said, it's about creating a flag that can unify Mississippians.

"(The current flag) doesn't represent the unity that's here in Mississippi," she said. "We need one flag that represents all of the people here, not just a minority. It hurts the state economically and socially."

The rally also drew some big names, including rapper David Banner, civil rights activist Myrlie Evers and South Carolina Rep. Jenny Horne. Horne helped facilitate the removal of the flag at the South Carolina state capitol following a mass shooting at a church in Charleston this summer. Horne had been friends with Sen. Clementa Pinckney, one of the victims of the shooting.

"There's a lot Mississippi can learn from what we did in South Carolina, so they don't have to have a tragedy to make them do the right thing," she said. "It's unfortunate that it took such a senseless act of violence. You shouldn't need that in Mississippi. It's really sad that it's 2015, and it took a tragedy to make us do this."

Banner spoke to the crowd before the march to the Capitol started.

"My family lived and died on this land, so it means a little bit more to me than just a flag,"

he said. "It's time to move Mississippi forward."

A flag, he added, is supposed to be about a conglomerate effort, about everybody. "That flag is not about me," he said.

About 300 people walked from their meeting place at the corner of J.W. Lynch and Rose streets to the State Capitol.

Munisha Lott found out about the rally on Saturday night from friend Jeremy Lewis. The two marched together with their signs. "We think it's important to promote unity. We know there will be divisions, no doubt about that, but we can put effort and energy into the unification part," Lewis said. "A flag represents the people, so we think it's very important."

Banner said a new flag is also about investing in Mississippi's children.

"We're going to have to draw a line. Are you Confederate, which stands for slavery, or are you Southern? I'm Southern until the day I die," he said. "For me it's more about these kids, every time those kids look up at that flag, it's something that makes them duck their heads."

Horne said healing has begun in South Carolina in the wake of the Charleston tragedy and the grounding of the flag. "Since South Carolina removed the flag, we're healing as a state," she said. "We're having discussions about what the flag meant to so many African-Americans in South Carolina, and having a reconciliation of our very different histories and being very honest about race relations in the new South."

Mini-satellites getting to be a big deal at Kennedy Space Center

CAPE CANAVERAL — Events this month are spotlighting Kennedy Space Center's role promoting launches for the fast-growing field of mini-satellites known as CubeSats.

Last Thursday in California, KSC managers helped a handful of CubeSats hitch rides on an Atlas V rocket whose main purpose was to loft a secret intelligence mission for the Department of Defense.

On Wednesday, representatives from KSC's Launch Services Program will discuss roughly \$17 million in awards they have made to several companies developing small rockets that could offer CubeSats more frequent, inexpensive and timely launches. Some of those small rockets could launch from KSC, historically home to the world's largest launch vehicles like the Saturn V and space shuttle, and in the future to NASA's 322-foot Space Launch System.

"I'm hopeful that we'll see launches big and small," said Scott Higginbotham of KSC, who oversaw last week's launch of five NASA-sponsored CubeSats (alongside eight more from the National Reconnaissance Office) under a program called ElaNA, for Educational Launch of Nanosatellites. Five years ago, Higginbotham was preparing a large International Space Station cargo module to fit in shuttle Discovery's school bus-sized payload bay on that orbiter's final mission.
