EXEGETICAL Project, MATT 20:20-28
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Bible Passage: Matt 20:20-28

Step 1: What was the ORIGINAL Situation.

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Although this book is technically anonymous, this first book of the NEW TESTAMENT was unanimously Attributed to MATTHEW LEVI by the EARLY church fathers. It was written in approximately 60 A.D. while the APOSTLE PAUL was imprisoned for the cause of Christ.

MATTHEW is addressing God is through MATTHEW (2 Tim 3:16-17), a diverse church "transcending ethnic, economic, and religious barriers"^① to find oneness in Christ. In this GOSPEL God is bridging the Old TESTAMENT AND THE NEW. It tells the Jewish Nation and the world Jesus is the true MESSIAH, immortal, God Incarnate come to His own.

The Author is said to be MATTHEW the tax collector of Matt. 10:3. We can deduce from this that "when Matthew was called he was wealthy and despised."^② A MESSAGE in and of itself to His Church! The man God

used to give us this Gospel completely scraped his life and gave up ALL to answer the call.

The Gospel is a MANUAL in discipleship. Its the first book of the New Testament for a reason! In the passage under consideration we have Jesus on His way to the cross. He is confronted by the Mother of Zebdees two sons, James and John.

She is of the faith. She is following an old custom: A mother seeking favor from a leader for her sons. She is also seeking "kinship admittance, as Jesus is the half cousin of James & John."^③ She seeks the places of first and second of honor for her sons.

Christ counters her request with the reminder He is about to give His life - as "drink this cup" references in verse 22. He asked James and John if they were able to "drink the cup". They replied "we can". He informs them they will, which we know they did. (SEE foxes book of martyrs). The others were upset by this request for purely selfish reasons. Thus our Lord,

faced with the cross, is freed by the fallen man we'd come to redeem.

He (Jesus) uses the current rulers as an example of what a practicing Christian Leader is not— a high-minded, authoritarian. This informs us what a PCL is: A servant to all. (v26-27).

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Step 2: What are the Main Biblical Principles?

Principle 1: Promotion is from God (v 23)

Principle 2: Serving others makes one great in the eyes of God, not holding over them. (v26-27)

Principle 3: We're to follow the example of Jesus and lay down our life for others. (v28)

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Step 3: Now do these principles apply today?

*1) I believe this is foundational principle for the Practicing Christian Leader (PCL) to understand. When we've come to under-

Stand this, in faith we can serve under others, while leaving the issue of promotion/demotion to God. We can just be about His business.

#2) WE must understand we lead so others can be built up and exalted, not we ourselves. WE are not to demand obedience, but to encourage Holiness. (Col. 3:12; Tit 1:8; 1 Pet 1:15-16). WE do this by serving in humility, considering the NEEDS of others far above our own. (Phil 2:4; Jude 23; Eph 4:28).

#3) By looking to the Author + Finisher of our faith (Heb 12:2) WE have a Perfect Model to follow. (2 Pet 2:5). WE can forget self (Matt 16:24) and follow Him (Matt 16:24). WE are free to lay down our life for the good of others (1 Jn 3:16).

PERSONAL OBSERVATIONS - (MATTHEW 20:20-28)

MATTHEW - LEVI LEFT ALL HE KNEW; WEALTH AND POSITION, A FAITHFUL MAN OF GOD GOD USED TO PON THIS GOSPEL. (MATTHEW 9:9) (LUKE 19:1-10). AS A GALILEAN JEWISH CHRISTIAN HE COULD INTERPRET AND UNDERSTAND JESUS AND HIS WORK FROM THE O.T. PERSPECTIVE.

EARLY CHURCH FATHER IRENAEUS (AD 175) INDICATES PAUL AND PETER WERE ALIVE AT ITS WRITING.^④ SO WE CAN SURMISE IT WAS IN THE LATE 50'S TO EARLY 60'S IT WAS WRITTEN. ORIGINALLY WRITTEN TO THE EARLY CHURCH IN SYRIA ANTIOCH (ACTS 11:19-26; 13:1-3) BUT DISTRIBUTED BOTH WIDELY AND QUICKLY.

A REAL KEY TO UNDERSTANDING OUR PASSAGE IS RECOGNIZING THE CULTURAL CUSTOM OF A MOTHER SEEKING ALONEHOOD FOR HER SONS. (1 KING 1:15-21) (2 SAM 14:2-20). ALSO SIGNIFICANT HERE IS THE KINSHIP ALONEHOOD IN PLINY.^⑤

THE "RIGHT HAND" OF VERSE 21 DENOTES THE PLACE OF HIGHEST HONOR IN REGARD TO A KING (JUDG 2:17). THE "LEFT SIDE" CAN NOW BE VIEWED AS PLACE OF SECOND HONOR, IN

regards to the King. Look at King Saul-Jonathan his son on his Right, Abner, the commander of his army on the Right. (Judges ch. 2)

"The cup" referred to by Our Lord in VERSE 22-23 of our passage is figurative language referring to a Divinely Appointed destiny. When James and John in VERSE 22, proclaim they can drink "the cup" Jesus assures them they will. I tend to think of them saying - oh oh!

In VERSE 25 we see our Lord clearly referencing the Roman overlords to contrast with God's way, but also the current worldview. As the ancient GREEK Sophists declared; "How can a man be happy if he must serve someone" ⁽⁷⁾

further Application of Mtn Principles

1) My Life: I am free - once I've applied this principle - to be about the Father's business, leaving Human Resource issues to God. I've been in so much pain! I just think the most loving thing I can do is to fire him as my leader, hoping he'll come around to accepting responsibility for his actions,

report, work a program, and start
fresh. Grace upon Grace, yet recognizable.
It's so hard!

"Out there": As I go about answering
the call of Matt. 28:18-20 I can teach
others to trust His will in Leadership.

#2) My Life: I need to always remember
I am to serve not be Lord & Master.
I will seek the good of others above
my own

In Prison: I will serve as a servant
slave - as outlined in Word study - those
whom God has called to be members of
the Body of Christ. My life is not
my own, I've been bought with a great
price. (Icon 7:23)

Out there: As I go about making a
living I will gently lead those placed
under me with the goal of their advan-
tage. Lead others to their ultimate bene-
fit, not ~~mine~~ my own.
