## WHISPERS S.O.U.L. Clinic Interview Questions

Let's begin this interview with: name/age/race/county-year of conviction/Public Defender - plea - appeal comments. Was the sentence fair - why? Is prison what you expected - as the media projects? How do you make it psychologically acceptable to deal with your crimes - and corresponding time? How many years have you been in prison now? What would you like to tell tax payers about some of the things you've seen in prison, which they'd never imagined could happen to their sons/husbands/fathers? What would you like to say about your observations/experience with prison guards/counselors/administration? What is your disciplinary history? What is your experience/observations with the Psych. Dept.? With the Religious Dept.? With any of the "Rehab. Groups"? Are you any different from this prison experience? What do you think has changed the most about you? How'd that change come about? Do you consider yourself a criminal? What do you think makes someone a criminal? What's your greatest strength? Your greatest weakness? What would you like to accomplish? Have you maintained relationships outside prison? Visits/letters/phone calls? Do you feel you have been forgiven for your actions? Have you made amends to the people you have harmed? If you have not had the opportunity to make personal amends with your victim or their family, what would you say if given the chance?

This LAZARUS PROJECT is sort of a Livingness Repair shop, so pay what's due; spill yer guts and let's look at YOU.

MSOE: This she-male body is 30 years old now and I'm from So. Central California. Prison isn't exactly what I expected, because I didn't know so many people were gay. For example, I never thought there was gay Bloods, gay Crips, gay Southsiders and gay Northerners. On T.V., they make it seem like people will bully you for some ass or for some sucky sucky. I've been in prison for seven years now and the majority of guys in prison absolutely love and adore the gays.

As for my experience with prison guards, I find it kinda crazy 'cause the female staff will hurry to charge you with sexual harassment if you flirt with them. BUT if you are a Transgender inmate, you can flirt with the male staff and they will never charge you with sexual harassment. Kinda crazy, huh?

I think there is a lot of corruption going on in prison and a lot of crooked stuff. Seems like there's always a way to bury inmates in trouble and not enough ways for inmates to progress in Rehabilitation.

Okay now, I'm out.

WHISPERS: Yea you are. Is this all you've got?

MSOE: That's it, that's all. Thank you for the time—I wasted in line!

I guess that I expected something more from you Whispy. Thank you anyway.

WHISPERS: You see, that's the thing-doll! This LAZARUS PROJECT isn't about ME. It's all about YOU—and you can only take away from this as much as you put into it. You dare approach the Tree, and you gave what you felt comfortable giving—so thank you for that.
