Last night during an intense Political dialog with a Local Comrade who is a very committed activist here in Indiana. He informed me, that Imam Jamil Abdullah Al-Amin Prisoner of War, formerly known to the Revolutionary Community inside's United States borders as H. Rap Brown. Has been diagnosed as having developed Cancer.

Like Mumia Abu Jamal, he too is a long standing Servant of his People now he is sick in need of medical help. The United States industrial Prison Complex is systemically and institutionally ~~one~~ engaged in intentional medical neglect and a mountain of human and civil rights violation. The Plan here is absolutely clear, the U.S. Government with help from Criminal Court Judges and Prosecutors. Have been sending our Comrades to these Prison Plantations on manufactured Charges.

I am only one man with 30 years inside these Plantations myself with limited resources and outside support. Stand up and demand that our Elder Statesman be given the immediate medical treatment and attention he needs. We have to engage in a massive/collective support movement in order display the Power of the People.
