



Brady had plenty of help from Dion Lewis, Rex Burkhead and James White, which was particularly meaningful with Mike Gillislee on the sideline in street clothes as a healthy scratch. Lewis, who has led the Pats in rushing yards in five consecutive games, also broke open the contest in the first quarter with a 103-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and he became the first player since the 1970 merger to record a second game with a kickoff return and a rushing touchdowns

Newton, Panthers pile up points, yards in

CHARLOTTE (AP) - Cam Newton was tired of the Carolina Panthers' defense getting all of the glory. Newton took it as a challenge when the defense vaulted to the league's No. 1 ranking last week, saying it was time for the offense to strive to match them. Newton did his part on Monday night, throwing for 254 yards and four touchdowns and running for 95 more as the Panthers piled up a franchise-record 548 yards in a 45-21 rout of the Miami Dolphins. "It's nice to see them have this type of breakout game," Panthers coach Ron Rivera said of the offense, which had 30 first downs and converted 11 of 14 third downs. Said Newton: "I still feel like we are scratching the surface of our potential in this offense. We have to trust in our ability to execute our coach's plan."

NFL roundup: Roethlisberger throws 4 TDs as Steelers drill Titans 40-17

PITTSBURGH — Ben Roethlisberger threw for 299 yards and four touchdowns, three to Antonio Brown, and the Pittsburgh Steelers pulled away from the Tennessee Titans in a 40-17 victory on Thursday night. Brown caught 10 passes for 144 yards and the three scores, including an acrobatic grab in the back of the end zone in which he pinned the ball to his helmet before bringing it in to put Pittsburgh up 20 in the fourth

Marcus Mariota ran for a touchdown and threw for another but also was picked off four times as the Titans (6-4) saw their four-game winning streak come to a crashing halt. Mariota finished 22 of 33 for 306 yards but was under pressure much of the night, absorbing five sacks and rarely finding room to move outside the pocket.

In a game that matched the two winningest Division I programs, the Jayhawks (2-0) prevailed after the teams spent most of the second half trading baskets and leads. Malik Newman had a key rebound in the closing seconds and hit two foul shots to help

Kansas knock off the Wildcats (2-1). No. 5 Villanova 113, Nicholls 77

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Mikal Bridges set career highs with 23 points and four blocks, and Villanova swatted away a school-record 13 shots.

Donte DiVincenzo added 20 points, Jalen Brunson had 17 and the Wildcats (2-0) had six players in double figures while shooting 58 percent from the field in their second straight blowout of an inferior opponent.

No. 17 Gonzaga 106, Howard 69 SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — Freshman Zach Norvell Jr. scored 18 points and freshman Corey Kispert added 13 for Gonzaga. Johnathan Williams and Rui Hachimura each scored 12 points for Gonzaga (2-0). R.J. Cole scored 16 points for Howard (0-3), which is playing 13 of its 16 non-conference games on the road.

Howard shot just 30 percent in the game and was outrebounded 51-33. Gonzaga made 14 3-pointers.

No. 19 Purdue 86, Marquette 71 MILWAUKEE (AP) — Seven-foot-2 center

Isaac Haas scored 22 points, and Purdue capitalized on its size advantage in the paint. Carsen Edwards had 15 points, while Vince Edwards added 10 points and eight rebounds for the Boilermakers (3-0). They held distinct edges in rebounding (34-23) and points in the paint (30-12).

Andrew Rowsey scored 25 points, while Markus Howard added 24 for Marquette (1- before fouling out with 5:20 left. Howard, the nation's leader in 3-point shooting last season (54.7 percent), went 4 of 8 from behind the arc against Purdue.

Junior KeVaughn Allen was Florida's top scorer with 18 points. The balanced scoring helped the Gators (2-0) dismantle the Ospreys (0-4) from the beginning, with Keith Stone, Gorjok Gak and Allen contributing some emphatic dunks along the way. Stone was next on Florida's balanced scoring sheet with 14 points. He was followed by Jalen Hudson with 13 and Egor Koulechov, Deaundrae Ballard and Gak with 12 each. Trip Day's 14 points led the Ospreys.

No. 11 Miami 90, Florida A&M 59 CORAL GABLES, Fla. - Highly touted Miami freshman Lonnie Walker IV limped off the court in the first half after twisting his left ankle, but coach Jim Larranaga said he didn't think the injury was serious. Larranaga said he didn't expect Walker to miss any games. The Hurricanes are scheduled to play La Salle next Wednesday in Walker's hometown of Reading, Pennsylvania.

"We won't know for a couple of days, but I think he's fine," Larranaga said. "I'm sure he'll be ready."

Walker, who underwent surgery in July for torn meniscus in his right knee, stepped on another player's foot after missing a 3-point attempt. The freshman guard collapsed to the court and immediately was assisted to the locker room.

Bruce Brown had 15 points, eight rebounds and four assists for the Hurricanes, who shot 59 percent and had six players in double figures.

College Football Playoff rankings: Alabama rises to No. 1, then Clemson, Miami, Oklahoma

The shakeup in college football on Saturday has shaken up the College Football Playoff rankings.

The third edition of the rankings, released Tuesday night by the College Football Playoff selection committee, not only delivered a new No. 1 but also added two new teams.

Georgia's blowout loss (40-17 to Auburn) knocked the Bulldogs out and opened the door for Alabama to move to first, followed by Clemson, Miami (Fla.) and Oklahoma. Georgia had been No. 1 in the previous two rankings.

The 9-0 Hurricanes, coming off a 41-8 thrashing of Notre Dame, climbed from seventh to third, and Oklahoma moved into the top four after spending the previous two weeks at No. 5. The Irish fell from No. 3 to No. 8.

Wisconsin (10-0), rose to No. 5. The Badgers, whose schedule has been the object of derision, can get a boost this week if they can beat Michigan.

"Tremendous debate between No. 2 Clemson and No. 3 Miami. Both play tremendous defense," said CFP selection committee chair Kirby Hocutt, who noted the Tigers' win against Auburn as a deciding factor. Clemson and Miami both have clinched spots in the ACC title game.

"Lots of debate on teams one through five and where they went," Hocutt said. "We talked a lot about the Sooners. Three wins against teams ranked in the top 13 of this week's rankings. It's the loss to Iowa State that did not allow Oklahoma to rank higher this week."

Auburn, Hocutt said, was the best two-loss team in the running.

NFL Roundup

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. — Mark Ingram scored a career-best three touchdowns and the New Orleans won their seventh straight game by plowing through a porous Buffalo Bills defense on Sunday, 45-10.

Alvin Kamara also had a 3-yard touchdown rushing as the Saints blew the game open by scoring five times on their first six possessions, not including a one-play series to close the first half. Ingram finished with 131 yards rushing. He scored twice from 3 yards and again on a 1-yard plunge.

Their defense was just as dominating in limiting Buffalo (5-4) to 198 yards and 10 first downs. And five of those first downs

came on Buffalo's meaningless final drive that ended with backup quarterback Nathan Peterman hitting Nick O'Leary on a 7-yard touchdown pass.

New Orleans set a franchise record by scoring six touchdowns rushing, and it marked the most allowed by Buffalo in team history.

Steelers 20, Colts 17

INDIANAPOLIS — Ben Roethlisberger's 32-yard completion to Antonio Brown with 35 seconds set up a 33-yard field goal from Chris Boswell as time expired.

The Steelers (7-2) have won four straight overall and five in a row in the series.

But it sure wasn't easy as the Colts (3-7) held Roethlisberger, Brown and Le'Veon Bell in check. Pittsburgh needed two second-half TD passes from Roethlisberger to fight its way out of a 17-3 third-quarter deficit. And Roethlisberger reverted to his traditional form on the Steelers' final possession.

49ers 31, Giants 21

SANTA CLARA, Calif. — C.J. Beathard threw for 288 yards and two touchdowns and ran for a third score to lead the 49ers to their first win of the season.

Beathard connected on an 83-yard TD to Marquise Goodwin and a 47-yarder to Garrett Celek in the second quarter as the 49ers (1-9) took advantage of another listless effort by the Giants (1-8) to win for the first time under coach Kyle Shanahan.

Falcons 27, Cowboys 7

ATLANTA — Adrian Clayborn set an Atlanta record with six sacks, Matt Ryan threw a pair of short touchdown passes and the Falcons romped to victory over Dallas. Ryan hooked up with Justin Hardy on a 3-yard pass for Atlanta's first offensive touchdown in the third quarter this season. Early in the fourth, Ryan put the game away for the Falcons (5-4) by tossing one to Austin Hooper for a 1-yard score.

Rams 33, Texans 7

LOS ANGELES — Robert Woods caught two of Jared Goff's three touchdown passes during a dominant third quarter, and surging Los Angeles returned after a month away from home for their fourth straight victory. After struggling to a 9-7 lead during a quiet first half for the NFL's highest-scoring team, the Rams (7-2) ran away with a series of big throws by Goff, who

Vikings 38, Redskins 30

LANDOVER, Md. — Case Keenum threw touchdowns to four different receivers to build a big lead, and the NFC North-leading Vikings won their fifth in a row.

With Teddy Bridgewater active for the first time since January 2016 after a devastating knee injury, Keenum was 21 of 29 for 304 yards and TD passes to Stefon Diggs, Adam Thielen, David Morgan and Jarius Wright. He was picked off on consecutive throws by D.J. Swearinger. Thielen had eight catches for a season-high 166 yards.

Packers 23, Bears 16

CHICAGO — Brett Hundley threw for 212 yards and a touchdown, Nick Perry had three

sacks and the Packers snapped a three-game losing streak.

Hundley, starting his third game for an injured Aaron Rodgers, threw a 17-yard touchdown to Davante Adams to make it 23-13 with 5:29 to play, and the Packers (5-4) hung on to beat the Bears (3-6) for the eighth time in nine games.

It was the first victory for a Packers QB not named Rodgers or Brett Favre since 1989. Chicago's Mitchell Trubisky threw for a career-high 297 yards.

Titans 24, Bengals 20

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Marcus Mariota tossed a 7-yard touchdown pass to DeMarco Murray with 36 seconds left, and the Titans rallied for their fourth consecutive victory. It's the longest winning streak for the Titans (6-3) since taking five straight in 2009, and it's their best start to a season since 2008 when the Titans last reached the playoffs as the AFC's No. 1 seed.

Jaguars 20, Chargers 17 (OT)

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Josh Lambo kicked a 30-yard field goal with 3:12 remaining in overtime, lifting the Jaguars in a wild game.

The game ended up in overtime after a wacky final two minutes of regulation that included a fumble, two interceptions, a taunting penalty and a costly flag for roughing the passer. At times, it looked as if neither team wanted to win.

Lions 38, Browns 24

ALLEN PARK, Mich. — Matthew Stafford lofted a 29-yard, tiebreaking touchdown to Eric Ebron early in the fourth quarter and the Lions went on to beat the winless Browns. The Lions (5-4) rallied from first- and second-half deficits to earn consecutive victories for the first time since winning the first two games this season. The Browns, who fell to 0-9 on the season, led 10-0 early in the game for their first double-digit lead of the season, and were up 24-17 in the third after Deshone Kizer led two consecutive touchdown drives.

Buccaneers 15, Jets 10

TAMPA, Fla. — Ryan Fitzpatrick led two long scoring drives and Tampa Bay limited the Jets to less than 200 yards of offense until late in the fourth quarter to snap a five-game losing streak.

With Fitzpatrick filling in for injured quarterback Jameis Winston, the Buccaneers (3-6) used three field goals to build a 9-3 lead on the Jets (4-6). Charles Sims put the game out of reach with a 6-yard touchdown reception with just over six minutes remaining.

Woman charged with stealing nuns' renowned cheesecakes

WHITE CREEK, N.Y. (AP) — New York State Police say they've charged a 48-yearold woman with stealing \$250 worth of baked goods from an order of nuns known for their cheesecake.

Troopers say the theft occurred last month at the Nuns of New Skete (SKEET) monastery in the rural town of White Creek, on the Vermont border, 35 miles (56 kilometers) northeast of Albany.

The nuns sell their cheesecakes and pastries on the honor system at the monastery's unstaffed gift shop. Police say surveillance cameras caught two women taking merchandise without leaving money in the drop box.

Troopers say surveillance photos released earlier this week and social media postings of the images led to the arrest of a woman from North Arlington, Vermont. The other woman was identified as her 21-year-old daughter, who wasn't charged.

A photo of a woman giving President Donald Trump's motorcade the middle finger went viral more than a week ago.

People on social media hailed Juli Briskman as a "she-ro." A hashtag, #her2020, arose. However, her employer, government contractor Akima LLC, was not pleased with the middle-fingered salute.

They fired the 50-year-old mother of two over it.

A White House photographer traveling with the president snapped a picture of Trump's motorcade passing a bicyclist when he left a golf course in Sterling, Va., last week. "He was passing by and my blood just started to boil," Briskman told HuffPost. "I'm thinking DACA recipients are getting kicked out. He pulled ads for open enrollment in Obamacare. Only one-third of Puerto Rico has power. I'm thinking, he's at the damn golf course again."

The Democrat followed her instincts while she was on her usual biking path.
"I flipped off the motorcade a number of times," Briskman told *HuffPost*.
The photo immediately went viral.

Car worth more than \$100,000 burns on U.S. Highway 129 known as 'The Dragon' KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — A sports car valued at more than \$100,000 burned Sunday afternoon on a notorious stretch of U.S. Highway 129 aptly known as "The Dragon." The car fire was reported at 4:45 p.m. at mile marker 7 in Blount County, Tenn. Firefighters arrived 36 minutes later to find the car in the road, engulfed in flames, said Blount County Fire Department Captain Kermit Easterling.

Easterling identified the car as a 2017 Nissan GT-R, which has a sticker price of \$109,900. The man identified as the owner, Sharif Abdelbaset, wrote in a Facebook post that the car was a "Nismo" - a performance-tuned version of the GT-R that costs about \$65,000 more.

"This wasn't a wreck," Abdelbaset wrote just before 7 p.m. Sunday. "We think it was an accumulation of leaves that started the fire up in the mountain. Thankfully nobody was injured and nothing important was lost." In an earlier post on Sunday, Abdelbaset wrote that he was headed to TougeFest, described in a Facebook event page as an annual weekend event "filled with comradery and spirited driving" at the Fontana Village Resort in North Carolina.

Abdelbaset's Facebook profile says he is the president of Forged Performance, based in Marietta, Ga. The company's website says it is "one of the leading GT-R and late model import automobile specialty shops in the USA."

Florida woman on horseback charged with DUI

A 53-year-old woman was arrested on charges of DUI on a horse and animal neglect after deputies in Florida say she rode the

horse named Bo Duke in the roadway, putting drivers and the horse at risk. Donna Byrne was arrested just before 2 p.m. Thursday in Lakeland east of Tampa. Sheriff Grady Judd said she rode her horse drunk all the way from Polk City to Lakeland, a 10

"She ultimately was going to the county jail," Judd said. "She just didn't realize it when she saddled up her horse and rode into town." According to the affidavit, deputies responded to the area after a report from a witness saying the woman appeared confused and possibly in danger. Deputies say she had a strong odor of alcohol. She failed the sobriety test and was arrested for DUI. Byrne provided breath samples that registered a blood alcohol levels of .161, twice the legal limit of .08 in Florida. State law defines a "vehicle" broadly: Pretty much anything you can ride in or on on a highway...

Byrne is charged with animal neglect, and failing to provide proper protection for the horse because she rode the animal in the roadway.

The horse was taken by deputies to the Polk County Sheriff's Animal Control livestock facility.

Man runs away from traffic stop, gets hit by car, police say

MADISON, Wis. - A 28-year-old Madison man was struck by a vehicle Saturday night as he ran away from a traffic stop, Dane County officials said.

A Dane County sheriff's deputy conducted a traffic stop around 9:30 p.m. on Highway 51 at Commercial Avenue, according to a release.

The deputy made contact with the driver, who then got out of the vehicle and ran from the deputy, officials said.

Before the deputy could run after the man, the 28-year-old was struck by another vehicle going northbound on Highway 51, according to the release. He was taken to UW Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

The science behind brain farts: Why less sleep creates mental lapses

A sleepless night slows down our brain cells, creating mental lapses as we space out at work, at school and behind the wheel. That's according to a study led by a UCLA neurosurgeon that found sleep deprivation breaks up brain cells' ability to talk with one another, causing mental and visual lags that impair "how we perceive and react to the world around us," said Itzhak Fried, its director.

Such brain farts can prove more consequential than lost keys: The findings show how little society cares about sleep deprivation, he said.

Going without sleep can make you effectively drunk. But, as Fried said in a university release, "no legal or medical standards exist for identifying overtired drivers on the road the same way we target drunk drivers."

Sleep deprivation has also been linked to obesity, depression and heart attacks, among other risks.

For the study, published Tuesday in Nature Medicine, scientists analyzed 12 participants with electrodes implanted into their brains. Participants tried to to sort a range of images as quickly as possible. As they did so, their brains fired a total of nearly 1,500 cells.

As participants endured a night without sleep, their performance (and brain cells) slowed. Neurons fired more weakly, Fried said, and communications lagged. More research is needed to determine exactly why brain cells glitch without sleep, according to the university.

Scientists saw one more phenomenon alongside hampered brain activity: slower sleep-like brain waves, which Fried said suggest parts of a tired brain may rest even as other parts remain active.

Veterans Day 2017: Why is Veterans Day on Nov. 11? Holiday history, military facts and more

Veterans Day is a time to thank all those who have served in the U.S. armed forces. The holiday traces its origins back to the end of World War I. On Nov. 11, 1918, an armistice between the U.S.-led Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Though the war wasn't officially over until the Treaty of Versailles was signed seven months later, the Nov. 11 is recognized as the end of the "war to end all wars," according to the Veterans Administration.

In November 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Nov. 11 as the first commemoration of what was then known as Armistice Day, saying "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations ... " The day was originally celebrated with parades and a brief suspension of business at 11 a.m. Congress officially recognized the day with a resolution passed on June 4,

It was then that the day - Nov. 11 - was officially recognized as the date of the

Almost 30 years later, after U.S. soldiers had served in World War II and Korea, Congress voted to change the name from Armistice Day to Veterans Day in honor of all those who served in the military. Veterans Day remained on Nov. 11, no matter which day that fell, until the passage of the Uniform Holiday Bill. The 1968 law was intended to ensure three-day weekends for federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day,

Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. Veterans Day was first moved off its Nov. 11 day to a Monday on Oct. 25, 1971. The change was not well received. "It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens," the VA said. On Sept. 20, 1975, President Gerald Ford signed a bill returning Veterans Day to its original date of Nov. 11. It continues to be observed on Nov. 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. While veterans are the focus of today's celebration, the VA has designated November as National Veterans and Military Families Month, a time to celebrate both past and present military personnel.

Veterans Day facts

Number of veterans in the U.S. - There are 18.5 million military veterans in the U.S. according to the Census Bureau. 9.2 million of those are age 65 and older.

More on when they served - There are 6.7 million Vietnam Era veterans in 2016.

There were 7.1 million who served during the Gulf War (representing service from August 1990 to present); 768,263 who served in World War II; 1.6 million who served in the Korean War; and 2.4 million who served in peacetime only.

The number of living veterans in 2016 who served during three wartime periods:

- 65,562 served during the Vietnam Era and both periods of the Gulf War (August 1990 to August 2001 and September 2001 or later).
- 25,703 served during World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam Era.

The number of living veterans in 2016 who served during two wartime periods:

- 1,150,328 served during both periods of the Gulf War (August 1990 to August 2001 and September 2001 or later).
- 285,649 served during the Gulf War (August 1990 to August 2001) and the Vietnam Era.
- 140,101 served during the Korean
 War and the Vietnam Era.
- 56,105 served during World War II and the Korean War.

Memorial Day: Veterans Day is a federal holiday that is celebrated on Nov. 11 each year. It's often confused with Memorial Day, which is set aside to honor those who died serving their country. Veterans Day is for all those who have served in the armed forces.

Celebrations in other countries: Britain, France, Australia and Canada commemorate those who served in World Wars I and II on or near Nov. 11th: Canada has Remembrance Day and Britain has Remembrance Sunday (the second Sunday of November). In Europe, Britain and the Commonwealth countries it is common to observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. every Nov. 11.





FORT BRAGG, N.C. — Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl, who walked off his Army base in Afghanistan in 2009 and was held captive by the Taliban for five years, received no prison time for desertion or endangering troops, but was ordered by a military judge on Friday to be dishonorably discharged from the Army. The sentencing took only minutes in a case where prosecutors had sought 14 years in a

military prison. The military judge, Col. Jeffery R. Nance of the Army, also reduced Sergeant Bergdahl's rank to private and required him to forfeit \$1,000 a month of his pay for 10 months. President Trump, who has labeled Sergeant Bergdahl a "dirty rotten traitor," called Friday's sentence "a complete and total disgrace to our Country and to our Military." Colonel Nance did not explain his reasoning for the sentence, which will be reviewed by Gen. Robert B. Abrams, who convened the court-martial and has the power to lessen the punishment. If the final sentence still includes a punitive discharge, it will automatically be reviewed by the United States Army Court of Criminal Appeals. The case has been dogged by politics and controversy from beginning to end. After trading Sergeant Bergdahl for five Taliban detainees in 2014, the Obama administration embraced him, with the national security adviser, Susan E. Rice, even saying he had served with "honor and distinction." But the prisoner swap, and the sergeant's portrayal, angered many Republicans. Senator John McCain even threatened to hold a hearing if the sergeant was not punished.

Last year, Mr. Trump made denunciations of Sergeant Bergdahl a staple of his campaign speeches, repeatedly calling for him to be

Ironically, Mr. Trump's comments may have contributed to the decision not to sentence him to prison. After Mr. Trump seemed last month to endorse his harsh criticism from the campaign trail, Colonel Nance ruled that he would consider the comments as mitigating evidence at sentencing.

With the sentence still facing review by General Abrams and military appellate judges, Mr. Trump's post-verdict comments on Twitter seemed to bolster efforts by the defense to have the sentence thrown out on appeal, some military law experts said, on the grounds that the president had unlawfully influenced the case.

"Trump just exponentially increased Bergdahl's chances of getting this whole case tossed on appeal," said Rachel

VanLandingham, a professor at Southwestern Law School in Los Angeles and a retired Air Force lawyer.

The tweet could be interpreted as an effort to pressure officers who still have some control over the sergeant's fate not to reconsider his sentence, military law experts said.

Sergeant Bergdahl's chief defense lawyer, Eugene R. Fidell, called the sentence "a tremendous relief' and said his client was still absorbing it.

Standing outside the military courthouse here, Mr. Fidell, who teaches military justice at Yale Law School, then took sharp aim at the commander in chief.

"President Trump's unprincipled effort to stoke a lynch-mob atmosphere while seeking our nation's highest office has cast a dark cloud over the case," he said. "Every American should be offended by his assault on the fair administration of justice and disdain for basic constitutional rights." Even though the defense had told the judge that a dishonorable discharge would be appropriate, Mr. Fidell said he hoped that it would be overturned. He noted that such a discharge would deprive his client of health care services and other "benefits he badly needs" from the Department of Veterans

Sergeant Bergdahl is expected to return to an Army base as the case winds through the appeals process.

Sergeant Bergdahl was 23 and a private first class when he left his base in eastern Afghanistan in June 2009. Army investigators would later characterize his departure as a delusional effort to hike to a larger base and cause enough of a stir that he would get an audience with a senior officer to report what he felt were problems in his unit. But the soldier, who is now 31, was captured by the Taliban within hours and spent five years as a prisoner, his treatment worsening after every attempt to escape. He was beaten with copper cables and held in isolation in a metal cage less than seven feet square. He suffered dysentery for most of his captivity, and cleaned feces off his hands with his own urine so that he could eat enough bread to survive.

The military searched for him, and several troops were wounded during those missions. One of them, Sgt. First Class Mark Allen, was shot through the head and lost the ability to walk, talk or take care of himself, and now has minimal consciousness. His wife, Shannon, testified that he is not even able to hold hands with her anymore. On a separate rescue mission, Senior Chief Petty Officer Jimmy Hatch, a Navy SEAL, suffered a leg wound that required 18 surgical procedures and ended his long career in special

Army investigators quickly dismissed claims that troops had died searching for Sergeant Bergdahl - who was promoted during captivity - or that he had intended to defect to the Taliban. They suggested that he could be prosecuted for desertion and for some lesser crimes. But in March 2015, the Army raised the stakes, accusing him not only of desertion but also of misbehavior before the enemy, an ancient but rarely charged crime punishable by up to life in prison. In this case, the misbehavior was endangering the troops sent to search for him

Even so, the sergeant's defense seemed to have some momentum. The Army's chief investigator on the case testified at Sergeant Bergdahl's preliminary hearing that he did not believe any jail time was warranted, and the preliminary hearing officer suggested the whole episode might have been avoided "had concerns about Sergeant Bergdahl's mental health been properly followed up." But at Fort Bragg, General Abrams ordered that Sergeant Bergdahl face a general court-

martial on both charges.

Colonel Nance labeled Mr. Trump's comments about Sergeant Bergdahl "disturbing," but declined to throw out the case. Then, last month, Mr. Trump seemed to endorse his earlier sentiments about Sergeant Bergdahl, saying, "I think people have heard my comments in the past."

After another protest by the defense, Colonel Nance ruled that he would consider the president's comments as mitigation evidence. During the sentencing hearing, Sergeant Bergdahl apologized for his misconduct, saying he never intended for anyone to get hurt, and that he grieved "for those who have suffered and their families."

He added, "I'm admitting I made a horrible mistake."

The lead Army prosecutor, Maj. Justin Oshana, drew a comparison between Sergeant Bergdahl and those who were hurt through his actions.

"It wasn't a mistake," Major Oshana said of the sergeant's decision to walk off his base. "It was a crime."

Responding to testimony about how captivity had left Sergeant Bergdahl with physical pain, Major Oshana noted that at least the sergeant was able to talk about it. Sergeant Allen was constantly in pain, too, he said, but no longer possessed the ability to describe it. "Sergeant Bergdahl does not have a monopoly on suffering as a result of his choices," Major Oshana added.

The defense argued that Sergeant Bergdahl had already suffered a severe penalty for his crimes by being tortured during five years in captivity.

"It is undisputed that Sergeant Bergdahl paid a bitter price for the decision he made," one of his lawyers, Capt. Nina Banks, told Colonel Nance. She said that a dishonorable discharge was appropriate, but asked that he be spared prison.

The defense argued that Sergeant Bergdahl's decision to walk away was influenced by a then-undiagnosed severe personality disorder. Captain Banks also told the judge that the harsh comments by Mr. Trump meant that the sergeant's persecution did not stop when he was freed.

"Sergeant Bergdahl has been punished enough," she said.

New U.S. base not entirely out of range of North Korea threats

CAMP HUMPHREYS, South Korea — The U.S. military's newest and largest overseas base for 26,000 soldiers, family members and civilians is finally humming with activity and buzzing about the growing threat from nearby North Korea.

President Trump is scheduled to visit this \$10.7 billion, 3,500-acre base in the city of Pyeongtaek during his stop in South Korea on Nov. 5-8.

Camp Humphreys, which became the headquarters of the Eighth Army in July, is located 40 miles south of the former base in Seoul and about 60 miles from the Demilitarized Zone that divides North and South Korea.

That puts the base about twice as far from North Korea as its predecessor, one of the main reasons for the move.

Since 2003, South Korea and the U.S. have planned to bring U.S. troops out of their headquarters at Camp Yongsan in metropolitan Seoul — and out of reach of the rocket launchers and howitzers that pose a threat to the capital's metropolitan population of 25 million only 35 miles from the DMZ. By 2020, the number of soldiers and civilians living and working here is expected to grow to 42,000, as U.S. Forces Korea, which oversees all military operations on the Korean Peninsula, and other units transfer. By relocating, the military says it has more time to react to scenarios where every minute counts.

"When you look at North Korea's long-range artillery and you think about the ballistic missiles that go over, you literally may only have a few hours to respond to what is a realworld threat," said Col. Kimeisha McCullum, a spokesman for the Eighth Army.

Lt. Col. Richard Tucker, deputy commander of the Eighth Army's Second Combat Aviation Brigade, said that despite the rising temperatures with North Korea, troops here have not assumed a heightened state of readiness.

"The state of readiness is already inherent,"
Tucker said. ""When we practice getting
from bed to the aircraft, whether it's an
exercise or real life, we all do the exact same
thing."

As Trump leaves for an Asian trip that will also take him to Japan, Vietnam, China and the Philippines, soldiers also say they tune out the controversial barbs between Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, whom Trump has called "Little Rocket Man" because of North Korea's ballistic missile tests and vows to threaten the U.S. with a nuclear strike.

"Honestly (the rhetoric) doesn't affect the day-to-day operations," said CW2 Fernando Madrigal, who pilots an Apache attack helicopter. "We just continue to do our mission here, which is working with (South Korean forces) and strengthening our alliance."

The Eighth Army trains for more than just battle. In the event of a North Korean regime collapse, troops are prepared to secure the stockpiles of the North's nuclear and chemical weapons.

They're also responsible for evacuating noncombat Americans out of Korea during war or other disasters. A large-scale evacuation drill called Courageous Channel was held at the end of October, but the military stressed it was a routine exercise planned well in advance.

"Although not directly tied to current geopolitical events, our forces must be ready in all areas, to include systems and personnel annually exercised in Courageous Channel," Gen. Vincent Brooks, commander of U.S. Forces Korea, said in a statement. "This training is as important to readiness as our other routine events such as tank gunnery and fighter wing exercises."

Construction of the base is about 80% finished, according to Bob McElroy, a spokesman for U.S. Garrison Humphreys, the department managing the transition. Originally expected to open in 2008, the move to Camp Humphreys has been delayed due to funding and construction issues.

The base offers the latest high-tech communications and training facilities. But as North Korea's capabilities have evolved, Camp Humphreys is not entirely out of the range of threats.

One recent addition to North Korea's arsenal is a 300mm rocket that can travel 120 miles, far enough to reach Humphreys, according to Bruce Bennett, a senior defense researcher and North Korea expert at RAND Corp., a think tank.

"We do not know much about how many of those rockets that North Korea has available, so the magnitude of the threat is uncertain," said Bennett. "This rocket could carry chemical weapons but is too small to carry the kinds of nuclear weapons North Korea probably has available today. Of course, the North Korean Scud and longer range ballistic missiles could all reach Camp Humphreys, and do so with a variety of North Korean weapons."

Some units closer to the North Korean border will remain in operation, such as the 210th Field Artillery Brigade headquartered at Camp Casey, but most U.S. forces will be concentrated around Pyeongtaek — Osan Air Base is also nearby — and further south in Busan, where the U.S. Navy is headquartered.

As part of the agreement, South Korea, which is footing most of the bill for the new base, will reclaim the facilities the U.S. is leaving behind.

Camp Yongsan, the former headquarters, is located on prime real estate in the heart of Seoul and city planners have designs to convert it into a park. The amenities inside Camp Humphreys continue to take shape, transforming an area that was once salt marshes and rice paddies into a small American city. There's a waterpark and a golf course soon to open, chapels, schools, a hospital, a newly opened commissary with chains such as Taco Bell and Popeye's and a downtown soon to be topped off with movie theaters and a bowling alley.

For soldiers like Lt. Col. Tucker, who
has served in 51 different countries, including
Iraq and Afghanistan, the comforts of home
have been long in coming to Camp
Humphreys, but they're appreciated: "Put it
this way," he said. "I'm not living in a tent."

U.S. military carries out first airstrikes against ISIS fighters in Somalia

MOGADISHU, Somalia — The U.S. military for the first time has conducted two airstrikes against Islamic State group fighters in Somalia, where the group is a growing presence in a country long threatened by the al-Qaeda-linked extremist group al-Shabab. The U.S. Africa Command said the two drone strikes killed "several terrorists" in northeastern Somalia, with the first around midnight local time and the second later Friday morning. The U.S. said the strikes were carried out in coordination with Somalia's government.

Local officials confirmed the strikes. At least six missiles struck in Buqa, a remote mountainous village roughly 37 miles north of Qandala town in the northern state of Puntland, a Somali security official told The Associated Press.

The airstrike may have targeted top leaders of the group, the official said, speaking on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to speak to the media. The mayor of Qandala, Jama Mohamed, said

The mayor of Qandala, Jama Mohamed, said the strikes sent terrified nomadic villagers and their animals fleeing.

The U.S. military this year has carried out well over a dozen drone strikes against al-Shabab extremists after the Trump administration approved expanded efforts against the group. Al-Shabab has been blamed for carrying out Somalia's deadliest attack last month, a massive truck bombing in the capital, Mogadishu, that killed more than 350 people. Somalia's president has vowed a "state of war," with neighbors sending in thousands of troops to help the local military and an African Union force.

But ISIS-linked fighters who have split from the Somalia-based al-Shabab pose a growing threat in Puntland.

In May, The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for a deadly bombing in Puntland — said to be the first time the extremist group had claimed an attack in the Horn of Africa nation. Police said a suicide bomber detonated at a military checkpoint in the commercial hub of Bossaso, killing at least four people.

A report by United Nations experts monitoring sanctions against the Islamic State group noted in a report circulated in

Bergdahl, facing sentencing, says Taliban treated him better than Army

The sentencing hearing begins Monday at Fort Bragg, N.C., for Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl, who has pleaded guilty to desertion and says the Taliban who captured him treated him better than the U.S. Army.

"At least the Taliban were honest enough to say, 'I'm the guy who's gonna cut your throat,' "Bergdahl, 31, told British journalist Sean Langan for a story published in <u>The Sunday Times</u> of London. "Here, it could be the guy I pass in the corridor who's going to sign the paper that sends me away for life." Bergdahl pleaded guilty last week to one count of "desertion with intent to shirk important or hazardous duty" and one count of "misbehavior before the enemy by endangering the safety of a command, unit or place." He could face life in prison for his crimes.

Former Army corporal Jonathan Morita is among the service members who could testify at the hearing. A rocket-propelled grenade shattered Morita's right hand during a search mission for Bergdahl, and the thumb and index finger remain damaged.

Morita told the Associated Press he wasn't sure how he felt about Bergdahl's admission of guilt.

"Did he really mean it, or did the defense tell him to say it?" Morita said.

Bergdahl was stationed in Afghanistan when he walked away from his post in June 2009. The Idaho native was soon captured by the ruthless, Taliban-aligned Haqqani network and held for almost five years before a controversial prisoner exchange that freed him in May 2014.

President Obama signed off on the deal in exchange for the release of five prisoners from Guantanamo Bay. Obama cited the military mantra that no soldier be left behind. But the deal drew intense criticism from Republicans and others who said Bergdahl jeopardized the lives of the soldiers sent to find him.

In 2015, Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., who chairs the Senate Armed Services Committee, said he would hold hearings on the case if the Army didn't impose punishment. President Trump called Bergdahl a "dirty, rotten traitor" and tweeted in March 2015 that he "should face the death penalty for desertion five brave soldiers died trying to bring him back. U.S. has to get tough!" Then-defense secretary Chuck Hagel has said no deaths were directly connected to the search for Bergdahl, although multiple soldiers were wounded. Among them were Morita and Army National Guard Master Sgt. Mark Allen, who was shot in the helmet during a firefight. He suffered a traumatic brain injury and remains in a wheelchair, unable to speak.

Bergdahl initially said he left his post because he had concerns about his command's leadership and wanted to expose the weaknesses to top leaders. He said he was kept in a cage and tortured during captivity and tried to escape several times. Bergahl told the Sunday Times that he dismissed Trump's attacks as the words of a

"I can't convince the people who say, 'Just string him up and shoot him.' So you just move on," Bergdahl said.

He acknowledged that being called a traitor was offensive.

"You know, it's just insulting frankly," Bergdahl said. "The idea that they would think I did that."

Bergdahl had earlier revealed some of the details of his experience on the podcast <u>Serial</u>, which obtained hours of interviews the soldier conducted with filmmaker Mark Boal. Bergdahl said he realized that abandoning his post was a mistake, then concocted a plan to redeem himself by trying to stalk Taliban insurgents. "Doing what I did is me saying that I am like, I don't know, Jason Bourne," he said. Instead, his capture was costly to his fellow soldiers and his country. He told the *Sunday Times* that after a time in captivity, he determined he would either die a hostage or die trying to escape.

"Either way I was a dead man," he said.
"It wasn't a case of being scared of dying. It was a case of embracing the fact that I was a dead man."

Trump Says He Will Release Final Set of Documents on Kennedy Assassination WASHINGTON — President Trump has decided to release a final batch of thousands of classified government documents related

to the 1963 assassination of President John F. Kennedy, Mr. Trump announced in a tweet on Saturday morning.

"Subject to the receipt of further information, I will be allowing, as President, the long blocked and classified JFK FILES to be opened," Mr. Trump said on Twitter. The release of the information being held in secret at the National Archives - including several thousand never-before-seen documents — was mandated to occur by Oct. 26 under a 1992 law that sought to quell conspiracy theories about the assassination. Mr. Trump has the power to block the release of the documents, and intelligence agencies have pressured him to do so for at least some of them. The agencies are concerned that information contained in some of the documents could damage national security

In a statement to reporters, the White House left open the possibility that Mr. Trump might halt the release of some documents. "The president believes that these documents should be made available in the interests of full transparency unless agencies provide a compelling and clear national security or law enforcement justification otherwise," the statement said.

It is not known what revelations might be contained in the unreleased documents, though researchers and authors of books about Kennedy say they do not expect any bombshells that significantly alter the official narrative of the assassination — that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in Dallas delivered in 1964 by the Warren Commission.

But the documents are likely to "help fuel a new generation of conspiracy theories," according to Philip Shenon, a former New York Times reporter and the author of a book about the commission, and Larry J. Sabato, a University of Virginia professor and author of a book about Kennedy, who wrote a recent article about the documents in Politico. They wrote that the documents relate to what they call a "mysterious chapter in the history of the assassination - a six-day trip that J.F.K. assassin Lee Harvey Oswald paid to Mexico City several weeks before the president's murder, in which Oswald met with Cuban and Soviet spies and came under intensive surveillance by the C.I.A.'s Mexico City station. Previously released F.B.I. documents suggest that Oswald spoke openly in Mexico about his intention to kill Kennedy."

With the Oct. 26 deadline to release the remaining documents fast approaching, Mr. Trump had been under increasing pressure from advocates of transparency not to hold back any of the documents from the public on the grounds of national security.

Senator Charles E. Grassley, Republican of Iowa, introduced a resolution in the Senate this month that urged Mr. Trump to make a "full public release of all remaining records," saying that he should "reject any claims for the continued postponement of the full public release of those records."

Conspiracy theorists have long clamored for what they hope will be evidence to prove that the government covered up the truth about the assassination. This week, Roger J. Stone, a friend of Mr. Trump's, told Alex Jones, the radio host and conspiracy theorist, that Mr. Stone had directly urged the president to release all the documents.

"I had the opportunity to make the case directly to the president of the United States by phone as to why I believe it is essential that he release the balance of the currently redacted and classified J.F.K. assassination documents," Mr. Stone said on Mr. Jones's radio program.

Mr. Trump is no stranger to conspiracy theories, including those involving the Kennedy assassination. During the presidential campaign, he at one point alleged that the father of Senator Ted Cruz, a Republican primary rival from Texas, had been with Oswald shortly before Kennedy was killed.

"You know, his father was with Lee Harvey Oswald prior to Oswald's being — you know, shot," Mr. Trump told Fox News in an interview in May 2016, as he battled the Texas senator for the nomination. "I mean, the whole thing is ridiculous. What is this, right, prior to his being shot, and nobody brings it up. They don't even talk about that.

That was reported and nobody talks about it. But I think it's horrible."

He went on, "What was he doing with Lee Harvey Oswald shortly before the death, before the shooting? It's horrible."

Mr. Trump has at times dabbled in other conspiracy theories: He once seemed to consider the possibility that Justice Antonin Scalia had been murdered. The president has more than once spread the discredited urban legend about Muslims being shot with bullets dipped in pig's blood. And for years, he was the most vocal purveyor of the falsehood that President Barack Obama was born outside the United States.

Former presidents call for unity at hurricane aid concert

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — The five living former presidents put aside politics and appeared together for the first time since 2013 at a concert on Saturday to raise money for victims of devastating hurricanes in Texas, Florida, Louisiana, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Democrats Barack Obama, Bill Clinton and Jimmy Carter and Republicans George H.W. and George W. Bush gathered in College Station, Texas, home of Texas A&M University, to try to unite the country after the storms.

Texas A&M is home to the presidential library of the elder Bush. At 93, he has a form of Parkinson's disease and appeared in a wheelchair at the event. His wife, Barbara, and George W. Bush's wife, Laura, were in the audience.

Grammy award winner Lady Gaga made a surprise appearance at the concert that also featured country music band Alabama, Rock & Roll Hall of Famer 'Soul Man' Sam Moore, gospel legend Yolanda Adams and Texas musicians Lyle Lovett and Robert Earl Keen.

The appeal backed by the ex-presidents has raised \$31 million since it began on Sept. 7, said Jim McGrath, spokesman for George H.W. Bush.

President Donald Trump offered a video greeting that avoided his past criticism of the former presidents and called them "some of America's finest public servants."

"This wonderful effort reminds us that we truly are one nation under God, all unified by our values and devotion to one another," Trump said in the greeting, played during the concert.

Four of the five former presidents — Obama, George W. Bush, Carter and Clinton — made brief remarks that did not mention Trump. The elder Bush did not speak but smiled and waved to the crowd. They appealed for national unity to help those hurt by the hurricanes.

"The heart of America, without regard to race or religion or political party, is greater than our problems," said Clinton.

The last time the five were together was in 2013, when Obama was still in office, at the dedication of George W. Bush's presidential library in Dallas.

There is precedent for former presidents joining forces for post-disaster fundraising. George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton raised money together after the 2004 South Asia tsunami and Hurricane Katrina the next year. Clinton and George W. Bush combined to seek donations after Haiti's 2011 earthquake. "It's certainly a triple, if not a home run, every time," said Brandon Rottinghaus, a political science professor at the University of Houston. "Presidents have the most powerful and prolific fundraising base of any politician in the world. When they send out a call for help, especially on something that's not political, they can rake in big money." Amid criticism that his administration was initially slow to aid ravaged Puerto Rico, Trump accused island leaders of "poor leadership," and later tweeted that, "Electric and all infrastructure was disaster before hurricanes" while saying that Federal Emergency Management Agency, firstresponders and military personnel wouldn't be able to stay there forever. But Rottinghaus said ex-presidents are seen

as less polarizing than the current president.

"They can't get away from the politics of the moment," he said of current White House occupants. "Ex-presidents are able to step back and be seen as the nation's grandfather." Hurricane Harvey slammed into Texas and Louisiana Gulf Coast as a Category 4 hurricane on Aug. 25, unleashing historic flooding in Houston and killing more than 80 people. Shortly thereafter, all five expresidents appeared in a commercial for a fundraising effort known as "One America Appeal." In it, George W. Bush says, "People are hurting down here." His father, George H.W. Bush, then replies, "We love you,

Hurricane Irma subsequently hit Florida and Hurricane Maria battered Puerto Rico, while both devastated the U.S. Virgin Islands. A website accepting donations, OneAmericaAppeal.org, was created with 100 percent of proceeds pledged to hurricane relief.

Honolulu store owners say thieves are targeting cans of Spam

HONOLULU (AP) — Cans of Spam have become a common item that's being stolen from Honolulu stores and then sold on the streets for quick cash, according to authorities.

Ra Long, who owns a convenience store in the city, said shoplifters have typically targeted alcohol in the past, but recently more cans of Spam have gone missing, Hawaii News Now reported.

"I mean you try to keep an eye on it, but if they run, you just can't leave the counter and chase them," Long said. "So you just got to take the hit."

Honolulu police said they took a report of a man lifting a case of the canned meat from a store earlier this month.

Kimo Carvalho, a spokesman for the Institute for Human Services, said people are stealing Spam because it's easy to sell. "It's quick cash for quick drug money," Carvalho said. Hawaiians eat millions of cans of Spam a year, the nation's highest per-capita consumption of the processed meat, which is cobbled together from a mixture of pork shoulder, ham, sugar and salt.

The state's love affair with Spam began during World War II, when rationing created just the right conditions for the rise of a meat that needs no refrigeration and has a remarkably long shelf life (indefinitely, the company says).

Ann Kondo Corum, who grew up in Hawaii in the 1950s and has written several Spaminspired cookbooks, has attributed Spam's popularity partly to Hawaii's large Asian population. "Asians eat a lot of rice. Spam is salty, and it goes well with rice," she told The Associated Press in 2009.

Second person dies of flesh-eating bacteria after Hurricane Harvey

A 31-year-old man has died after he was diagnosed with the rare flesh-eating disease necrotizing fasciitis.

Just two months after hurricane Harvey made landfall in Texas, it claimed the life of yet another victim.

A 31-year-old man died after being diagnosed with a rare flesh-eating bacterial infection known as necrotizing fasciitis, according to the <u>Galveston County Health</u> District.

The victim, identified as Josue Zurita, repaired several homes damaged by Harvey flooding, the Galveston County Health District announced. Zurita had gone to the hospital on Oct. 10 with an infected wound on his upper left arm.

He was then diagnosed with the rare bacterial infection necrotizing fasciitis, known for killing soft tissue. Zurita died on Oct. 16, says Galveston County Health District.

According to the Carnes Brothers Funeral Home, Zurita was a loving father and a hardworking carpenter who had moved to the U.S. to help his family.

"He's a very caring person," said Brenda Avalos, wife of Josue's cousin Anastacio. "He has a lot of friends here in Galveston that love him. Everybody is very sad. He was very young and always smiling." The recent death follows that of a 77-year-old

woman, Nancy Reed, who also died from flesh-eating bacteria linked to Harvey floodwaters, according to the Harris County medical examiner's office.

Approximately 700 to 1100 cases occur each year in the United States, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Health officials suggest taking reasonable precaution when you're doing work: Get a tetanus shot; if you have a wound, get it cleaned as quickly as possible; and if you have any sign of an infection, see a doctor immediately.

Group rescues deer with head stuck in plastic pumpkin bucket

CINCINNATI (AP) — A deer that got its head trapped in an orange plastic pumpkin bucket is free after residents in suburban Cincinnati spent the weekend tracking it. WCPO-TV reports the Anderson Township Family Pet Center got calls over four days from residents concerned about the deer with the bucket stuck over its nose.

Daryl Meyerrenke at the pet center warned that it would be dangerous for neighbors to try to rescue the deer, but he says they were determined to help the animal and spent hours following it through wooded areas. Eventually, the group using animal catch poles was able to encircle the deer, and Meyerrenke's son freed it from the bucket. Meyerrenke says the animal immediately went to graze and drink water at a creek.

450-pound seal removed from northern Alaska airport's runway

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — In Alaska, it's not uncommon for wildlife like polar bears to wander onto an airport's runway, but a lounging seal is far more unusual.

But that's what workers found at the airport in the nation's northernmost city on Monday. A seal estimated to weigh 450 pounds (204 kilograms) was removed from the runway at the airport at Utqiagvik (pronounced (oot-GHAR'-vik) by way of sled, KTVA reported

A photo and video of the bearded seal lounging on the runway in the town formerly known as Barrow was shared by Scott Babcock on Facebook.

The state Department of Transportation got in on the fun by warning pilots of "low sealings" at the airport.

Meadow Bailey, the department's communications director, said Utqiagvik, an Arctic Ocean coastal community on Alaska's North Slope, experienced heavy storms Monday. Staff found the seal while clearing the runway.

The department's staff members are not allowed to handle marine mammals, so the seal was removed by North Slope Animal Control.

The workers have seen birds, caribou, polar bears and musk ox on the runway, but the seal sighting was a first, Bailey said. "Wildlife strikes to aircraft pose a significant safety hazard and cost the aviation industry hundreds of millions of dollars each year," Bailey said. "Birds make up over 90 percent of strikes in the US, while mammal strikes are rare."

Man locked in store's beer cooler stays, drinks all night

MARSHFIELD, Wis. — A 38-year-old Wisconsin man who got locked in a convenience store's beer cooler overnight didn't despair: He decided to enjoy the experience, according to police.

The man, whose name was not released, told police that he went to a Kwik Trip here to

police that he went to a Kwik Trip here to buy some beer but became trapped inside the walk-in cooler when it was locked at about 11:50 p.m. Tuesday, according to a police report. Rather than bang on the glass door to be let out, he warmed up to the idea of staying inside — where temperatures hover around 32 degrees — all night to sample the merchandise.

A customer told Kwik Trip employees that a man was inside the beer cave at about 5:50 a.m. Wednesday.

When they opened the door, he left the store without paying for what he drank: An 18-ounce bottle of beer and three cans of malt liquor. He also fell over a stack of 30-can beer packs, breaking three cases open. For his adventure, more because he left the makeshift bar without paying his tab, he was issued a misdemeanor citation for retail theft.

Time change: Goodbye daylight saving, hello standard

Sick of dark mornings on your way to school or work? It's your time to rise and shine. Just like pumpkin spice, falling leaves and football, another rite of autumn is upon us: The end of daylight saving time, which will occur at 2 a.m. Sunday Nov. 5. At that moment (or the night before), the few analog clocks still around need to "fall back" an hour, turning 1:59:59 a.m. into 1 a.m. Since most of our computers, phones and DVRs do it automatically, it's not as much of a chore as it used to be.

Starting Sunday, that one hour of daylight is switched from evening to morning as standard time begins.

Credit - or blame - for the biannual shift goes back to Benjamin Franklin, who published An Economical Project for Diminishing the Cost of Light in a 1784 journal after he noticed that people burned candles at night but slept past dawn. But he never saw his plan put into action. The U.S. first implemented daylight saving during World War I as a way to conserve fuel with the Standard Time Act of 1918, also known as the Calder Act.

In World War II, President Franklin D. Roosevelt implemented a year-round daylight saving time that was commonly known as "War Time."

In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson signed the Uniform Time Act into law.

Under the act, states and territories can opt out of daylight saving. It isn't observed in Arizona (except the Navajo Nation), Hawaii, American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, according to the Congressional Research Service.

Daylight saving is observed in approximately 70 countries, including most of those in North America and Europe.

We don't go back to daylight saving until Sunday, March 11, 2018, about a week before spring begins.

Sears deal: Retailer can sell another 140 stores to fund pensions as losses mount

Ailing department-store chain Sears Holdings reached a deal that will allow it to sell up to 140 additional properties as it faces mounting losses and declining sales, likely setting the stage for another round of closures.

Sears said Wednesday that it had reached a deal with a U.S. government pension board to regain the right to sell the 140 locations that

regain the right to sell the 140 locations that had previously been shielded from such a plan.

The company is expected to use all of the

The company is expected to use all of the proceeds from the sales or financing deals — estimated at \$407 million — to fund a pension plan that still supports about 100,000 beneficiaries.

Sears spokesman Howard Riefs declined to identify the locations included in the agreement, which comes after the company already announced closures of more than 400 stores this year. He also declined to say whether any of the properties are already closed and whether the company could arrange deals that would allow it to lease the sites.

The retailer has been struggling mightily against stiff competition with discounters, the rise of Amazon.com and nimbler rivals. Sears stock tumbled 4.6% to \$4.77 at 1:01 p.m. Wednesday.

The online-only deals kicked off with a 49inch Polaroid TV that will be on sale for \$350 instead of the usual \$550. And Kmart loyalty program members will also get back points worth \$200 after they make the purchase.

The show will announce two more specials on Nov. 14 and Nov. 21 that will also offer loyalty points along with a discount. Bluelight Specials became a staple of Kmart stores in their heyday. Starting in 1965, a voice over a store's public-address system would announce a deep discount on an item and shoppers would be directed to the bargain by a flashing blue light, like the one atop police cars.

And unlike the fabled in-store deals, relainched in 2015, the televised Bluelight bargains won't last just a few minutes. Shoppers could hop online as soon as the show ended and grab the sale through midnight Saturday.

SAN FRANCISCO — Uber has a host of issues to contend with, from remaking its corporate culture to battling unfriendly cities.

But the ride-hailing company is nonetheless forging ahead with plans to make a <u>Blade</u>
<u>Runner</u> vision of transportation — flying cars— a reality by 2020.

Uber chief product officer Jeff Holden planned to announce at the Web Summit conference in Lisbon Wednesday that Los Angeles will join Dallas as the first two cities to host the company's proposed network of flying vehicles. He said the company expects L.A. residents to be making "heavy use" of the service by the time it hosts the 2028 Olympics.

Holden also said Uber signed an agreement with NASA to help develop a specialized air traffic control network to keep track of our newly crowded skies.

"Technology will allow L.A. residents to literally fly over the city's historically bad traffic, giving them time back to use in far more productive ways," Holden said in comments shared with USA TODAY. "At scale, we expect UberAir will perform tens of thousands of flights each day across the city." In a special-effects laden video screened for conference attendees, called "Closer Than You Think," a woman is seen heading to an Uber Skyport on the roof of a tall building. She checks in with her app for an UberAir flight, and joins three other passengers in a piloted electric plane that looks like a small Cessna with the exception of rotating wing-mounted propellors that swivel, enabling the craft to take off vertically like a helicopter.

To keep tabs on its sky-bound traffic, Uber said it will work with NASA on a range of Unmanned Traffic Management and Unmanned Aerial Systems projects that in theory will prevent catastrophic mid-air accidents from happening in the skies above dense urban zones.

"UberAir will be performing far more flights over cities on a daily basis than has ever been done before," said Holden. "Doing this safely and efficiently is going to require a foundational change in airspace management technologies."

Uber also announced that it signed an agreement with Los Angeles' Sandstone Properties to develop its Skyport roof-top take-off and landing terminals. Sandstone has 20 buildings around the core of L.A. that UberAir flights could use to skip around the city.

While technological, regulatory and psychological hurdles remain, the prospect of flying over (or under) immovable traffic is hard to resist. Los Angeles-based Tesla CEO Elon Musk has even started a new venture, The Boring Company, which plans to drill tunnels beneath cities.

Uber's presentation featured a compelling graphic that showed how a ride in an Uber car from Los Angeles International Airport to the downtown Staples Center would typically take around an hour and 20 minutes, even though it's only a 16-mile trek.

Harley-Davidson rolls out the Sport Glide, its ninth new Softail for 2018

Harley-Davidson Inc. has introduced another Softail motorcycle for 2018, called the Sport Glide, with the company's Milwaukee-Eight 107 engine and a fairing that's secured with quick-release clamps.

It is the ninth model in the new Softail lineup and the latest bike in a line of 100 new motorcycles that Harley plans to introduce by 2027.

The Sport Glide is scheduled to be unveiled Tuesday at EICMA, the world's largest motorcycle show, in Milan, Italy. Harley says the new Softails come with the most powerful engine ever offered on its cruisers. The new bikes, aimed at the company's 115th anniversary year, are being rolled out as manufacturers of cruiser and touring motorcycles have seen a decline in U.S. sales.

The Sport Glide has new lockable, rigid saddlebags that Harley says can be opened with one hand by a seated rider. The bags, with a combined storage capacity of about 2 cubic feet, can be removed in seconds with the internal quick-release mechanism. The new fairing is shaped to deflect wind away from the rider's chest and is secured to the bike's fork tubes with quick-release clamps for fast removal and installation. "You can see the influence of the iconic batwing fairing from Harley touring models, but it's been trimmed back to create a more compact, sporty shape," said Brad Richards, Harley's vice president of styling and design. Riders seeking more wind protection can exchange the standard windshield for a taller

The bike's seat height is a low 27.5 inches, and Harley included its Daymaker LED headlamp on the Sport Glide. A USB charging port, keyless ignition and the Smart Security system are also standard equipment. Harley says the Sport Glide has the company's new Softail mono-shock suspension with remote hydraulic preload adjustment to accommodate the weight of a passenger or luggage. The bike has antilock brakes and new Mantis cast-aluminum wheels — an 18-inch front and a 16-inch rear.

Harley says the spokes sweep from the hub to the rim to create a sense of motion even when the bike is parked, and the look is reinforced with the shape of the fairing and saddlebags. The Sport Glide comes in three colors: Vivid Black, Twisted Cherry and Silver Fortune. The bike's suggested retail price is \$18,599 in black and \$18,999 in the other colors. Harley says its new Softails are the result of the most extensive research and development program in the company's history. As part of the research, the company says it interviewed more than 3,000 riders for their views on cruisers - a versatile style of bike with a relaxed riding position, suitable for long-distance riding but more nimble than a big touring motorcycle.

Kevin Hart gets serious, beats Tiki Barber in NYC Marathon

NEW YORK (AP) — Kevin Hart got serious about training for the New York City
Marathon. So serious, he beat former New York Giants running back Tiki Barber.
The comedian and actor posted a video on Instagram that says "Marathon complete. Got my gold medal. It's an amazing feeling. I can check this goal off my list."
He finished his first NYC marathon in 4 hours, 5 minutes, 6 seconds. He'll have some bragging rights on Barber, running 33 minutes faster than the 42-year-old retired football player turned broadcaster.

The 38-year-old Hart says he "cramped real bad after Mile 20" but immediately set another goal of running more marathons. Kathrine Switzer ran her first NYC marathon since winning the title in 1974. The 70-yearold author and marathon commentator finished in 4:48:21.

Switzer was the first woman to run the Boston Marathon in 1967. She used her initials because women weren't allowed to enter the event.

LOS ANGELES — A bidding war resulted in a \$700,000 price tag for a Prince guitar the highest price ever paid for one of the late icon's guitars, according to Julien's Auctions. The blue teal "Cloud" guitar went far above the \$60,000 to \$80,000 expected at the Saturday auction. The guitar was one of several items up for sale by rock legends. A Michael Jackson black and white rhinestone glove sold for \$102,000 while a red snakeskin jacket in the mold of the one he wore in his Beat It video sold for \$118,000. A MTV Video Music Award Moonman won by Kurt Cobain went for \$62,500; a Nehru shirt worn by Jimmy Hendrix sold for \$106,000, and handwritten lyrics to David Bowie's Starman was sold for \$81,000.
