Effective 2017, the SMCI began announcing on m	nail rejection notification forms that

'free books are not allowed, books must be purchased".

Apparantly only prisoners who can afford to buy books or who have families who are financially ale to pay for books are entitled to enhance their rehabilitation and education by receiving and eading books. Those who are poor or whose families remain in poverty will be uninformed and neducated because they will not be allowed to benefit from the multitude of free books-torisoners programs established throughout the nation to help those very inmates.

While banning or rejecting publications for no reason other than the publication being free most ertainly does not pass muster in a constitutional sense, prison officials blatantly refuse to back own when confronted with legal reasons (and simple common sense reasons) why they should

ease and desist this action.
