

This memorandum is to notice all Mule Creek State Prison (MCSP) staff and inmates that changes have been made regarding authorized Handicraft items. The following items are now authorized per the Departmental Operational Manual *Article 43 Allowable Inmate Property*. All approved Handicraft items must be ordered and received by a Departmental approved vendor.

Approved In-Cell Handicraft Items	Maximum Allowable
1. Paints, Acrylics, bottles or tubes (no metal or glass). 2 oz. maximum	25
2. Paint brushes, sets and individual (not to exceed 8 ½ total length)	5
3. Canvas, pads, tablets or single sheets (no frame or backing) 12" x 12" maximum size	6 pads or 50 sheets
4. Paper, individual sheets, 12" x 12" maximum size	200 sheets (per article 43)
5. Pastels, crayons, "nupastel" color sticks	30 pieces
6. Pencils, Colored, drawing, charcoal, pastel	24 (per article 43)
7. Charcoal sticks, squares	25
8. Beading needle	2
9. Thread	75 yards maximum per spindle/roll ("00" weight)
10. Beads	200 grams total
11. Glue Stick	1 Stick

Subject: **AUTHORIZATION FOR INMATE PURCHASES OF RELIGIOUS PROPERTY WITHOUT CHAPLAIN APPROVAL**

The purpose of this memorandum is to clarify that institution chaplains are not required to provide written approval for inmates to purchase non-food personal religious items. Written approval for these items is provided via the Religious Personal Property Matrix (RPPM).

Effective the date of this memorandum, inmates shall be authorized to purchase non-food items which are listed within the RPPM from approved vendors without prior approval of the institution chaplains. This language shall be reflected in a forthcoming amendment to the Department Operations Manual, Section 54030.7 Inmate Personal Property Acquisition, which currently states, *"Purchases of health care appliances, correspondence courses, religious items, and handcraft material require an inmate to obtain prior approval."*
