One inmate is quoted as saying

"We planned this Transgender Day of Remembrance on only three weeks notice"

Said one inmate in the Jan edition of SQ News Paper. Now, in my personal opinion, that one to two hour program reads super amazing, and the photos of everyone in the article is real good work, very powerful.

Whatch this, audience members was CDCR officials, Kris Applegate, Amy Miller, and our own home campus "HERO" officer M. Hauwert, and State Senator Scott Wiener (D - San Francisco). Also CDCR Mental Health Department Primary Clinicians, C. Spohn and J. Lopez, someone named Father Donal Godfrey of the Society of Jesuits.

These are the names of the people that have failed to do something about the ongoing violence against innercity youth incarcerated Americans that identify to some degree as Gay and Bi-Sexual etc... that are housed just a few feet away from where this program took place.

And, this is what I mean.

Upon arrival at SQSP, inmates go through the reception units, and Administration Segregation Units, for example.

In these units, all inmates that identify as LGBTQ+ are attacked, forced into protective custody housing, and are deuced with water, urine, feces, spit on, and have dirty condoms thrown at them, and nobody is doing anything about it, Yes, I said NOBODY.

We are calling on our State Congress Persons, and State Senators to be contacted by any and everyone who reads this message, our public servants, and organizations need to hear about, and know about this crisis that is being systemically hidden, and unaddressed by those from within our very own LGBTQ+ community for the purpose of individual career advancement, on the backs and keeps of neglect from the most underserved demographic of the California Prison population.

the state.

San Quentin is an all male facility, and the
LGBTQIT discrimination is Urban Perspective,
requiring an Urban Perspective engagement
from Black, Latino, Asian, Pacific Islanders,
Gay, and Bi-Sexual Men in the Community
to help effect this crisis.
