Who is Micah? I love guided history because it is important to know. The purpose of Micah in the Holy Bible was to warn God's people that judgment is coming and to offer pardon to all who repent. The author Micah, a native of Moresheth, near Gath, about 20 miles southwest of Jerusalem. The original audience was the people of Israel (the Northern Kingdom) and of Judah (the Southern Kingdom).

Micah emphasized the need for justice and peace. Like a lawyer, he set forth God's case against Israel and Judah, their leaders and their people. Throughout the book are prophecies about Jesus, the Messiah, who will gather the people into one nation. He will be their King and ruler, acting mercifully toward them. Micah makes it clear that God hates unkindness, idolatry, injustice and empty ritual - and he still hates these today. But God is very willing to pardon the sins of any who repent.

Micah denounced the sins of the leaders, priests and prophets (leaders of Jacob and rulers) those responsible for teaching the people right from wrong. The ~~leaders~~ leaders, who should have known the law and taught it to the people, had set the law aside and had become the worst of sinners. They were taking advantage of the very people they were supposed to serve. All sin is bad, but the sin that leads

Others are way to the worst of all. The dividing line between right and wrong often seems blurred, but spiritual leaders are supposed to help ~~others~~ others see it. The Bible is God's guidebook to show us how to distinguish right and wrong. Spiritual leaders must understand the Bible's principles teach them clearly, and exemplify them in their lives. While leaders cannot force people to do right, they should point them in that direction.

Today we have lawyers, judges, District attorney, etc and people in our government offices they are ~~leaders~~ leaders ~~and~~ does not have compassion or respect for ~~the~~ people they have put away unjustly and the people they serve in the communities or the voters. ~~They~~ The leaders are treating people miserably in order to satisfy their own desires. I feel like Micah was speaking to us right now going into 2022. Micah said yet no one was speaking against them or doing anything to stop them. God will not put up with such injustice.

That is why so many District Attorney leaders, rich people are going to prison today. God is saying yeah though you was getting but I pull the covers.

People are crying out from behind the bars. Regardless of man judging the outer appearance and the offence. God sees and knows everything. Let me man thinks he gets away. But this they are not. This kind of injustice had spread throughout the nation and like a disease, was destroying the people from the ~~sun~~ inside out.
