UPDATED REPORT

April 22, 2022

With this communication, I am sending a message to my friends in Massachusetts and to the brothers and sisters of "Betweenthebars.org. — To collect the required 10,000 signatures is very complicated because the signatures have to be collected from registered voters around the state. It can't be collected in one or two counties. But we still have an option to write-in vote on the week of the election.

At the present time I am waiting for the Temporary Restraining Order pending in Court - Civil Action #2185CVO1214. It is important that you be aware that the T.R.O. is a safety net requirement to preven abuse or being transferred like they have done before. Please keep in mind that prisoners are disenfranchised from any political process, but I am a registered political candidate #CPF ID: 14945 that can be verified with the Office of Campaign and Political Finance (617) 979-8300.

By June 22, 2022, I will be able to explain my intention in running - My Political Candidacy is the only way to address issues of confinement within the Massachusetts Criminal Justice System.

In another important issue of great concern to many people is with the inability of poor people in general to have access to the Federal Courts. For the most part individuals who finalizes his or her appeal in State Court has one year to pursue the Federal Petition under 28 USC § 2254 for a Writ of Habeas Corpus by a person in state custody.

Minorities and poor people in general are illiterate on legal issues and only a few go through with the help of someone in prison to fill out the 16-pages questionaire that's required by the Habeas Corpus Proceedings. Without any question there should be a mandate to a Federal Review on every appeal coming from the state with the assistance of the Federal Public Defenders (FPD). - This will prevent racial descrimination in state court, Most of the name that appear in Federal Court are from someone paying private lawyers. You will also notice many Spanish names on the record appealing in Federal Court are for the most part individuals appealing from the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico because Massachusetts is the 1st District which is the appeal base for them.
