David wrote psalm 35 because he was being hunted by Saul. A simple prayer to God for help against those who try to inflict injury for no reason. When our enemies are unjust and lie about us, even when we do good to them. We can appeal to God who is always just. What I like about this prayer David prayed in psalm 35, he went in to deepest matters of his heart. Psalm 35: 7 since they hid their net for me without cause and without causing a pit for me, (8) may recompense them by surprise - maybe not they had entangled, may they fall into the pit to their ruin. David was sad when his prayers seemed unanswered. "When our deliverance is delayed, we may assume that God ~~hasn't~~ hasn't answered our prayers. God hears every prayer, but He answers according to His wisdom. Don't let the absence of an immediate answer cause you to doubt or resent God. Instead let it be an occasion to deepen your faith. David cried out to God to defend him when people wrongly accused him. If you are unjustly accused, your natural reaction may be to lash out in revenge or to give a detailed defense.

of your enemies. Instead, ask God to fight the battle for you. He will clear your name in the eyes of those who really matter. Why is people so evil. Americans and other nations read the abrogation the tribe of Benjamin (A Benjamite and His Concubine Judges 19-21) in the Holy Bible. What is the significance of this tragic story? When the Israelites faith in God disintegrated, their unity as a nation also disintegrated. They could have taken complete possession of the land if they had obeyed God and trusted him to keep his promises. But when they forgot him, they lost their purpose and soon "everyone did as he saw fit" (21:25). When they stopped letting God lead them, they became no better than evil people around them. When they made laws for their own benefits, they set standards far below God's. When you leave God out of your life you may be shocked at what you are capable of doing (19:32). During the times of the judges, the people of Israel experienced trouble because everyone became his own authority and acted on his own opinions of right and wrong. This produced horrendous results. Our world is similar. Individuals, groups, and societies have made themselves the final authorities without reference to God. When people act selfishly, they satisfy their personal desires at all costs, everyone pays the price. It is the ultimate heroic act to submit all our plans, desires and motives to God. Men like Gideon, Jephthah, Jephthah, and Samson are known for their ~~loose~~ heroicism in battle. But their personal lives were far from heroic. To be truly heroic, we must go into battle each day in our home, job, church, and society to make God's Kingdom a reality. Our weapons are the standards, morals, truths and convictions we receive from God's word. We will lose the battle if we gather treasures of earthly treasures rather than saving the treasures of heaven. When we see people cleaving evil things like robbing, killing out of their ignorance or ~~setting~~ something up evil to happen that leads to destruction. It's because the wicked have no fear of God, nothing restrains them from sinning. Just ~~stop~~ shooting up the place and innocent victims. They plunge ahead as if nothing will happen to them. But God is just and is only delaying their punishment. This knowledge should hold us back from sinning. Let the fear of God debt work in you to keep you from sin. In your gratitude for God's grace and mercy, don't ignore his justice. ~~No~~ often times evil explodes with earth this

population growth Gn 6:1-4 Holy Bible. Some people have thought that the "sons of God" were fallen angels. But the "sons of God" were probably not angels, because angels do not marry or reproduce (Matthew 22:30; Mark 12:25). Some scholars believe the phrase refers to the descendants of Seth who intermarried with Cain's evil descendants ("the daughters of men"). This would have weakened the good influence of the faithful and increased moral depravity in the world, resulting in an explosion. In this story Nephilim refers to a powerful race of giants. "His days will be a hundred and twenty years" means that God was allowing the people of Noah's day 120 years to change their sinful ways. God shows his great patience with us as well. He is giving us time to quit living our way and begin living his way, the way he shows us in his Word. While 120 years seems like a long time, eventually the time ran out and the flood waters swept across the earth. Your time also may be running out. Turn to God to forgive your sins. You can't see the stopwatch of God's patience, and there is no bargaining for additional time. The Nephilim were giants, people probably nine feet tall. They may have been the same people mentioned in Numbers 13:33. Goliath, who was nine feet tall, appears in 1 Samuel 17. The Nephilim used their physical advantage to oppress the people around them. Does this mean that God regretted creating humanity? Was he admitting he made a mistake? No, God does not change his mind (1 Samuel 15:29). Instead, he was expressing sorrow for what the people had done to themselves, as a parent might express sorrow over a rebellious child. God was sorry that the people chose sin and death instead of a relationship with him. The people's sin grieved God. Our sin breaks God's heart as much as sin did in Noah's day. Noah, however, pleased God, although he was far from perfect. We can follow Noah's example and find "favor in the eyes of the Lord" in spite of the sin that surrounds us. Saying that Noah was righteous and blameless does not mean that he never sinned (the Bible records one of his sins in Gn 9:20). Rather it means that Noah wholeheartedly loved and obeyed God. for a lifetime he walked step by step in faith as a living example to his generation. Like Noah, we live in a world filled with evil. Are we influence others or being influenced by them? What drives a evil person person? A spirit of ambition can drive a evil person. for example, Both Annas and Caiaphas has been high priests. Annas was Israel's high priest from A.D. 6 to 15, when he was deposed by Roman rulers. Caiaphas, Annas's son-in-law, was appointed high priest from A.D. 18 to 36/37. According to Jewish law, the office of high priest was held ~~to~~ for life. Many Jews, Caiaphas made the final decisions. Both Caiaphas and Annas cared more about their political ambitions than about their responsibility to lead the people to God. Though ~~as~~ religious leaders, they had become evil. As the nation's spiritual ~~leaders~~ leaders, they should have been sensitive to God's revelation. They should have known that Jesus was the ~~the~~ messiah about whom the scripture spoke, and they should have pointed the people to him. But when ~~deceitful~~ deceitful men and women pursue evil, they want to eliminate all opposition. Instead of honestly evaluating Jesus claims based on knowledge of scripture, these

religious leaders sought to further their own selfish ambitions and were even willing to kill God's son, if that's what it took to do it. I don't care if something small you do and its evil. It's small amounts can affect many people. Matthew 16:12 gave a good example of this. By giving a warning against wrong teach of (Matthew 16:12) yeast is put into bread to make it rise, and it takes only a little to affect a whole batch of dough. Jesus used yeast as an example of how a small amount of evil can affect a large group of people. The wrong teachings of the Pharisees and Sadducees were leading many people astray. Beware of the tendency to say, "How can this little wrong possibly affect anyone?" The one who is plotting to do evil can be as wrong as doing it because what you think determines what you will do. Left unchecked, wrong desires will lead us to sin. God wants pure living, free from sin, and planning evil spoils the purity even of the lives of other people. Should you say, "When I might evil action has not yet been committed. Should you say, "When I might as well go ahead and do it because I've already planned it"? No. You have sinned in your attitude, but you have not yet damaged other people. Stop in your tracks and ask God to forgive you and put you on a different path. Where do these thoughts come from? In the case of David in the Bible asked God to guard his heart. Evil acts begin with evil desires. It isn't enough to ask God to keep you away from temptation, make you stronger, or change your circumstances. You must ask him to change you on the inside - at the level of your desires. Proverbs 14:8-9 He who plots evil will be known as a schemer. His schemes of folly are sin, and men detect a mocker. Scamming people out of cash. This is for you as well. What people fail to realize is the effect evil will backfire on that person or persons! When allowed to run its course, evil destroys itself. Violent people become victims of violence, and liars become victims of others' deceit (9:15, 16). In the process, however, innocent people are hurt. in our own faces. To be honest and straightforward before God and others is simpler, easier and safer in the long run. Can you avoid evil GN 3:5 Adam and Eve got what they wanted; an intimate knowledge of both good and evil. But they got it by doing ~~at~~ evil and the results were disastrous. Sometimes we have the illusion that freedom is doing anything we want. But God says that true freedom comes from obedience and knowing what not to do. The restrictions he gives us are for our good, helping us avoid evil. We have the freedom to walk in front of a speeding car, but we don't need to be hit to realize it would be foolish to do so. Don't listen to Satan's temptation, you don't have to gain more experience and learn more about life. Satan tried to make Eve think that sin is good, pleasant, and desirable. A knowledge of both good and evil seemed harmless to her. People usually choose wrong things because they have become convinced that those things are good, at least for themselves. Ourselves do not always appear ugly to us, and the pleasant ones are the hardest to avoid. So prepare yourself for the attractive temptations, but there is always a way of escape 1Corinthians 10:13. In a culture filled with moral depravity and sin-inducing pressure, Paul gave strong encouragement to the Corinthians about temptation. It said: 1) wrong ~~desires~~ desires and temptations happen to everyone, so don't feel you've been singled out; (2) others have resisted temptation, and so can you; (3) any temptation can be resisted because God will help you (4) recognize those people and situations that give you trouble (5) run from anything you know is wrong. (3) choose to do only what is right, (4) pray for God's help, and (5) seek friends who love God and can offer help when you are tempted. Running from a tempting situation is your first step on the way to victory. However, sometimes running away is considered being coward. But wise people realize that removing themselves physically from temptation often can be the most courageous action to take. Timothy, a young man was warned to flee anything that produced evil thoughts. Do you have a recurring temptation that you find difficult to resist? Remove yourself physically from any situation that stimulates your desire to sin. I know when to run as important in spiritual battle as knowing when and how to fight. Don't be silent against evil Eph 5:10-14 It is important to avoid the ~~afflictions~~ deeds of darkness (any pleasure or activity that results in sin), but we must go even further. Paul instructs us to expose these deeds because our silence may be interpreted as approval. God needs people who will take a stand for what is right. Christians must firmly speak out for what is right. ~~stand up~~ Paul was appealing to the Ephesians to wake up and realize the dangerous condition into which some of them had been slipping. Ephesians 5:15, 16 By saying, "the days are evil," Paul was communicating his sense of urgency because our days are also difficult. We must keep our standards high, act

wisely and do good wherever we can. Destroying evil in our lives Numbers 33:50-53 God told Moses that before the Israelites settled in the promised land they should drive out the wicked inhabitants and destroy them all. In Colossians 3, Paul encourages us to live as Christians in the same manner: throwing away our old way of living and moving ahead into our new life of dedication to God and faith Jesus Christ. Like the Israelites moving into the promise land, we can destroy the wickedness in our lives or we can settle down and live with it. To move on and pass the new life, we must drive out the sinful thoughts and practices to make room for the new. In all areas of life, we should obey God's word without question because we know He is just, even if we cannot fully understand His overall purposes. And never take side with the wicked Numbers 16:26 The Israelites were told not even to touch the belongings of the wicked rebels. In this case, doing so would have shown sympathy to their cause and agreement with their principles. Korah, Dathan, and Abiram were directly challenging Moses and God. Moses clearly stated what God intended to do to the rebels (16:28-30). He did this so that everyone would have to choose between following Korah or following Moses, God's chosen leader. When God asks us to make a fundamental choice between siding with wicked people ~~or~~ or siding with him, we should not hesitate but commit ourselves to be 100 percent on the Lord's side.

Last thoughts:

In the Christian life we battle against rulers and authorities (the powerful evil forces of fallen angels headed by Satan, who is a ~~treacherous~~ vicious fighter, see 1 Peter 5:8 ~~for~~ Lions attack sick, young, or straggling animals; they choose victims who are alone or not alert. Peter warns us to watch out for Satan when we are suffering or being persecuted. If you are feeling alone, weak, helpless and cut off from other believers, or if you are so focused on your troubles that you forget to watch for danger, those are the times when you are especially vulnerable to Satan's attack. During times of suffering, seek other Christians for support. Keep your eyes on Christ, and resist the devil. Then, says James, "he will flee from you" (James 4:7). To withstand their attacks as well, we must depend on God's strength and use every piece of his armor. Ephesians 6:10-18, Paul is not only giving this counsel to the church, the body of Christ, but to all individuals ~~within~~ ~~in the church~~ within the church. The whole body needs to be armed. As you do battle against "the powers of this dark world," fight in the strength of the church, whose power comes from the Holy Spirit. These who are not "flesh and blood" are demons over whom Satan has control. They are not mere fantasies - they are very real. We face a powerful army whose goal is to defeat Christ's church. When we believe in Christ, these ~~bogus~~ beings become our enemies, and they try every device to turn us away from him and back to sin. Although we are

Assured of victory, we must engage in the struggle until Christ returns, because Satan is constantly battling against all who are on the Lord's side. We need supernatural power to defeat Satan, and God has provided this by giving us His Holy Spirit within us and the armor surrounding us. If you feel discouraged, remember Jesus words to Peter: "On this rock I will build my church and the gates of Hades will not overcome it" (Matthew 16:18) God bless and I love you.
