

FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION CRY
"I CAN'T BREATHE"

Legitimate words spoken, or written, are sacrosanct in a democracy being a currency of truth. However there are those whom stride to oppress that currency.

Realizing to tell an individual they can not express an opinion would be an obvious denial of the U.S. Constitution 1st Amendment, Freedom of speech so other methods are employed.

An effective method that works well in oppressing prisoners is OBSCURATISM: opposition to the spread of knowledge: a policy of withholding, or blocking, knowledge to the general public. By refusing, or obstructing, prisoners ability to copy, or memorialize, their intellectual endeavors assures any currency of truth is impeded.

This is a stratagem of SATF/Corcoran prison enabled by CDCR. With a NO COPY policy, other than a court filing, obscurantism is alive and well. A grievance * 1st Amendment Rights were being violated was filed. The administrator assigned the grievance, embracing obscurantism, granted the grievance with certain conditions: 1) The library could continue to deny copies. 2) Copies can only be obtained through the prisoner's counselor once a week during the counselor's Open Line (a very busy day). This grant lasted one week with the counselors refusing copies proving the grant was a mere scratch on the monolith of obstruction.

In the effort to find breath for expression this less than generous grant will be appealed to prison head quarters in Sacramento. However history has proven prisoner appeals are analogous to a chicken trying to reason with a fox.
