

I have been writing poetry since about 1999, around 24 or 25 years. I won my first Famous Poet of the Year award and got published in 2001 then got published and awarded three other times; a Editor's Choice awards at another Poetry Society; published at PoetryFest and offered applications to be members at the Academy of American Poets (in New York, NY) and International Black Writers' Conference as an indigent prisoner who's conspired against by evil prison officials. "If you only knew what goes on in here, and to what magnitude!" They censored one of my posts. Why do you think I keep calling for advocacy to help get transferred from this prison. Where there's smoke, there's fire!!! THERE IS NO WAY I'M EVER STAYING AT THIS CAMP (PERIOD).

Ain't no need for people to read our stuff—it's like, they want to know us—but, don't want us to know them. So it does seem fair. Well, I wanted to respond—but, I did not want this

to seem self-centered. You can feel
free to respond any time you want. I
don't really want that much here
because I dislike it here. I will
post what I decide to post (never
all my poems or my best) because
I got to keep some for me — and
only when I feel like posting the
same as the way they choose when
they want to respond.
