

On 5/6/24 the following happened:

1.) I had my ISP (Individual Service Plan). As you can see, the mail restriction and Random Room Searches were not removed. Pages 5-19 are the ISP and pages 20-25 is my reply to the ISP. *Highlighted sections in ISP were commented on by me in my reply (pages 20-25)*

2.) The Treatment Team agreed to re-review the pictures of my family for me to have.

Then on 5/7/24 the following happened:

1.) I sent the 405 TX Team the following letter:
"I write today after you refused to remove "Random Room Searches" from my ISP. On 11/15/23 "Random Room Searches" were added to my ISP under the false pretense of me having a cellphone charger in my room (charger was a MP3 player charger if anything). Review of 11/7/23 "Resident search Form" shows no mention of a cellphone charger either. At my 5/6/23 ISP I provided documents ("Resident Search Form") showing no contraband due to previous ISP saying:
"To assist Mr. Peana with adhering to facility rules and expectations he will have random dorm searches to ensure that he only has approved items in his room. This method will be reviewed at his next ISP based on findings from room searches and associated documentation".

Now that the "Random Room Searches" are not being removed (even after following them and providing documentation) I am demanding that Policy 5.11, section "I" be followed completely, including weekly meetings to review "Random Room Searches". Said meeting is Not to be combined with "Mail Restriction" meeting.

You have been in violation of Policy 5.11, section "I" since at least 11/22/23."

*Policy 5.11, section "I" Says:

"At any time that a right will be restricted in any way, the

rationale for the restriction, a written physician's order with the time frame for the restriction, and an amended service plan must be entered into the clinical record. A weekly review of any restriction must be conducted by the treatment team. In no event may any right be restricted or limited as punishment or for the convenience of staff." *

2.) I started my individual sessions with Dr. Kiss and feel that I'll be able to work with her to move forward and work on all I have to work on,

Then on 5/9/24 another resident overdosed on some type of drug. He is the approx. 4th person in two months to have overdosed.

Then on 5/10/24 I met with a lawyer concerning my Article 78 to get mail restriction removed. One of the craziest things we came across is how two different staff in administration said two different things concerning this facility. They said in part:

(Jeff Nowicki, Chief of Mental Health Treatment Services, dated: October 12th, 2021)

"STARC Oakview is an OMH secure treatment facility, which is designed solely for the treatment and housing of Mental Hygiene Law (hereafter "MHL") Article 10 sex offender residents. STARC Oakview is maintained separate, apart and under different rules, from CNYPC which continues to be maintained as a psychiatric hospital,

(Justin Lopata, Chief of Mental Health Treatment Services, dated: April 19th, 2024)

"- The program previously identified as Central New York Psychiatric Center - Sex Offender Treatment Program ("CNYP-C-SOTP") remains in its current location but is now identified as STARC-Oakview,

- To ensure programmatic stability during transition and provide due consideration of new policies and procedures, STARC-Oakview will continue to follow the policies and

procedures that governed CNYPC-SOTP immediately prior to the April 22, 2021 date in which STARC became operational.

*It's pretty funny that not until I brought my Article 78 did STARC backtrack on what policies, procedures, etc. are valid. How is it that in October 2021 they were not valid but all of a sudden in April 2024 they all of a sudden are valid? STARC can not have it both ways. I will keep you updated on the progress on this all. *

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in the group. He appeared to blame staff for 'allowing' this to happen. He also appeared to struggle with receiving feedback that he did not agree with, as evidenced by his becoming silent in response. Additionally, Mr. Peana was noted at times to make threats to write Albany or facility administration when discontent with the group process or facilitators. He was noted to focus on identifying and managing external events and solutions as opposed to managing his internal processes and reactions to these events. After having written to Risk Management regarding concerns with his ability to meet his treatment goals in his Cognitions core group, Mr. Peana met with clinical supervisors. He was observed to advocate for himself appropriately and respectfully, ultimately deciding to continue working in the group on his goals.

During a later meeting with clinical supervisors and treatment team members, Mr. Peana was informed that he would be referred to Reflections core group to work on therapy-interfering behaviors (TIBs) that appear to have impacted his ability to benefit from treatment meaningfully. He was provided with an individualized assignment as well as a list of his identified strengths and expectations for return to Cognitions core group. After receiving a loss of privilege (LOP) for possessing electronic contraband (cell phone charger) in his room, Mr. Peana revoked his consent from treatment and withdrew from group. He acknowledged that PtP group was helpful for addressing his trauma symptoms but that he "had no choice" to withdraw due to discontentment with his treatment team's decisions. While meeting with his assigned primary therapist at the time (Mr. Cordero), Mr. Peana became dysregulated and demanded that his primary therapist not come to meet with him without his unit psychologist or rehabilitation counselor present. After several meetings with clinical team members and reiterating his goal to move to Building 41, Mr. Peana decided to sign consent back into treatment groups (Reflections group, Processing the Past). In acknowledging how his communication and interpersonal styles with others can impact his ability to move forward in treatment, he was referred to individual therapy services to work on these areas.

Mr. Peana experienced some stressors during this review period that are worth noting. One of his sisters as well as his great uncle passed away, and he was able to attend their funeral services virtually. He was also discontent with being placed on a separation with another resident for safety and security purposes. In other instances, Mr. Peana reported being frustrated with feeling judged by his treatment team members and clinicians for his past behaviors, particularly in relation to sexual deviance and self-regulation. He reported feeling as though his goals of transferring out of Reflections group and to Building 41 are being "held over my head" and that this can impact his willingness to work on these areas.

Mr. Peana accrued some behavioral notes during this review period, primarily from engaging in verbal altercations with other residents, at times making threats towards them. He also was noted to become verbally aggressive and threatening with staff at times. He also threw a staff's chair, activated the red dot alarm, and punched the wall/door. During a search, Mr. Peana was found to have a cell phone charger in his room, to which he responded that this was from 2021 and that it was "not my fault that staff didn't take it." He was subsequently placed back on random room searches. He was also placed back on mail restrictions after attempting to write a disapproved party (Charlie Detar, Between the Bars).

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Overall, Mr. Peana has vacillated in his treatment engagement during this review period, ultimately resulting in his referral to Reflections core group, a group designed to address therapy-interfering behaviors (TIBs). While he initially withdrew from treatment groups after accruing LOPs, he eventually returned to engage in Reflections (as well as Processing the Past) to work on improving his identified TIBs, particularly in the realm of giving and receiving feedback. In meetings with his treatment team members, he has been noted to improve in his ability to receive feedback, particularly in relation to his communication style and how it can be perceived by others. He agreed to wanting to approach and respond to situations and people differently, and he was subsequently referred to individual therapy services to begin addressing these areas. Therefore, it is recommended that Mr. Peana continue to engage in his scheduled treatment groups, in individual therapy, and with his treatment team members to continue to address areas related to his TIBs, specifically as they relate to his interpersonal communication and emotion regulation difficulties. He could benefit from continuing to explore internal processes that may make it more challenging for him to respond appropriately to external stressors while identifying and practicing alternative ways to problem-solve difficult situations.

Progress Narrative: During this review period, Mr. Peana explored some aspects of love and belongingness needs. For example, during weekly meetings to review his ISP mail restriction, Mr. Peana discussed his want for a sense of normalcy and connection with others outside of the facility. While he initially focused on the legal definition of what a "pen pal" is and whether he is allowed per policy to have them, he eventually was open to connecting his want for normalcy to his desire to have pen pals and develop a social circle for himself prior to future discharge. Of note, when asked about a profile on PrisonPenPals, categorized as a dating site, Mr. Peana denied knowing anything about this and reported that his supports in the community may create profiles for him without his knowledge. He reported being informed by his mother that the posting had expired; however, it is still present on the website. He also demonstrated some defensiveness in response to being asked about the phrasing in his online profile indicating that he was open to writing anyone of any age. He was encouraged to consider how this feedback may be significant for his treatment.

Following his request for pictures of young adult men, Mr. Peana was referred to meet with a clinician individually to discuss healthy vs. deviant sexual interests and behaviors. He verbalized disagreeance with this referral, expressing that he feels discriminated against by the treatment team based on his previous history of deviant behaviors. He did remain open to feedback during this meeting despite his disagreeance and was receptive to meeting with the clinician for their one meeting. During this meeting, Mr. Peana reported managing his arousals well and not requiring further intervention through arousal management group. In particular, he emphasized how having positive supports and outlets have impacted his ability to meet emotional needs related to love and affection. He reported ordering books about child sexual

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abuse to help him work through his own trauma history rather than to reinforce any sexually deviant urges.

Overall, Mr. Peana has demonstrated some openness in discussing his current intimacy needs. While his frustration and discontentment with feeling judged has at times led him to become defensive, he continued to meet with treatment team members and demonstrated some flexibility in his ability to consider feedback related to these areas that he may disagree with. He has also started to discuss his attempts to make connections with people in the community by relating these to his needs for intimacy/love and belongingness. Therefore, it is recommended that Mr. Peana continue to meet with his treatment team members, in addition to meeting with his individual therapist, to discuss and explore past and current relationships with others, including those that he is attempting to establish. As noted in Goal #1, he could benefit from improving his ability to receive feedback, particularly that of which he does not agree with, so that he can further explore how his intimacy needs may relate to other areas of his treatment.

Progress Narrative: During this review period, Mr. Peana was noted to be an active participant in therapeutic recreation offerings. While off the unit, he was observed to walk laps in the yard, utilize the weightroom and cardio room, and play pickleball. On the unit, he was observed to watch television, socialize with peers, and play the Xbox. He was appointed as the ward liaison and represented the community appropriately while in this role. However, he was removed as ward liaison after engaging in behaviors that led to LOPs. Additionally, Mr. Peana accrued some notes related to attempts to send out mail as legal mail when it was otherwise determined by treatment team members and administrative staff to not be legal mail.

During this review period, Mr. Peana participated in the vocational work program, working in commissary and janitorial. He was noted to follow protocol and instructions, ask questions, and utilize equipment properly. He was discontinued from the vocational work program after receiving an LOP for having been discovered to have contraband in his room.

The treatment team was in contact with Mr. Peana's family during this review period. For example, Mr. Peana's mother had sent several pages of photographs of adult male celebrities to him in the mail. She discussed these requests with team members but stated that she was not entirely sure why she was doing so. At his request, the treatment team called Mr. Peana's brother (Travis Kayton, father of nephew Dalton Kayton) to establish contact. Mr. Peana was also approved to have contact with his niece, Mackenzie Schwartzman.

Goal #1:

→ When it comes to the Cognitions group I may have not been consistently involved and the reasons why were written to my Treatment Providers. The letter said: (Dated 10/3/23)

"I feel that this group is not conducive to my treatment. Some of the reasons why I am saying this are:

a.) due to feeling ignored/not heard on the many incidents of targeting by Mr. Baynes and resident Smith. Every time I try to pro-socially confront either of them it is always turned around on me. If I have to take responsibility for things I say/do, why can't they? Resident Smith scares me, due to that and how he has verbally attacked me in the past I have been very hesitant to give him feedback or interact with him in group. With Mr. Baynes, I truly have nothing against him, my issue with him is how he makes comments/statements that are triggering and then when he's called out tries to turn it back on the person who called him out, my second issue is that he allows residents to attack other residents with little to no redirection until things go over board. Yes, some of this has stopped since Ms. Masgar has been in the group but that's only because she is in the group. With or without her in the group does not change the past issues that don't seem able to be confronted and corrected honestly.

b.) I program on a Cognitions level (if not higher) in most situations and feel I am currently by not losing my temper, being direct, trying not to instigate larger issues, knowing when not to push on issues, etc. I do feel that at times due to "a" above I have fallen back but that is due to not wanting to be triggered, attacked or made to feel that my feelings/concerns don't matter.

c.) Yes, a small part of the issue "for me" in group is that I am unable to do my assignments (tasks) until others are caught up to me by doing their Distortions assignments. Also, that my whole group that I have worked with for multiple 1x mail sessions has either went home or to Bldg. 41. These are my issues and I am working through them but they are small in the larger scheme of my core group issues.

I feel like I have lost all control over my Safety, autonomy and Treatment with all the above. I just want to feel heard and be able to program as I have for years without having to compete with all the above."

→ I do not threaten to write Albany or facility administration. I let those involved in violating my rights know that my next steps will be to write Albany and/or Facility Administration to get assistance with

the violation stop happening. It is within my rights to write either entity. There should be no difference between me saying something about writing someone and a staff member telling me their writing me up. If my statement is a threat then the staff members statement is a threat.

- I was provide a individual assignment on 11/3/23 to do and present in my Reflections group. To date (5/6/24) I still have not been able to present the assignment, On 5/3/24 I did send a copy of the completed assignment to my Treatment Team due to no groups will be happening until 5/13/24.

- The so called cell phone charger was a MP3 charger and after repeated requests for a picture of said charger none has been provided. Also, after review of the 11/7/23 "Resident Search Form" there is NO mention of a cell phone charger.

- I revoked my consent for treatment for a multitude of reasons. Some were: put in Reflections for speaking up for help, being given unwarranted LOP's, treatment fatigue, deaths in the family, job being taken, etc...

- Requested that Mr. Cordero not come meet with me by himself due to his actions/behaviors/statements a majority of the time are triggering. The request was made with no ill intent.

- When it comes to the separation with a peer it is unwarranted and a punishment to me. The peer assaulted me and broke my nose in 2015 prior to moving to Bldg. 41 then in approx. early 2024 when he was put back in Bldg. 39 he had a separation put on me. It has been almost 9 years since he assaulted me and I have no plans of doing anything to said peer. Said peer was also used as the reason I could not go to Bldg. 41, I should have been moved to Bldg. 41 instead of being punished with a separation.

- At no time did I respond that a supposed phone charger was from 2021 and that it was "not my fault that staff didn't take it". There is not even a cellphone charger listed on the

11/7/23 "Resident Search Form", Random Room Searches are unwarranted and abuse as a cellphone charger was not in my room.

-Charlie Detar was NOT put on the Negative Correspondence list until on or about 12/12/23. There was/is no basis for him to be on said list. Mail restriction is unwarranted as Mr. Detar was not a negative correspondent until and about 12/12/23 (after all letters were written/sent to him).

-Lastly, both the Mail Restriction and Random Room Searches are in violation of: Policy 5.11, section "I" as it has not and is not being followed at any time.

Objective #1.1:

- I am not able to do Cognitions Thinking Reports in Reflections. This has been told to me over and over. This objective can't be worked on until moved back to a Cognitions group.

Goal #2:

-Concerning Prison Pen Pals Ad, there is no rule against having a Ad and according to website personnel it has expired and is not accessible. Also, trying to build outside supports is pro-social behavior and should be encouraged not stifled. The website is not a dating site either. Even if the Ad or any other is online there should be no issue as it is a way for someone like me (imprisoned for almost 20 years) to build supportive and pro-social relationships/supports.

-Concerning meeting with clinical staff member to discuss healthy v. deviant sexual interest and behavior, I was not in disagreement with meeting. I was concerned about staff member who was going to do meeting due to past interactions/documentation. I met with staff member and was happy with her documentation and outcome of meeting.

- I didn't feel discriminated against by Treatment Team concerning the bringing up of history of deviant behaviors. I felt discriminated

against by Ms. Vuong due to a statement she made concerning behaviors that haven't happen for approx. 10-11 years, I no longer feel discriminated against.

-Concerning the book about child sexual abuse (Shattered by the Darkness, by Gregory Williams), I requested and was given permission by my Treatment Team to get the book, once it came it was disapproved which I was OK with due to really not needing it as I was able to utilize PTP (Processing the Past) to gain insight. The book was only requested due to not having been able to get put in a Trauma group for about 15 years and wanting to gain insight into how others dealt with the sexual abuse done to them.

GRI#4:

-Concerning notes pertaining to legal mail, on 3/4/24 I wrote TTL Cracchiolo about all legal mail envelopes I had been trying to send out and on 3/5/24 he said all envelopes were legal mail and could be sent out sealed. The notes referenced should be removed from my records as they are faulty and not an accurate description due to TTL Cracchiolo's 3/5/24 decision.

-Concerning LOP'S, I had approx. 4 during this review period. Three out of the four were unwarranted and if video/audio was reviewed the truth of each incident could be seen. LOP'S need to stop being given out on one sided notes. Both sides of an incident should be reviewed and considered before any LOP is issued. Even inmates in prison get a hearing to defend themselves when accused.

-Concerning my mother and pictures of adult male celebrities she sent me, there is no context to why she may have said that she was not entirely sure why she was doing so. That statement could mean anything and due to her not being asked what she meant no clarification can/was given. This whole incident shouldn't have even been mentioned in the ISP.
