Some people knows who I am. Others do not
know. Just to give you a little history about me.
I have been blogging on Between the Bars pin#
1092 for decades. My motto is to bring new conversation
to life, where society has buried them. Its very
clear in our society today, that the family structure
and humanity is being destroyed because of the
lack of wisdom.

If we had the wisdom and education of how to
break any barrel down in our pathway. Our
level of thinking would be further into a realm
that is so powerful, it will change lives. This is
the reason I ~~do~~ love meeting people right where
they are. Another valid reason for me is why
blogging became my passion and purpose "It's
because my story maybe your story, your story
maybe my story."

Especially in the atmosphere we live in today. As
we are heavily surrounded by systematic failures,
racism, sexism and a egoistic government slash
society. I had to learn quickly how to overcome
all the above as I was sentenced to life with the
possibility of parole for murder at the age of
22 in Georgia. I never would have thought
that I had to leave my little babies at the

age of 23 and 9 days old for someone else to raise them.

Now they are grown, I still sit here in shock after 27 years in a Georgia prison for a murder I didn't commit. The shock continues as I have 5 adorable grandchildren I cannot enjoy. Because I am stuck in a system that is rigged to hold these African American women. As I came to the realization, that is the way Georgia System is set up to fail African American women.

By giving the poor, a lawyer that the State knows is going to misrepresent the defendant. As they ~~easy~~ ease a conviction through the courts swiftly to send that person to prison. As the jury are rigged up with all whites' and one Black such as, in my criminal case. On the other hand, small counties like Decatur County - Bainbridge, GA don't allow the defendants to practice their post conviction remedies as they try hard to save money for ~~themselves~~ the county.

However, another outlook on this situation is that Georgia Parole Board System is also rigged up to keep offenders locked up so the State can continue to stack up their coins.

Let's talk about how this is happening in the STATE of Georgia - when a lifer comes up for parole. The

Judges' and district attorney(s) is given a option to say whether the offender can make parole. Most of them deny the offender one either - you have not done enough time or the nature of your crime, which will never change. What I am not understanding is this, you have already sentenced me. Now you get a round one, two, three and four etc. Come on society this is not right.

Another point to make is, at trials some people know their victim, because they get up in speak. On the other hand, in other cases some people don't have the slightest ^(clue) about a victim until they come up for parole. The comment is made to the family when inquiry about their loves ones being constantly being denied parole. The parole board reply, you have to talk to the victim's. Now the family is saying "what victim?"

All this secret gray area in the dark is keeping many African American women behind the walls in Georgia penal system. Because Georgia's allegedly victims is kept a secret sometimes compared to other states where the parole board panel and the victim's report to the prison for a parole hearing. With my whole heart I feel there is a ~~B~~ backlash when a defendant is African

American woman, coming from a minority background. Where they live is poverty and I lived in predominantly poor area like The Section 8 known as the projects.

For me, coming into the penal system, caused a lightbulb to come on quickly in my mind. This alone pushed me into learning and thinking of how I could over come this negative perspective that had swallowed me up as a result of systematic failure. Where only the white man is equipped to win.

As I come to my final thoughts, I have ~~had~~ to share this with you. I knew the parole board was going to let me down as I continue to see other lifers get their parole denied over and over. I studied this so when it was my turn to be denied such as 2011, 2017, 2021, 2022 now I am up 2024. I had already found my path by educating myself.

First I received my GED. Then I got involved in multiple vocational trades where I became certified in each. On the other hand I received many OJTs. But my biggest accomplishment has been receiving my Associate of ARTS, in Business

communication. August 14, 2024 I graduated with my Bachelor of Arts in Business

Communication. I triple minored with Sociology, Business Management, and Business Administration all through ^{my} Ashland University studies. But the real question is, is this enough for the District attorneys and judges in DeKalb County-Burnbridge, GA. Is this enough for the victims I didn't know about? Is this enough for the staff at Pulaski State Prison even though I don't get write ups. Is this enough for the Parole Board? Even though the most I had made up in my mind that I was going to break this systematic failure in my life.
