We should not be so afraid of the label hypocrite that we stand still in our Christian life, hiding our faith and making no attempts to grow. A person who tries to do right but often fails is not a hypocrite. Neither are those who fulfill their duty even when they don't feel like doing it. Often it is necessary and good to set aside our desires in order to do what needs to be done, it is not hypocrisy to be weak in faith. A hypocrite is a person who only puts on religious behavior in order to gain attention approval, acceptance or admiration from others.

Jesus reminds us that our speech and actions reveal our true underlying beliefs, attitudes, and motivation. The good impressions we try to make cannot last if we are being deceptive. What is in your heart will come out in your speech and behavior. Yes people can allow the devil to use them or we can allow him to use us as vessel. Galatian 2:20 I have been crucified and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God, for ~~it~~ if it righteousness could be gained through the law Christ died for nothing. How have our old selves been crucified with Christ? Legally, God looks at us as if we had died with Christ. Because our sins died with him, we are no longer condemned (Holy Bible Colossians 2:13-15). Relationally, we have become one with Christ, and his experiences are ours. Our Christian life began when, in unity with him, we died to our old life (see Romans 6:5-11). In our daily life, we must regularly crucify sinful desires that keep us from following Christ. This too is a kind of dying with him (Luke 9:23-25)

And yet the focus of Christianity is not dying, but living. Because we have been crucified with Christ, we have been raised with him (Romans 6:5). Legally we have been reconciled with God (2 Corinthians 5:19) and are free to grow into Christ likeness (Romans 8:29) and in our daily life, we have Christ's resurrection power as we continue to fight sin (Ephesians 5:19-20). We are no longer alone, for Christ lives in us - he is our power for living and our hope for the future (Colossians 1:27).

Believers today may still be in danger of acting as if there was no need for Christ to die. How? By replacing Jewish legalism with their own brand of Christian legalism, they are giving people extra laws to obey. By believing they can earn God's favor by what they do, they are not trusting completely in ~~Christ's work~~ Christ's work on the cross. By struggling to appropriate God's power to change them (sanctification), they are not resting in God's power to save them (Justification). If we could be saved by being good, then Christ did not have to die. But the cross is the only way to salvation.

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
