Point 1

Point 3

Each person that is adult needs to reevaluate their lives right now: ask yourself

- (1) Is what I am doing in my private life producing good fruits
- (2) why do I think the way I do and then justify it.

(3) What I am feeding my mind and body is it health for me - will any good come out of it

(4) How do I view the person next to me. Is it a good thought could it help them or am I justifying a wrong feeling.

(5) What can you do to make somebody else life better?

(6) Why does everything has to be involving strife and division that you say to another about that person you have a problem with. Is this way of life is healthy

(7) Why is that we have some people that are secretly jealous of someone. So they find the opportunity to block that individual from good by gossipping or setting a trap. Is God in this behavior?

Sometimes people come close to helping the person God has instructing them to. But then they don't because Satan draws them on the wrong path with gossip about the person they suppose to help. Instead of seeking God's wisdom and truth about that person. The biggest weapon of the devil is the accuser of the brethren. If this you get back on the right path. Job 37:21-24

Elihu concluded his speech with tremendous truth that faith in God is far more important

Point 3

God does not oppress people - man do and sometimes we make the wrong decision - There are different types of suffering - where you today in your life what are you going to do about your situation Pain; Persecutions; problems

The Sources of suffering

When suffering or problem or troubles happen, do they always come from Satan? In Job's Story, his series of tragedies did come from Satan, but this is not always the case. The chart above demonstrates the four main causes of suffering. Any one of these or a combination of them may create suffering. If knowing why we suffer will teach us to avoid the cause, then the causes are worth knowing. However, it is most important to know how to respond during suffering.

How suffering affects us

suffering is helpful when:
We turn to God for understanding, endurance, and deliverance

We ask important questions we might not take time to think about in our normal routine

We are prepared by it to identify with and comfort others who suffer

We are open to being helped by others who are obeying ~~and~~ God

We are ready to learn from a trustworthy God

We realize we can identify with what Christ suffered on the cross for us

We are sensitized to the amount of suffering in the world

Suffering is harmful when:

We become hardened and reject God

We refuse to ask any questions and miss any lessons that might be good for us

We allow it to make us self-centered and selfish

we withdraw from the help others can give
we reject the fact that God can bring good
out of calamity
we accuse God of being unjust and
perhaps lead others to reject him
we ~~refuse~~ refuse to be open to any
changes in our lives

Four views of suffering

Satan's view - People believe in
God only when they are prospering and
not suffering. This is wrong

The view of Job's Three friends - Suffering
is God's judgment for sin. This is not
always true.

Elihu's view - Suffering is God's way to
teach, discipline and refine. This is true,
but an incomplete explanation

God's view - suffering causes us to trust
God for what he is not, what he does

Here are
six questions
to ask ourselves
when we suffer,
and what to do
if the answer is
yes

Questions!

Am I being punished by God for sin?

Our response: Confess known sin

Is Satan attacking me as I try to
survive as a Christian?

Our response: Call on God for
strength

Am I being prepared for a special
service, learning and to be compassionate
to those who suffer? Our response
Resist self-pity. ASK God to open up
doors of opportunity and help you
discover others who suffer as you do

Questions

Am I specifically selected for testing, like Job?

Our response: Accept help from the body of believers. Trust God to work his purpose through you.

Is my suffering a result of natural consequences for which I am not directly responsible?

Our response: Recognize that in a sinful world, both good and evil people will suffer. But the good person has a promise from God that his or her suffering will one day come to an end.

Is my suffering due to some unknown reason?

Our response: Don't draw inward from the pain. Proclaim your faith in God, know that he cares and wait patiently for his aid.
